We have had another great summer of activities in Isanti . Our soccer fields and BMX track have hosted State and National events once again, which help to showcase our great community. Our Redbirds Baseball Team has been doing great once again this summer. Playing hard and providing free entertainment to the public. Vision Wake Park has been humming along and made a \$1,400 payment to the City out of its profits from last year. As long as the facility continues to operate the City will be receiving 5% of its gross revenues per their agreement with the City. Our parks and trails are being heavily used, especially Legacy Park located in the northwest quadrant of the City. The City is interested in several other parcels of land, similar to Legacy Park. These parcels are in tax forfeiture and may go back to the DNR or to the City of Isanti to develop other nature areas on the south side of our community.

We have brought back the Farmers Market and Street Dances to Downtown Isanti. I want to thank the Economic Development Authority and City Council for adopting my plan to market Isanti. The Farmers Market grows stronger every week and I look forward to a vibrant market for years to come. The Street Dances have been a huge success with roughly a thousand people at our last dance. Highlighting downtown keeps Isanti strong and tied to the roots of our Community. We have seen more inquiries into the use of downtown properties. The viability of businesses in this area can be further enhanced with more events and foot traffic. We are planning 3 Street Dances next year and for the Farmers Market to start earlier next year with even more vendors.

The Railroad Avenue SE/South Passage SÉ road and trail project should be completed soon and the completion of the sidewalk on the south side of Heritage Boulevard NE will be finished this fall. These projects provide safer routes and easier travel through some of Isanti's busiest areas.

I want to thank Duff Consulting, Startac Construction and My Geeky Guy for sponsoring this year's Mayor's Great Yard Awards. I want to continue to highlight the positives in Isanti and with the help of these great companies; we are able to do so without any taxpayer funds.

As I had mentioned in the summer edition of the Isantian, we are faced with new storm water regulations amounting to an annual estimated cost of \$250,000. These State mandates have to be complied with and have led to the creation of a storm water utility to pay for this cost. The estimates we have at this point are \$6.50 a month on average for a residential lot. We are looking at a dedicated fee to help pay this new state mandate, as it will be fairly distributed to every property owner including developers. Another benefit of a fee versus property tax increase is that the fee can only be used for the mandated storm water cost and not spent on anything else. A property tax increase could result in funds being spent on other items. This is not what any Council member wants to do, but we must obey mandates from the State.

We had another great showing at the Mayor's Employer Celebration Luncheon with over 140 employers in attendance. I started this after becoming Mayor to thank all of our Community employers for investing in Isanti. We also have representatives of State Government, regional economic development entities and local officials present for the event. This allows our employers to discuss issues, help identify funding sources, and discuss ideas they may have to improve our business climate with all levels of government. I want to thank Senator Nienow, Representative Johnson, Commissioner Warring, the Initiative Foundation, ECRDC, Employers and all those who came to join us for the event.

I am happy to announce we have completed our Residential Handbook. This will include information for new and existing residents. Everything from approved garbage haulers to contact information for elected officials has been included. This will be available electronically at www.cityofisanti.us and hard copies will be at City Hall and the Isanti Area Chamber of Commerce Office.



Yard Waste in City Streets

The City has experienced some issues with grass clippings, leaves and other types of yard waste being deposited from residential lots into City streets and storm drains. These items obstruct the flow of rain water that runs through the public street drains and gutters, causing flooding on residential lots that surround these areas. Isanti Code section 216-2 identifies the placement of trash, grass, and other yard waste or other materials as a public nuisance affecting health. Please avoid using the public street for the disposal of these items. Failure to do so may result in a citation for violation of Isanti City Code.

Unfortunately, there was a house fire in the City of Isanti on August 6th. Fortunately, no one was hurt but that fact leads to further discussion. As the Building Official for the City of Isanti, one of my responsibilities is to evaluate a structure after it has experienced fire damage to see if the structure is safe enough to be used as it was prior to the fire. Evaluation of the structure showed that the 30 minute fire wall and fire door required by the Building Code were installed properly and worked as designed. This is why these systems are in place and should be maintained by the homeowner. The wall and door created a temporary fire block which gave valuable time for anyone inside the premises to evacuate and temporarily kept the fire from spreading into the home. The Isanti Fire District was quick to respond and did another great job of extinguishing the fire which minimized the damage to the structure and personal property. Thanks again to the Isanti Fire District and the Isanti Police Department who do an outstanding job protecting residents and property within the City of Isanti.

New residential construction

There are seven new home starts to date in 2013 and that number could very well increase before the end of the year. That compares to two at this time in 2012, 1 in 2011, 10 in 2010, 0 in 2009 and 3 in 2008.

New commercial construction

One new commercial building has been built in 2013 and that is the Therapy Associates Building located at 904 6th Avenue Court NE. Construction is nearing completion and the final inspections have been scheduled.

Vacant Homes

As of June 5th, we had 28 vacant foreclosed homes compared to 55 in June of 2012.

Rental licensing

The City of Isanti does have a Rental License Ordinance that requires all residential rental properties to be licensed. Currently there are 549 units, with 37 units added in 2013. Please contact the Building Department with any questions.

Fall Cleaning Tips From Your Post Master

- If your mailbox is mounted on a pole or post, check its stability and make sure it is properly anchored.
- Your mailbox identifies your address, not only for the letter carrier but for the police, the fire department, emergency workers and other service providers. Make sure your complete address including your directional (NE, NW, SW, SE) appears on both sides of the mailbox, so people who need to find you can do so, and so can your mail.
- Please ensure that all obstructions such as vehicles and garbage containers are not in the path or in the way for the letter carrier to properly deliver your mail.
- During the winter months ensure that the approach area for your mail box or receptacle is clear of snow and ice.
- Check the door and its hinges. Make sure it closes properly to keep your mail in and the wind, rain and snow out.
- Do you see any sharp edges or nails sticking out? Protect your own hands as well as those of your letter carrier, by filing them off. Also sand and repaint or replace your mailbox if it's rusty you don't want to have to get a tetanus shot, and neither does your letter carrier.

Welcoming New Businesses to Isanti

City Staff continues to work with existing businesses looking to expand and is working to recruit more from outside the City. Utilization of city development tools such as the City Revolving Loan Fund, Tax Abatement and Tax Increment Financing helps create tax base and employment opportunities for Isanti residents. City of Isanti SAC and WAC Deferral Development Incentive Program for 2013

In December 2012, the City Council of the City of Isanti adopted a new SAC and WAC deferral program. This program is designed to help increase both commercial/industrial and residential development within the City limits of Isanti. Generally speaking, the program allows these specific development costs to be financed "interest free" for a period of 120 days. Seven new single family housing permits have been pulled in 2013 and all of these projects have utilized the new deferral program. The term of this incentive program has not been guaranteed to exist after 2013 so be sure to take advantage of it now. ARE YOU CLEANING-UP AFTER YOUR PET?



It is your responsibility as a pet owner to clean-up after your pet. When taking your pet for a walk, please show courtesy to other public and private property owners by removing the excrement deposited by your pet. City Code 87-5.1 requires pet owners to immediately collect and remove dog feces deposited by their animal on public or private property. A container, equipment, or other device is required for transport of the fecal material to an appropriate disposal receptacle located on the property of the pet owner. Please help us in keeping our neighborhoods and public spaces clean and sanitary.

2014 Budget

The Isanti City Council plans to approve the 2014 preliminary budget and tax levy at the September 3, 2013 City Council meeting. Property owners will receive notices from the County in mid November providing information on their proposed property taxes for payable year 2014. You will also be able to find this information on the City's website. The final 2014 budget and tax levy will be considered for approval by the Isanti City Council on December 3, 2013.

Burning Permits

City code prohibits burning by MN State Statute 88.1 and 88.22 and the MN Uniform Fire Code. Recreational fires are permitted, if applied as follows: a recreational fire is a fire set for pleasure, cooking, warming, ceremonial purposes or other similar purposes, which is not more than three (3) feet in diameter by two (2) feet high. Recreational fires must be at least twenty-five (25) feet from all building or combustible materials. A combustible material includes wood, paper, and plastics.

Any fire larger than the above stated dimensions is considered "open burning" and is regulated by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Burning grass, leaves, brush, and lumber requires a permit. Seasonal Tips from Isanti's Safety Committee

- 1. Yard work: Make sure you are using a rake that is comfortable for your height and strength; additionally, never throw leaves over your shoulder or to the side, the twisting motion required to do so places undue stress on your back.
- 2. Back to school: Overloaded backpacks continue to cause injuries, including bruises, sprains and strains to the back, and shoulder fractures. Lighten the load and use both straps!
- 3. Halloween: Give your children flashlights with fresh batteries to help them see and for others to see them.
- 4. Halloween: Do not cross yards and lawns where unseen objects or the uneven terrain can present tripping hazards and never walk near lit candles or luminaries.
- 5. Halloween: Children should only wear well-fitting costumes and shoes to avoid trips and falls. Did you know that falls are the leading cause of injury on Halloween?? Have a safe fall season!

Recreational Vehicle Parking Ordinance

Chapter 227, Article III of the Isanti City Code; establishes regulations for the parking and storage of recreational, commercial, and other equipment within residential areas of the City. The Ordinance also establishes location, surface type, size limitations, and screening requirements as well. A copy of the ordinance can be found on the city's website at www.cityofisanti.us. Snow Removal

It is the homeowner's responsibility to clear sidewalks abutting or serving their property that are not on a designated school route as part of City Code §284-14. No person shall permit an accumulation of snow or ice to build up or remain on any public sidewalk abutting or otherwise serving lots or parcels located in the City of Isanti.

If snow or ice is not removed, the City will hire a company to remove snow and ice and bill back to the owner or renter the fee per incident for said removal; an additional \$25 non-compliance fee will also be billed to the owner or resident per incident.

This summer the Isanti Police Department has responded to three separate pedestrian/train accidents. Freight trains do not travel on a predictable schedule. Always expect a train at every rail intersection. A train may extend three feet or more outside the steel rail, which makes the safety zone for pedestrians well beyond the rails themselves. Never step on the rails when crossing the tracks. They are slippery, especially when wet. Step clear of any switch or apparatus on the tracks. Railroad switches and sidings are controlled from a centralized system many miles away; switches can move quickly without warning and could trap or injure hands and feet.

Train tracks are private property, no matter which railroad owns them. Trains have the right of way 100% of the time — over ambulances, fire engines, cars, the police and pedestrians. Never walk down a train track; it's illegal and it's dangerous. By the time a locomotive engineer can see a trespasser or a vehicle on the tracks, it is too late. The train cannot stop quickly enough to avoid a collision.

A typical locomotive weighs approximately 400,000 pounds or 200 tons. When 100 railcars are added to the locomotive, the train can weigh approximately 6,000 tons. The weight ratio of an automobile to a train is proportional to a soda can and an automobile.

Trains cannot stop quickly. It is a simple law of physics: the huge weight and size of the train and the speed of the train dictate how quickly it can stop under ideal conditions. A 100-car freight train traveling at 55 miles per hour will need more than a mile to stop — that's approximately 18 football fields — once the train is set into emergency braking.

There are roughly 200,000 miles of railroad tracks in the United States. Modern trains are quieter than ever, with no telltale "clackty-clack." Also, an approaching train will always be closer and moving faster than you think. Cross tracks ONLY at designated pedestrian or roadway crossings. Observe and obey all warning signs and signals.

2013 Railroad Avenue & Walk Improvements

The 2013 Railroad Avenue & Walk Improvements project is well underway.

Railroad Avenue SE has been closed to thru traffic for more than a month now and the City would like to thank motorists for avoiding the project area. The storm sewer system has been installed and the street has been cut to the proposed subgrade elevation. In the coming month you will see the Railroad Avenue roadway get shaped into a bituminous paved road with concrete curb and gutter and a 10-foot wide bituminous path paved along the west side.

South Passage SE has also been under construction for the past month. The storm sewer on this street has also been completed and fill has been placed for the bituminous path planned along the north side of the roadway. In the coming month the fill will be graded and prepped for a concrete curb and gutter to be installed along South Passage SE and a 10-foot bituminous path will be paved behind the back of the curb.

A 5-foot wide concrete walk is proposed along Heritage Boulevard NE from Elim Lane NE to Credit Union Drive NE. Work on this project is expected to begin the week of August 26th, 2013 and be completed by mid-September. Traffic disturbance will be minimized as much as possible, but access to the Isanti Retail Center will be reduced to one access at a time while concrete is poured. Please watch for these closures and be mindful that the remaining entrance will need to handle two way traffic

A bituminous overlay is proposed on Penny Lane SE from Main Street SE to Broadway Street SE to extend the life of the existing roadway pavement. This work is planned to coincide with the bituminous paving on Railroad Avenue SE.

The overall project is expected to be complete by mid to late September.



Minnesota weather...if you don't like it...wait fifteen minutes and it will change. Soon the snow will be here again and last year we had too many complaints of snowmobile misuse. Snowmobiles are not allowed to drive on another's property without permission. Please keep your snowmobile on the trail or right of way. All property in Isanti is owned by someone. Snowmobiles may not be driven in the City parks or on school property unless it is part of a marked state or local trail system. Lastly, watch the Winter Isantian for dates of the youth snowmobile safety certificate course held at the police department.

Water Shutoffs

Due to a change in seasons and on-coming cold weather if your home is going to be vacant for any reason; please call City Hall to have the water shut off to prevent freezing pipes and other water dam-

City Code section 325-9 E. authorizes the City to disconnect services due to electric and/or gas utility services being shut off between October 15 and April 15 and the City determines in good faith that the premises has been vacated by the former account holder and no transfer of the account has been made.

Winter Parking Restrictions

Parking of vehicles is not allowed on city streets between the hours of 1:00 am and 8:00 am from November 1st through March 31st of every year. Parking is permitted on streets between the hours of 6:00 am and 8:00 am provided that snow removal has been completed or there is no snow. Parking is not permitted in the City's downtown municipal parking lot (located south of Main Street W and west of the BNSF railroad tracks) between the hours of 1:00 am and 5:00 am. Your cooperation will help make the snow removal process more efficient and effective.



Isanti Fire District

The Isanti Fire District had an active year in many different aspects. Some interesting numbers I'll share briefly are this year's run counts for the City of Isanti, year to date. Since January 2013, we have responded to 180 calls in the City of Isanti. These calls have ranged from medical emergencies to car accidents to structure fires. Our busiest day of the week is tied so far at 32 calls each, for Mondays and Fridays. Time of day is also tracked and tied year-to-date with 40 calls each, occurring between 8:00 am and noon and 4:00pm-8:00pm. What significance does this data have besides being interesting? The officers and Fire Board staff are continually reviewing statistics like this to tailor the structure of the fire department to meet its demand. One cannot predict when an emergency is going to occur, but using data like this we can focus on target areas and strive to make our department as efficient as possible while providing the service you as a citizen of our beautiful city expect. Some of you may have seen our newest piece of equipment, a 2012 Chevrolet Impala. This car is a take-home car for our firefighters who are fulfilling a duty shift. These duty shifts ensure quick response from one of our firefighters during those target times, providing services until an ambulance is able to respond or more firemen/women, if needed.

Isanti Fire will be adding to the roster January 1st at all 3 stations. If you or anyone you know is interested in applying to be a paid-on-call firefighter, please visit www.isantifiredistrict.org or call (763) 444-8019 to start the application process. Applicants must live within a 6 minute drive (following speed limit regulations) of one of our stations and be able to pass physical, mental and background check screenings.

As the winter season approaches, get yourself prepared by making sure your heating systems are up to the task of providing clean, safe heat for the months to come. Isanti Fire recently received a donation from Junction Bowl in the City of Isanti of a 4 gas meter. If you have a suspicion of carbon monoxide being present in your home, call the sheriff's office at (763) 689-2141 or 911 if it's an emergency. The new gas meter will detect the smallest amounts of carbon monoxide, a deadly gas that our noses can't detect.

Grass fire season is already upon us as we've had a few running grass fires in the last week in our rural coverage areas. Even though the grass/weeds are green, there is underlying dried grasses there that are capable of maintaining a fire if left unattended. A reminder that all campfires in the city must be contained in an approved ring, must be 3' in diameter or smaller, be attended at all times, and only be burning natural vegetation. Remember that just because the flame is out, doesn't mean that a gust of wind won't grab a hot coal and blow it onto some dry surrounding grass, which could easily ignite and take off

Technical Rescue is a hot topic at Isanti Fire as some of the members have recently completed a 9 month course on Technical Rope Rescue. Larger, full time departments often build teams of this nature to specialize and prepare for the unknown situations some people are capable of getting themselves into. Isanti Fire is the first fire department, outside of those mentioned, in the State of Minnesota to obtain this certification with the Minnesota Fire Service Certification Board. Our baseline firefighter certification includes some rope rescue techniques, but the crew wanted more. Mari Bostrom at Isanti County Emergency Management was able to secure some grant funding to make it possible, and our crew ran with it

Watch for us practicing our new technical rescue techniques around the area in months/years to come, and rest assured your fire department is highly trained, and efficient, in all aspects.

Train Safety Tips 101: Pedestrian Safety Around Tracks and Trains

Operation Lifesaver: Stay Off, Stay Away, Stay Alive

Walking or playing on railroad tracks or the right-of-way on either side of the tracks is trespassing. It is illegal and can be deadly.

Find A Safer Place

Railroad tracks, trestles, yards, and equipment are private property. Never walk, jog, fish or hunt from railroad tracks. If you are found on this property you can be arrested or fined.

Crossbuck Sign

This sign tells you trains run at this location. Cross tracks at the crossbuck sign only, not anywhere along the tracks.

Use Only Designated Crossings

The only legal and safe place to cross railroad tracks is at a designated public crossing with a crossbuck, flashing red lights or a gate. Crossing at any other location is illegal.

If You See a Train Coming, WAIT!

If you see flashing lights or a lowering gate, it means a train is approaching. Do not proceed until the gates go completely up and the lights go off. It is illegal to go around lowered gates.
