1 st Tuesday of the Month @ 7:30 or immediately following the city council meeting The year 2013 ended with some great accomplishments, and set the stage for new challenges in 2014. We had 11 new and expanding businesses, a Long Term Budget balanced through 2020, debt payments reduced from 14% to 11% of our total budget, administrative costs were 33% less than our peer group of cities, and our commercial/industrial tax base expanded from 13% to 18% of our total tax base. The City took over operations of the Community Center and the facility is booked solid for 2014. We will begin renovations of the facility and parking lot this spring. The Downtown Street Dances and Farmer's Market were a success and we will continue these great events in 2014. We are planning for three Street Dances and an expanded Farmers Market calendar, which will offer more options.

We are starting some great new programing in 2014 through the Parks Division, which include a Junior Master Gardener Program, Nature Detectives Club, Free Movie Nights, and "From Lands to Legacy". These programs, other great activities, and community group information are detailed in the following pages. We are committed to bringing low and no cost program options for our residents to enjoy.

One of the trends I have been tracking since 2010 is the number of homes within the community that have been converted to rental properties. In 2010, 74% our homes were owner occupied homesteaded properties, by 2013 that number had dropped to 58%. Rental property has increased from 10% in 2010 to over 23% by 2013, stressing the importance of our strong rental and property maintenance ordinances. A bright spot is the growth of our commercial/industrial tax base increasing from 13% to 18%. As our housing mix changes, we must continue to be aware how this affects our City and prepare accordingly.

Through tight spending controls and strong financial planning, we maintain a healthy fund balance that ensures a good credit rating and reserve funds that help us weather difficult economic times. Following the Long Term Financial Plan I created, we are able to increase needed services while maintaining a balanced budget through 2020. I will be presenting an addition in this year's budget. I am asking for a Police Investigator position. This position will help to streamline our investigation process and ensure we do not lose valuable hours of police protection within our City. This would be a change and increased cost for the City, but will allow us to better serve our residents.

An item that will be getting a lot of attention this spring and summer is the future of the Isanti Fire District. The Fire District was created out of the former City Fire Department. The Fire Department was converted into a seven member Fire District whose membership included the City of Isanti and parts of six townships. The Fire District has a number of serious flaws that have not been addressed by the Fire Board; even after repeated attempts have been made by the City to address those issues. The two most critical are the lack of a fair cost formula and the lack of weighted voting. Currently, most City Fire District runs are medical and have a low cost to the District; while many runs to townships are more costly. The formula used to charge each entity is based on the number of runs made, not the actual cost of the run. If there is a grass fire in a township requiring a dozen firefighters and equipment versus a medical call in the City where one firefighter is needed for a short period of time, the formula counts each as one run for the sharing of cost. This is not equitable to the City and causes us to pay far more for services than we actually use. The other significant issue is the lack of weighted voting. This means that even though the City pays 35% to 40% of the Fire District cost each year, we only get one vote out of seven or 14% of the total votes. We are in a situation where we are overcharged for services and then are not given the appropriate voting power. The Firefighters themselves are doing a wonderful job, just as they had when it was a City Department. Unfortunately, it takes a unanimous vote to make any amendments to the agreement. This makes reform very difficult. We are exploring all of our options to try and bring equity back to our taxpayers, while ensuring the same level of great service.

Weed and Grass Nuisances

Summer is approaching and with that comes, lawn care. The City of Isanti would like to bring to your attention City Code - Chapter (§) 216 and the fees associated with this.

§216-2 (H) states that all noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are considered a public nuisance affecting health. In accordance with the notification requirements of §216-6 of this chapter, and after seven (7) calendar days notice by the City, the Public Works Director shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises.

The owner of the premises on which a nuisance has been abated by the City shall be personally liable for the cost to the City of the abatement, including administrative costs. Any unpaid charges will be assessed to the property. The costs associated with this are billed on a time spent basis. A \$25.00 non-compliance fee is charged in addition to the cost.

Ready? Set. Build!

Remember to get your zoning permit this spring and summer!

Zoning permits are required for:

• Accessory structures 120 square feet or less in floor area.

• Residential patios and decks not attached to a structure, which is less than thirty (30) inches in height above grade.

Fences not meeting the requirements for a building permit.

• All new driveways construction, re-construction or alteration, driveway extensions or parking area construction for vehicles and equipment stored outside (unless having been issued a building permit for new residential home construction).

Each zoning permit fee is \$40. Applications are available online and at City Hall.

Cambridge Medical Center Offers Free Health Screenings



On April 9th from 3-6 p.m. at the Isanti Community Center, Cambridge Medical Center will be offering free health screenings for adult community members at the Isanti Community Center as part of the Healthy Communities Partnership program. The screening takes approximately 30 minutes and registration is required. The screenings will check participants' blood pressure, pulse, cholesterol, blood

sugar, and body mass index (BMI). From there, participants will be given recommendations and resources for setting up a wellness plan, including follow-up care, goal-setting, and free wellness coaching.

Over the last year, the Healthy Communities Partnership team at Cambridge Medical Center has been working with local businesses and individuals to conduct over 300 free health screenings for adults throughout the community.

Additional Sign Reminders

• The City would like to remind local businesses that handwritten signs, whether temporary or permanent, are prohibited. All signs must be professionally made.

• Signs shall not be placed upon any public utility pole.

• Signs are not permitted within the public right-of-way.

• Temporary off-premises signs are permitted within the "B-1", "B-2", "B-3", "CBT", "RC", and "I" zoning districts, providing written permission is granted by the property owner and a temporary sign permit has been approved by the City. Temporary signs are allowed by an annual renewable permit.

• **PLEASE NOTE:** that properties along Heritage Boulevard and Highway 65 are subject to additional sign requirements as of 1/29/2014.

Seasonal Tips from Isanti's Safety Committee

Ladder Safety

1. Look for the angle sticker on ladders and use accordingly.

2. Make sure your ladder is secure when transferring to other surfaces such as roofs, decks, etc.

3. If you plan to climb onto a roof or platform from a ladder, be sure the ladder extends above the edge at least three feet.

4. Stepladders should be fully opened with the spreaders locked. Straight ladders should be placed at a four-to-one ratio. This means the base of the ladder should be one foot away from the wall or other vertical surface for every four feet of height to the point of support.






Police Department

It is with mixed emotions that Chief Sager retired, but he did so because he could...versus having too. So if you see Chief Sager out and about, wish him well in retirement and thank him for all the years of service to the community of Isanti.

In the spring, we see a surge in thefts from automobiles. Please do not leave your vehicles unlocked, this invites crimes of opportunity. Do not leave items, especially electronic items, visible in your car; even visible power cords left in the vehicle can be a cause for a breakin to your vehicle. Always locking your cars when parked is the best deterrent for a crime of opportunity. In a few months the snow will begin to melt, as this happens the city parks begin to see heavier use by many. If you see suspicious behavior or acts of vandalism, PLEASE







call the police immediately...many more crimes can be solved by getting involved. Your complaint can be made anonymously.

The 2014 annual Snowmobile /ATV parade was a success and good food was enjoyed by all. I want to thank Council Member Sue Larson for the excellent chili and Chief Sager for the hot dogs this year; and to the area businesses with their donations to the event. This year's trophy winners are Peter Thayer for "Ambassador's Choice" and "Most Unique," Corey Juimond for "Most Vintage'" and Jim Hale for "Best Theme." We will look forward to it all again January 1, 2015!

Our snowmobile complaints in town are minimal because of positive reminders and courteous snowmobile operators. But a few need to be reminded that snowmobiles are not allowed to drive on another's property without permission. Please keep your snowmobile on the trail or right of way. If you operate your machines in town on the roadway, your speed can not exceed 20 mph. All property in Isanti is owned by someone, so please be respectful of others property. Snowmobiles may not be driven in the City Parks or on school property unless it is part of a marked state or local trail system.

The Isanti Police Department concluded its second year of our annual youth snowmobile safety classes February 8 and 22, 2014; certifying approximately 140 young adults in the safe operation of snowmobiles. Any person operating a snowmobile in Minnesota born after December 31, 1976 must possess a snowmobile safety certificate. If you have any questions regarding snowmobile operating regulations you can stop at the office to pick up a DNR rules and regulations booklet.

The Police Department will be offering six ATV Youth Safety class sessions throughout the year in 2014, watch for future dates in June, August and October. All Minnesota ATV operators born after July 1, 1987 are required to have a MnDNR ATV Safety Certificate to legally operate on public lands or waters. If you have any questions regarding ATV's, you can stop at the office to pick up a DNR rules and regulations booklet.

Just a friendly reminder of the Cities Winter Parking Ordinance - There is NO street parking after 1:00 a.m. November 1st through March 31st. If you have any questions or concerns about the ordinance please call.

Lastly, watch for flyers and look in the Summer Isantian for the dates of Take-a-Kid-Fishing. This event is held in June, the date will be set in the near future.

Restrictive Watering Ban in Force

City Code § 325-2 provides regulations for annual sprinkling restrictions. During the period from May 1 through September 1 annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on odd-numbered days, and property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days. During this time period, no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day.

This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator should a water shortage exist. The City Administrator is authorized under City Code §325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod. To request an exemption please contact Rick Sames, Building Official. For a complete copy of the Code visit our website at www.cityofisanti.us.

Burning in the City Isanti Fire Department

City Code § 119 permits burning by reference of MN State Statute 88 and the MN Uniform Fire Code. Campfires are permitted if applied as follows: A campfire is a fire set for cooking, warming, or ceremonial purposes, which is not more than three (3) feet in diameter by three feet high and the ground surrounding the fire has been cleared of all combustible material twenty-five (25) feet from the base of the fire.

Attention Dog Owners

Please be reminded that dog licenses are due April 30, 2014. Dog and kennel licenses can be obtained through the Police Department located at 401 First Avenue NW. All dog owners must license their dogs annually. License fees are \$10 per year for fixed dogs and \$15 per year for non-fixed dogs. A late fee of \$5 will be charged if licensed after April 30, 2014.

Isanti City Code does require that any property owner who has more than two (2) dogs must obtain a residential kennel permit. A residential kennel license is \$50 per year. Please contact the Police Department to obtain information regarding a residential kennel permit at (763) 444-4761.

As the Isanti Fire District heads into Spring of 2014, the firefighters look back at their previous years in attempt to plan ahead as much as one can for unintended emergencies. Our call volume over the last 5 years, as you can see in the graph, continues to climb. 2013 brought us to your neighborhoods a total of 306 times. These runs equate to 44% of Isanti Fire Districts overall total call volume in 2013.

On the less tragic side of our operations, we participated in some great activities in the City, which we look forward to attend-

ing again. National statistics show a decline in civilian fire related deaths, and also in juvenile fire setting. For this, we thank our members, and you, for taking the time to educate each other, and participate in any opportunity to support these efforts. Through many different ways, Isanti Firefighters are working to educate anyone who will listen, in attempt to keep us all safe.

As our communities, our lifestyles and the expectations of the fire department change, so do the risks involved. Another national trend that is diminishing is the amount of firefighter deaths due to cardiac arrest. Hearts attacks on or after leaving an accident scene have been the leading killer of firefighters for a long time. This reduction is a great accomplishment. Unfortunately, the number of firefighters dying on scene from structural collapse is on the rise. Statistics show this is largely due to lighter weight building construction, streamlined construction methods, and also the materials we purchase and use in our homes daily. The material we're highlighting today is plastic. Plastic is an oil based product (made from petrochemicals, petro-short for petroleum or oil) which when burned, gives off toxic gasses and extreme heat. This plastic, or forms of it, are in a surprisingly large amount of products in our homes. This considered, structure fires burn hotter and faster than ever before, lessoning the time a firefighter has to arrive and extinguish the fire before things get tragic. Please don't take this as an anti-plastic rant, poly based products are very much a part of our lives, and are here to stay. We Isantians simply need to make sure we are protecting ourselves at a rate equal to or greater than the implementation of all these new compounds we live in.

As the weather turns warmer, please continue to remember to be fire safe. Remind your loved ones to respect fire, change your smoke detectors batteries regularly, and call 911 as soon as possible if you think you may have any kind of uncontrollable fire in the making.

For many of us, spring time is often "clean up" and "repair" time. Here's a few items you may want to add to your list.

Clean Chimneys – For those folks who used solid fuel burning appliances such as wood, coal, corn, etc. this past winter, now is the time to clean the chimney so that it will be ready to use the next time you want it. Two homes in Isanti experienced extensive fire damage in 2013 and although neither was caused by a dirty chimney, they were great reminders of the devastation that can come from a house fire.

Smoke and C.O. detectors - Change batteries in your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide detectors and install additional detectors as necessary to meet the minimum requirements of the State Code. If you have questions regarding the requirements please contact me at my office and I'll do my best to explain them to you. Most of the manufacturers suggest changing the batteries in the units twice a year. A good way to remember is to change the batteries whenever we change the times on our clocks to "spring ahead" or "fall behind."


HRV, ERV, Furnace filters – Some of the filters need to be replaced while others can be cleaned and re-used. Each manufacturer has their own recommendations for the frequency of cleaning/changing filters but all of them recommend at a minimum quarterly. The recommendations can usually be found on the inside panels. If you're having trouble locating them you may be able to access them on the internet. If you're still having trouble finding them, give me a call and I'll try to help. If you haven't cleaned/replaced them for a while, now is a good time to do it and while you're at it, check the intake screens on the exterior of your home. Cleaning the filters regularly will help the units last longer and run more efficiently which will cost you less money in the long run.

Building Project planned? If you are unsure if a permit is required, please talk to me before you start the project. **New Home Construction** - In the last quarter of 2013 the City of Isanti issued 6 new home permits. Four of which were for custom built homes and two were for homes built on speculation. We have to go all the way back to the 2006 records to find a year with that kind of fourth quarter new residential construction activity. Hopefully, that momentum carries over into 2014. As this article goes to print in mid February, the City of Isanti has issued one new home permit in 2014.

Rental Licensing - The City of Isanti adopted the Rental Licensing Ordinance in 2008. If you or someone you know would like to rent out a residential property, or is renting without a license, please call my office ASAP so that all properties can be brought into compliance with the Rental Licensing Ordinance. Violations of this ordinance can be prosecuted as a misdemeanor.




