1 st Tuesday of the Month immediately following the City Council meeting We have a great 2016 ahead of us in Isanti built upon years of hard work and dedication to our long term Community Vision. 2015 was a good year with the addition of Family Dollar, The Green Table, Black Jack Ops, Bow Daddy, Revival Boutique, BMC British Automobile, SnoBear and many others adding over 70 new jobs to our community. Also in 2015, existing businesses, Lexington Textiles and Granger Machine, expanded their facilities and operations in Isanti. 2016 has already seen the addition of 5 new business openings and the planned opening of Coborn's and Allina clinic. There are more business openings in the pipeline but I am not at liberty to share those at the time of this article. The businesses that have already opened in 2016, and those committed, will bring over 200 new jobs to Isanti. During my first term as Mayor we had slightly more than 1,000 jobs in our City. We currently have 1,611 jobs and will have over 1,800 with the completion of the announced businesses. My goal is to reach over 2,000 jobs in the City of Isanti by the end of my term in 2018. These run the spectrum from part-time entry level to full-time engineering, medical, financial, legal and an assortment of professional positions. Isanti is 'A Community for Generations' and is fast becoming an employment community for all.

In 2015 the DNR turned 66 acres of land over to the City to manage and develop in an environmentally conscience way. Building on our great success and proven record with Legacy Park, we have created River Bluff Preserve with 38 acres of park land from this DNR land. This park will have our new Community Garden, ADA accessible fishing off the Rum River and trails connecting to Martin's Landing. We are also working with neighboring communities on other future trail developments that link the cities to our north and east and will connect us to other regional trails.

We are hosting our 9th Annual Mayor's Employer Celebration Day June 7th to highlight the vital contributions to Isanti by all those providing services, products and jobs in our community. The key to our future success and development is our business community.

I am happy to announce that our compost site will reopen in the spring of 2016 in full compliance with MPCA regulations. The facility is now secure and will have an attendant to ensure only City residents are dropping off approved compost materials. The hours as planned will be Tuesday and Thursday from 1 pm to 7pm and Sunday from noon to 5pm.

Our Farmers Market and Street Dances are back again in 2016. The Farmers Market opens Friday, May 27th and runs until September 30th. The market is open each Friday from 2pm to 6pm. Our Farmers Market has been growing each year since the City resurrected this great community event. The fresh local produce, honey, homespun rugs, local crafts, jams, eggs, maple syrup and much more make our market a destination each Friday for Downtown Isanti. Our street dances will be June 25th with Chris Brooks, July 16th with Boogie Wonderland and August 13th with Jonah and the Whales. Our street dances help to highlight our Downtown and provide a great community event where we all can get to know each other.

I am starting 'Coffee with the Mayor' the first Tuesday of each month. My goal is to have an informal get together with residents and taxpayers so we can have an open discussion about Isanti. The first event will be held at Rendezvous Coffee on March 1st from 10am to 11am. My goal is to establish a rotating schedule of locations that include the Creamery Crossing and The Green Table. It is important to create as many avenues of communication as possible so we are all contributing to the future of Isanti.

We are conducting a utility rate study that will help us to determine our water and sanitary sewer rates starting in 2017. As soon as the results of this study are complete and the City Council takes action, I will convey the new rates.

Weed and Grass Nuisances

Summer is approaching and with that comes, lawn care. The City of Isanti would like to bring to your attention City Code – Chapter (§) 216 and the fees associated with this.

§216-2 (H) states that all noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are considered a public nuisance affecting health. In accordance with the notification requirements of §216-6 of this chapter, and after seven (7) calendar days notice by the City, the Community Development Director shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises.

The owner of the premises on which a nuisance has been abated by the City shall be personally liable for the cost to the City of the abatement, including administrative costs. Any unpaid charges will be assessed to the property. The costs associated with this are billed on a time spent basis. A \$25.00 non-compliance fee is charged in addition to the cost.

Parks, Recreation and Culture is growing in Isanti in 2016!

In 2015, the City of Isanti obtained a 38-acre lot in Rum River Meadows through the tax-forfeiture process. The parcel is located on the Rum River and is within a designated Wild and Scenic River Area as determined by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The City of Isanti has worked with the DNR to obtain permission to develop the land into a park for public use. On January 19, 2016, the Isanti City Council authorized city staff to proceed in the development of the park.

Beginning in Spring 2016, construction will start on the 38-acre parcel recently named River Bluff Preserve. The new park will be located on Rum River Drive SW, and will include excellent amenities for all park visitors including trails creating easy access to the Rum River, a great place to fish on a public dock, and the Isanti Community Garden. In 2016, the Community Garden will provide 54-10'x10' ground plots, 2 raised beds, and 2 accessible beds. Registration is open February 9-June 1.

> Bring change and smaller denominations of money as each farmer is an individual business. Some farmers take check or credit but cash is preferred.

➢ If you have certain questions about fruits or vegetables, ask the farmer. Most will be happy to tell you how it was grown, cared for and how to make the best selection. Many will even share their favorite recipe!



> Bargaining is not recommended but asking to buy smaller amounts is acceptable. Some farmers will divide amounts.

Attention Dog Owners – Dog and Kennel Licenses

Please be reminded that dog and kennel licenses are due April 30, 2016. Dog and kennel licenses can be obtained through the Police Department located at 401 First Avenue NW. All dog owners must license their dogs annually. License fees are \$10 per year for fixed dogs and \$15 per year for non-fixed dogs. A late fee of \$5 will be charged if licensed after April 30, 2016. Isanti City Code does require that any property owner who has more than two (2) dogs must obtain a residential kennel permit. A residential kennel license is \$50 per year. Please contact the Police Department to obtain information regarding a residential kennel permit at (763) 444-4761.

The 2016 Construction season is upon us and we are achieving great things in City of Isanti. In 2014-2015, there were 79 new single family housing starts. In 2016, we have already issued 7 new housing permits which is setting up for another productive year in the housing market for Isanti. Implemenation and utilization of the City SAC and WAC Deferral program by builders has kept this sector moving along nicely. The City development team has been working tirelessly on some high profile projects which are coming to fruition. Coborn's has broken ground on its 45,000 square foot grocery store which will include a pharmacy as well as other amenities. This project is anticipated to create 150 local jobs. On February 16, 2016, Allina granted full approval for the construction of a 17,000 square foot medical clinic and construction is anticipated to commence this spring with completion early next year. This project is anticipated to create up to 35 jobs in Isanti. Both projects bring significant investment into the community and provide many new products and services that Isanti residents were lacking. The Development Team Staff will continue working hard to bring businesses to Isanti that will meet the needs of the community.







The City of Isanti was recognized by the Economic Development Association of Minnesota (EDAM) for its recruitment efforts and effective marketing and was presented the Economic Development Award of Excellence for Business Recruitment in January of 2016, where Mayor George Wimmer and Economic Development Director Sullivan received the award on behalf of the City. The City of Isanti welcomed SnoBear USA in August of 2015. SnoBear USA manufactures purpose built snow-track vehicles for personal, business and governmental use. The City of Isanti actively recruited this business previously located in Fargo, North Dakota to the City of Isanti. This was the second business recruitment award that has been received by the City of Isanti; the other being for its efforts to bring Ever Cat Fuels to Isanti in 2008.

The 2016 annual Snowmobile / ATV parade had a good turnout even though the lack of snow was disappointing. I want to thank Sue Larson for the excellent chili and to the area businesses with their donations to the event, this is truly a fun event. I hope to see everyone again, with lots of snow, on January 1, 2017!

The Police Department has received four (4) new Phillips Automatic Electronic Defibrillators (AED's) from the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community Life Saver Grant Program. These units will replace older units; however, these older units will be repurposed within the City at other public building sites

A reminder to all, 2016 Special Vehicle Operators Permits are available to use golf carts and Class 1 ATV's (ones you straddle) on the municipal streets of Isanti. The yearly permit is \$25.00. The application and permit can be obtained at the Isanti Police Department. For more information call or stop into the office.

The Police Department will be offering three ATV Youth Safety class sessions starting on April 16, August 13 and October 15, 2016 held at the Isanti Community Center starting at 8:00 am. Complete the MN ATV/OHM Rider's Safety Class online at: Offroad-ed.com (the fee for the online course \$29.50) or ATV course.com (the fee for the online course \$29.95), then attend a Hands-On ATV Safety class at a cost of \$10.00: Students ages 12-15 must register for a Hands-On ATV Safety Training class by calling the police department. All Minnesota ATV operators born after July 1, 1987 are required to have a MnDNR ATV Safety Certificate to legally operate on public lands or waters. If you have any questions regarding ATV's, you can stop at the office to pick up a DNR rules and regulations booklet.

In a few months the snow will begin to melt, as this happens the city parks begin to see heavier use by many. If you see suspicious behavior or acts of vandalism, PLEASE call the police immediately...many more crimes can be solved by getting involved. Also, we see a surge in thefts from automobiles, please do not leave your vehicles unlocked, this invites crimes of opportunity. Do not leave items, especially electronic items, visible in your car; even visible power cords left in the vehicle can be a cause for a break-in to your vehicle. Always locking your cars when parked is the best deterrent for a crime of opportunity. Your complaint can be made anonymously.

Isanti Fire Department

Did you know that a structure fire is reported in the state of Minnesota every 1 hour and 24 minutes? Or that MN fire departments are dispatched to an emergency medical situation every 3 minutes? Statewide, structure fires are (thankfully) losing popularity at a rate of -12% in the last 4 years. On the flip side, medical emergencies are experiencing a 19% increase. (MN State Fire Marshal's 2014 Fire in Minnesota Annual Report). The bottom line? Minnesota fire departments are busy.

The City of Isanti is leading this trend.


Since 2010, the City of Isanti has experienced a 16% decline in fire suppression (vs. a -12% statewide), and a 35% rise in emergency medical calls (vs. a +19% statewide). Numerous studies exist online to explain this statewide trend, nonetheless the fire department needs to compensate it.

The Fire District has hired its 2nd fulltime firefighter as well as 8 additional paid on call firefighters in 2016. These firefighters will be certified MN Emergency Medical Responders whose task will be to respond to these increasing emergency medical calls in the City and surrounding Townships in an average of 3 minutes after the call to 911 is made (2015 Image Trend Alarm Analysis by Districts). The mission of our Firefighters at these calls is to provide emergency medical care pre and post ambulance arrival.

Mark your calendars! July 8th, 9th and 10th is the 40th Annual Isanti Firefighters Professional Rodeo. We have some big additions to the entire weekend this year including a PRCA Xtreme Bulls performance on Sunday. This bulls only event will bring approximately 50 of the world's best bull riders to Isanti, who will compete for the Isanti Firefighters Pro Rodeo Tour title, proceeding towards the PRCA World Standings and the Wrangler National Final Rodeo competitions.

Restrictive Watering Ban in Force

City Code § 325-2 provides regulations for annual sprinkling restrictions. During the period from May 1 through September 1 annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on odd-numbered days, and property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days. During this time period, no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day.

This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator should a water shortage exist. The City Administrator is authorized under City Code §325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod. To request an exemption please contact Nick Henly, Building Official. For a complete copy of the Code visit our website at www.cityofisanti.us.

Winter is finally behind us and warm weather is ahead!

Along with the warmer weather comes a surge of construction, building, remodeling, and all manner of summer projects. If you are at all unsure of whether or not your project requires a permit, please take just a moment to visit the City's website and find the building department section under GOVERNMENT CITY DEPARTMENTS; or call the building department.

Communication & Information. These are two aspects I believe are crucial to a good working relationship between a municipal department and the community it serves. The building department is in place to help the citizens of Isanti build, alter, repair, and add on to structures and property in a safe and consistent manner where it concerns safety, health, public welfare, longevity, energy efficiency, and community enhancement. The building department section of the City of Isanti's website is an evergrowing source of general building information and codes, as well as city requirements, permits, and licenses. You can even fill out and submit some building and zoning permits online now! Please visit us. www.cityofisanti.us.

2016 looks to be a busy growing year for Isanti! New home construction has already started out very strong, and the forecast is looking like it will only continue throughout the year. Taken into account with the big, exciting new businesses coming to our city this year, and Isanti looks to definitely be in an expansion mode. Growing can always cause a few adjustment pains, so I'd like to re-state the importance of communication and information. If you ever have any questions, concerns, or require any assistance that pertains to building or community development, please visit the city's website or contact the appropriate city department.

Spring maintenance tip: Clean the filters of furnaces, heat recovery units or energy recovery units (HRV or ERV), continuous exhaust fans, and bath fans. If these filters aren't properly maintained it could lead to premature motor burn out and additional energy consumption (and cost). Proper maintenance can also help to greatly improve the interior air quality of your home. HRV and ERV units generally have four filters to deal with three inside the units and one on the exterior of your home. The instructions for how the filters are to be cleaned/replaced and how often can generally be found inside the cover of the units, or online. Bath fan housings can be removed, washed and replaced, or vacuumed without removing.
