4th Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. This edition of the Isantian looks a little bit different due to my goal of adding greater transparency to our City Government. We have taken each City department and explained how your taxpayer dollars are being used to fund City services. Many duties are self-evident such as police stopping speeders or public works plowing streets. Many other state mandated duties and expenses are not such as our City Planner making sure we do not allow spot zoning which could cost the City significantly in legal and future development cost. Our HR person has to make sure we comply with comparable worth and a litany of other State mandates. Our Police Department is not only busy catching the bad guys but also helps with such things as infant car seat inspections and lockout assistance. I believe it is important each Citizen and Taxpayer has a complete view of what their City government is doing and how their money is being spent.

Another topic we need to discuss is the ever changing landscape of our City. Isanti has gone from 74% of our tax base being owner occupied homes in 2010, to 65% in 2011. This is a significant shift and shows the trend of our housing stock being converted into rental properties. This is a foreseen outcome of the foreclosure crisis our Nation has been plagued with. When I was elected Mayor in 2006 I made a rental and maintenance ordinance a high priority so Isanti would be well positioned to deal with the coming changes. Isanti may very well see 50% of our housing stock converted into rental properties. This will lead to many challenges, which we have seen in other communities where rental property owners try to force communities to lower their standards and increase their profits at the City's cost. Future Mayors and Councils must not allow an eroding of community standards to profit a few at the expense of families that invested so much in making Isanti a wonderful place to live.

On this same topic there is a trend occurring centering around the theme of 'times are tough, Isanti should take anything they can get'. This would be disastrous to the long term health and vitality of our community. Residential proposals allowing new tiny cheap homes in established neighborhoods would not only hurt existing property values but would never generate enough future property taxes to help pay for City services thus increasing the burden on existing homeowners. Only the developer would make money on this type of deal. We see it on the commercial property side as well. Proposals to build low value additions along TH 65 that would never provide decent paying jobs, tax base or service our community needs. Times are hard and will continue to be for years to come but we must not allow short term fear to drive long term policy. The approval of 'any type of growth proposal' is what got Isanti in such a mess to begin with and has left us paying millions in debt that we have inherited. Long term city planning is like planting trees - we do it for the generations to come.

2012 will see exciting events and changes in Isanti. Redistricting has placed our City in a new State Representative district as well as a new County Commissioner District. These changes highlight the need to have good representation for our community at each level of government. There is not one seat on the School Board or County Board occupied by a City resident.

We are hosting State tournaments for soccer and BMX, along with numerous weekly games and rides this summer. Our State Champion Redbirds will be playing in a tougher division this year and will continue to make us proud. These groups bring in tens of thousands of spectators and participants and highlight the great strengths of our community. Rodeo Jubilee Days along with other numerous events make Isanti such a wonderful community.



The Municipal Liquor Store is staffed by the Liquor Store Manager, a part time Municipal Clerk II, two clerk III's and 6 part-time Municipal Clerks. The staff at the Municipal Liquor Store is responsible for the following:

• Provide regulated sale of alcoholic beverages and related products as a retail off-sale operation.

• Provide a revenue source for the City to contribute to reducing the cost of general fund projects, programs and services to City residents.

Each of the staff members at the Liquor Store bring with them knowledge and skills that are pertinent to their responsibilities. Many of the employees have been with the

City for an extended period of time; and are valuable and important to the successful operation of the Liquor Store.

The Planning and Parks Department is staffed by the Planning and Parks Director and the Community Service Officer. The Department is responsible for the following:

- Administer Zoning and Subdivision Ordinances.
- Administer City Comprehensive Land Use and Long Range Plans.
- Process land use applications, including Variances, Use Permits, Rezoning, Subdivision, Annexation Requests, etc.
- Staff the Planning Commission and Park and Recreation Board, prepare agendas, staff memos, proposed ordinances and policies.
- Oversee and coordinate Park Improvement Projects with the Public Works Director.
- Shown: Lisa Wilson
- Prepare Park and Planning related funding and grant applications.
- Administer the Flood Plain Land Use (FEMA) Program.
- Prepare and administer plans for park and recreation development, sidewalks, and trails.

• Oversee the Community Service Officer; who works to address nuisance and non-compliant property related matters, by advising property owners of code requirements and enforcement procedures to obtain compliance with City Code.

The staff that makes up the Planning and Parks Department has acquired knowledge and skills through past work experience and education; which enables them to perform the duties associated with their positions. Lisa Wilson, Director, has earned a Bachelor's Degree in Public Administration and Policy Analysis with a minor in Small City Analysis from the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, a Master's Degree in Urban and Regional Planning from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Hamline University. She is a member of the Minnesota Chapter of the American Planning Association; and has earned her professional credentials to be a member of the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP). Mrs. Wilson has ten years of experience in the areas of planning, zoning, and land use; and continues to earn continuing education credits to maintain her professional credentials. As of the publication of this edition of the Isantian, the Community Service Officer position is in the process of being filled.

Business Visits – Isanti Welcomes New Businesses

Mayor Wimmer and Economic Development Director Sullivan make periodic visits to businesses in Isanti. The visits are informal and serve as an opportunity to learn more about what our businesses make, what services they provide, what their needs are, and what the City can do better to help them be more successful. - Administer Rental Housing License Program.

Both of the staff members within each Department have acquired knowledge and skills through past work experience and education; which enables them to perform the duties associated with their positions. Sean Sullivan, Economic Development Director, is a National Development Council Certified Economic Development Finance Professional. He is a Board Member of GPS 45:93 and is a member of the Economic Development Association of Minnesota (EDAM). Mr. Sullivan graduated with Honors from Metropolitan State University with a B.S. in Business Administration and was a finalist for the Outstanding Student Award. Mr. Sullivan's experience includes: Nearly 18 years of experience working with the Minnesota State Property Tax System, Tax Increment Financing and other assistance programs at both the City and County levels, comprehensive knowledge in drafting legal descriptions, legal documents and tax abatement help keep costs down for projects that the City is involved in, creation and development of two Industrial Parks; and implementation and completion of redevelopment projects in blighted areas within the City of Ramsey. During his 10 year tenure with the City of Ramsey, Mr. Sullivan was instrumental in bringing in 40 new businesses, nearly 900,000 SF of new industrial construction and \$50,000,000 in new taxable value. Rick Sames, Building Official, is a licensed Building Official with the State of Minnesota for Building, Plumbing, Mechanical, Accessibility, Fire and Energy Codes; is certified with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency for septic design and inspection, and attends yearly continuing education courses so as to maintain his credentials. He is a member of the International Code Council as well as a member of the East Central Building Officials Organization. Mr. Sames has taken college courses in architectural drafting, fire suppression, plumbing and inspections, mechanical systems and inspections, building inspections, and plan review. He has 10 years of experience as a carpenter, 18 years as a licensed contractor, 3 years as a building inspector, and 9 years as a building official.

Flushing of Water Mains Starts May 7

If you live in or near an area that is being flushed, your water may have some discoloration for a short period of time. You should avoid doing laundry at this time or running your water, as this can actually bring discolored water directly into your home's pipes. Run your tap after the flushing and it should clear up. Check our website: www.cityofisanti. us for the schedule and watch for ongoing updates as the schedule is subject to change daily.

Restrictive Watering Ban in Force

City Code Chapter §325-2. Annual sprinkling restrictions. During the period from May 1 through September 1 annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on odd-numbered days, and property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days. During this time period, no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day.

This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator. If the City Administrator determines that a water shortage exists, the City Administrator is authorized under City Code §325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod. To request an exemption please contact Rick Sames, Building Official.

The Police Department is staffed by a Police Chief, Police Lieutenant, Full and Part-time Police Officers, Police Secretary, Part-time Records Clerk, and Police Reserve Officers. The staff at the Police Department is responsible for:

• Provide 24-hour police protection - respond to Police and 911 emergencies, including businesses, residences, public facilities, schools, and road emergencies.

Provide police patrols in City, perform

• Work with area law enforcement agencies on special enforcement projects and mutual aid requests.

Provide Emergency Management Re-

- sponse participate in administration, planning, and training. Provide a School Resource Officer to work in local schools.
- Work with the Prosecuting Attorney on all court and prosecution related activities; including investigations, writing tickets/citations, apprehend offenders, and enforce court orders.
- Administration of dog licenses and dog control services.
 - Participate in Crime Prevention and Community Events.

• Provide other community services, which include but are not limited to: infant car seat inspections, lock-out assistance, training on crime prevention, check fraud, and drug awareness; fingerprint services, provide background checks, etc.

The staff within the Police Department has each acquired knowledge and skills that enable them to effectively perform the duties assigned to their positions within the department. Each officer is required to complete a professional peace officer educational program and take a state board licensing examination prior to acquiring employment as a police officer. The officers are required to complete 48 hours of continuing education within a three year licensing term. The officers within the Isanti Police Department have the following certificates and special training: advanced child forensic interview, clandestine lab removal, use of force instructor, firearms instructor, taser instructor, advanced narcotics investigation, hostage negotiator, and arson investigation.

City Water System Improvements Completed

Improvements to the City's Water System, which began in the summer of 2011, have been substantially completed. These system improvements include the replacement of Well House No. 1, the replacement of all water meters in the City and completion of a watermain loop located in Bluebird Park.

Well House No. 1 went through a successful start-up in mid-February and is now again available to be used in rotation with the City's two other wells. Site work will be completed around the building in the spring.

All of the water system improvements were funded with a grant and low-interest loan obtained through the State of Minnesota's Public Facilities Authority. These improvements will enhance the water system's opera-

tional and economic efficiency and continue to ensure that the City has a reliable and safe water system for its residents and businesses. Please contact City Engineer Brad DeWolf P.E. at 612-756-1032 if you have any questions.

 Water System – maintain water distribution system (i.e. mains, valves, hydrants, and meters). Maintain wells, pumps, and the Water Plant. Perform tests and prepare reports.

• Wastewater System – maintain wastewater collection system, lift stations, and Wastewater Treatment Plant. Perform tests and prepare reports.

Storm Water System - maintain storm water system and public storm water ponds.

Community Events – assists as directed with set-up of equipment; and clean-up activities on streets and public grounds.

Equipment maintenance – includes routine maintenance on city vehicles.

Daily Inspections - routine daily City wide inspection of community infrastructure and services as well as 24-hour on-call service provided to City residents.

The Public Works Director and Maintenance Technicians earned and maintain credentials that provide them with the knowledge and skills that are essential to the duties that they perform each day. Pat Meyer, Director, has a Class "B" Water and Wastewater Operator Certificate, Type IV Biosolids Certificate, and a Class "A" CDL license. Mike Harris has a Class "C" Water and Wastewater Operator certificate, a Certificate in Auto Mechanics, and a Class "B" CDL license. Matt Sylvester has a Class "C" Water and Wastewater Operator certificate, a Certificate in Diesel Mechanics, and a Class "B" CDL license. Jim Mager has a Class "C" Water and Wastewater Operator certificate, has attended courses on Computerized Machining, and has a Class "B" CDL license. Vic Fanth has a Class "D" Water and Wastewater Operator certificate, an Associate of Arts degree, and a Class "B" CDL license. Josh Becker has a Class "D" Wastewater Operator certificate, is studying to earn his Water Operator certificate, and has a Class "A" CDL license. Scot Klersy is studying to earn his operator's certificates, holds a Certificate in Auto Mechanics, and has a Class "B" CDL license.

City Code § 119 permits burning by reference of MN State Statute 88 and the MN Uniform Fire Code, Campfires are permitted if applied as follows: A campfire is a fire set for cooking, warming, or ceremonial purposes, which is not more than three feet in diameter by three feet high and the ground surrounding the fire has been cleared of all combustible material twenty-five feet from the base of the fire.

Please be reminded that dog licenses are due April 30, 2012. All dog owners must license their dogs annually. License fees are \$10 per year for fixed dogs and \$15 per year for non-fixed dogs. A late fee of \$5 will be charged if licensed after the deadline. Dog licenses may be obtained through the Police Department located at 401 First Avenue NW. 

Summer is approaching and with that comes the season of lawn care. The City of Isanti would like to bring to your attention City Code - Chapter (§) 216 and the fees associated with this.

§216-2 (H) states that all noxious weeds an other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are considered a public nuisance affecting health. In accordance with the notification requirements of §216-6 of this chapter, and after seven (7) calendar days notice by the City, the Public Works Director shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises.

The owner of the premises on which a nuisance has been abated by the City shall be personally liable for the cost to the City of the abatement, including administrative costs. Any unpaid charges will be assessed to the property.

The costs associated with this are billed on a time spent basis. A \$25.00 non-compliance fee is charged in addition to the cost.
