2017 City Budget The Isanti City Council

The Isanti City Council plans to approve the 2017 preliminary budget and tax levy at the September 6, 2016 City Council meeting. Property owners will receive notices from the County in mid November providing information on their proposed property taxes for payable year 2017. You will also be able to find this information on the City's website. The final 2017 budget and tax levy will be considered for approval by the Isanti City Council on December 6, 2016.

Water Shutoffs

Due to the upcoming change in seasons, and oncoming cold weather, if your home is going to be vacant for any reason; please call City Hall to have the water shut off to prevent freezing pipes and other water damage.

City Code section 325-9 (E) authorizes the City to disconnect services due to electric and/or gas utility services being shut off between October 15 and April 15; if the City determines in good faith that the premises has been vacated by the former account holder and no transfer of the account has been made.

Summer Greetings Everyone. I hope the summer has been enjoyable for all Isantians.

Some kids are back in school and the traditional school kids will be back shortly as well. I urge everyone to drive with caution around school buses, school crossings and when children are present.

National Night Out was held on August 2nd, 2016 at the Isanti Community Center. We had about 100 people present at the community center and we had two well attended neighborhood events. There were some new faces and families in attendance...it was great to see everyone! I want to thank the businesses that donate items for this event.

I want to introduce Officer Brian Saba to the community. He is a recent hire due to an officer resigning and going elsewhere. He comes to us from White Earth Tribal Police Department and has performed well within the community. He will be working mostly overnights for us. When you see him, welcome him to our community.

We have had a quiet summer in regards to thefts from automobiles due to the officers' diligence last year and this spring in locating and arresting the individuals involved. However, please do not leave your vehicles unlocked... this invites crimes of opportunity. Do not leave items, especially electronic items, visible in your car; even visible power cords left in the vehicle can be a cause for a break-in to your vehicle. Always locking your cars when parked is the best deterrent for a crime of opportunity. Your complaint can be made anonymously.

I would like to explain the non-emergency calling for the Police Department. Our office is physically open by 7:00 a.m. and closes some days at 3:30 p.m., but most days at 4:00 p.m. This is due to staffing of the front desk. We do have a drop box at the front door if you wish to drop items off after business hours. The front Desk is staffed fulltime by Administrative Assistant Penny Anderson and part-time by Linda Goldben. Our non-emergency office number is (763) 444-4761. If no one answers after hours you can leave a message and we will respond back upon receiving that message. If it is not an emergency; however, you want to speak with an officer right away, then call our dispatch center at (763) 689-2141 and ask for the duty officer to call you.

I want to reassure everyone, just because the front office is closed, there is an officer on duty to respond 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year. The Police Department always has someone on duty to assist our citizens and guests to our community.

These part-time officers only work to cover off time for the full time staff and to help the department with special events with in the city. Quite often these part-time officers transition into fulltime staff upon openings and city council approval.

An important project is our nightly business checks. Officers will check local businesses randomly each night to make sure they are secure. If they are found unsecure we will check the building first to make sure a crime had not been committed inside such as theft, burglary or criminal damage to property. If the building can be secured, we will secure the building and notify the key holders. If we find anything out of the ordinary we will contact the business owner about the situation. If you are a business owner and would like to update your emergency contact with us, please call and speak to the front office staff or email me.

- Grant Writing

Seasonal Tips from Isanti's Safety Committee

Test and Replace Batteries —

Check or replace carbon monoxide batteries twice a year when you change the time on your clocks each Spring and Fall. Replace smoke alarm alkaline batteries at least once a year and test alarms every month to ensure they work properly. Check and replace any home fire extinguishers that have expired.

Distracted Driving –

Many distractions exist while driving, but cell phones are a top distraction. Almost everyone has seen a driver distracted by a cell phone, but when you are the one distracted, you often don't realize that driver is you. As a general rule, if you cannot devote your full attention to driving because of some other activity, it's a distraction. Take care of it before or after your trip, not while behind the wheel.

Have A Safe & Healthy Halloween -

Ensure safety on the street; mark treat bags and costumes with reflective tape, and have children carry a flashlight so drivers can see them. Plan healthy treats instead of candy. Offer safe nonfood treats or healthy snacks. Make Halloween festivities fun, safe and healthy.

Burning Permits

City code prohibits burning by MN State Statute 88.1 and 88.22 and the MN Uniform Fire Code. Recreational fires are permitted, if applied as follows: a recreational fire is a fire set for pleasure, cooking, warming, ceremonial purposes or other similar purposes, which is not more than three (3) feet in diameter by two (2) feet high. Recreational fires must be at least twentyfive (25) feet from all building or combustible materials. A combustible material includes wood, paper, and plastics.

Any fire larger than the above stated dimensions is considered "open burning" and is regulated by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Burning grass, leaves, brush, and lumber requires a permit. For additional information regarding burning permits contact Urban's Hardware Hank at 763-444-5565 or the Isanti Fire District at 763-444-8019.

Compost Site The compost site (on Isanti

Parkway at the Public Works garage) will be accepting leaves and grass clippings only through November 20. The site is located at 100 Isanti Parkway West (just west of the railroad tracks) and is open Sunday 12:00-5:00 and Tuesday and Thursday 1:00-7:00. Isanti Continues to Grow

The City of Isanti is growing responsibly in all multiple market sectors. The housing market continues to remain strong with 51 new single housing permits pulled in 2016 which has already eclipsed the 41 for all of last year. In addition, the City has received a new residential plat for 11 single-family lots which is slated for consideration at the September Planning Commission Meeting. This is the first new significant residential plat since 2006. Based on projections from the State

Demographer and City Staff research our City population is estimated to be at 5,629 which is a high watermark for our community. Industrial businesses are adding employees and expanding which also bodes well for our local economy. The City still has many Minnesota Shovel Ready Certified lots (1.2 to 15.49 acres) available in its industrial park and is able to provide incentives to existing or new businesses that are committed to the construction of new facilities and the creation of jobs. The retail and health sectors are also thriving with the addition of the new Coborn's Marketplace, Family Dollar and the new 17,000 square foot Allina Health Clinic (Spring 2017 opening) coming to town and reduced vacancies in our commercial buildings. For 2016, the City of Isanti has seen 18 businesses locate to Isanti, or expand in Isanti, ranging in size from 1 to 130 employees. In total 170 Isanti businesses employ approximately 1,752 people. The City Development Team is also working on increasing housing options to accommodate demand for all ages and lifestyles. There are other projects in the pipeline in all sectors that very well could break ground in 2017. It is an exciting time for Isanti.

No City incentives were provided to bring this cornerstone project to the City - only hard work and collaboration between Coborn's management, Rice Construction and the City Development Team. This Coborn's store is a new prototype, or "next generation" store which highlights the "Fresh" concept providing a unique shopping experience for its customers. To date, Coborn's Marketplace has hired 130 employees at the Isanti location, brought back a much needed pharmacy to the community that will be operated by David Johnson and has created new tax base that will provide an economic boost to the community now and into the future. Welcome to Isanti.

The City of Isanti officially recognizes Minnesota Manufacturing Week in October and our manufacturing businesses. Our community is thankful that these wonderful companies have decided to operate their business in the

Isanti receives Step 3 in the MN GreenStep Cities program!

There are 107 cities and 2 Tribal Nations currently participating in the Minnesota GreenStep Cities program. Isanti is among 7 other cities to reach Step 3 this year, and the only city to complete 3 steps in one year! Isanti's accomplishments can be viewed in detail at www.MnGreenSteps.org.

Step 2 and Step 3 recognition levels reflect completed city actions, generally described in words. Beginning in 2016 the GreenStep program challenges cities to measure and report – with numbers – the aggregate, quantitative results of taking multiple actions. Called city performance metrics (or sustainability indicators), these Step 4 measures attempt to present to community members the 'state of sustainability' achieved by a city.

This city is now actively pursuing Step 4, which consists of collecting, monitoring and reviewing the metrics of important processes within the city that relate back to its sustainability. The primary purpose and benefit of Step 4 is for cities to get used to annually gathering data against which a city can compare itself over time, providing for a more efficient and effective city.

Building Department

It's almost fall once again Isantians!

Unless you've been stuck under a rock, I'm sure you've noticed new residential and commercial buildings popping up this year. And there is more to come! It has been a very busy first year for me as the new Building Official. Because of the unexpected volume I have yet to implement some of the new updates I'd been hoping to by now. But there are permit applications that can now be submitted online, and a lot of useful information on permitted work requirements that can be found on the City's website.

As always my main focus is on the safety of all people within the City's built environments. The building department is in place to help the citizens of Isanti build, alter, repair, and add on to structures and property in a safe and consistent manner where it concerns safety, health, public welfare, longevity, and community enhancement. Please remember; I'm here to help you with your permitted project questions, more so than I am just to inspect them. Always feel free to call the building department at any time with questions regarding building, permits, inspections, etc.

There was one residential fire that had occurred this year that caused quite a bit of smoke and water damage. Luckily it was contained to parts of the garage and garage exterior, and no one was injured. Please take this as a reminder to test your smoke detectors and re-visit your emergency escape routes and plans with your family. Also, cooler fall evenings mean more bonfires- so I'd like to remind all of you about the State Fire Marshall's requirements for fire pits. The fire ring may be no more than 3' in diameter, the flames can be no higher than 3', and any combustible structure must be at least 25' away.

Winter Parking Restrictions

Parking of vehicles is not allowed on city streets between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. from November 1st through March 31st of every year. Parking is permitted on streets between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. provided that snow removal has been completed or there is no snow. Parking is not permitted in the City's downtown municipal parking lot (located south of Main Street W and west of the BNSF railroad tracks) between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Your cooperation will help make the snow removal process more efficient and effective.

Yard Waste in City Streets

The City has experienced some issues with grass clipping, leaves, and other types of yard waste being deposited from residential lots into City streets and storm drains. These items obstruct the flow of rain water that runs through the public street drains and gutters, causing flooding on residential lots that surround these areas. Isanti City Code section 216-2 identifies the placement of trash, grass, other yard waste or other materials as a public nuisance affecting health. Please avoid using the public street for the disposal of these items. Failure to do so may result in a citation for violation of Isanti City Code.

Fire Department



"Don't Wait, Check the Date" is the message the National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA) is promoting this year as we near October's Fire Prevention Week. This message serves as a reminder for everyone to check their smoke detectors manufactured on date. Isanti firefighters respond to several calls per year for smoke alarms that are alarming simply because they are out dated. Many people don't realize that after approximately 10 years

the alarm is ready for retirement. As the parts inside the detector lose their sensitivity to smoke and heat, they will "talk" to the alarm and tell them they aren't sure of the room's atmosphere. Due to this uncertainty, the alarm is designed to go off, even though there is no confirmed threat. For most families, this is likely to happen at a very inconvenient time!

Also during this time of year, please remember to check your heating appliances, including their chimneys and filters if they have them. Now is an ideal time to take a home heating unit out of service to make sure it is ready for a long, warm and safe heating season.

October is the start of our annual firefighter hiring process. If you or someone you know is interested in becoming a paid on call firefighter, check out www.isantifiredistrict.org for some information and an application!
