We start 2017 with a flourish of good news and announcements of upcoming activities. First I want to update you on how 2016 ended. We had 63 new homes and several new development plats approved. 2017 has begun with 14 new home permits, which is ahead of last year's pace. Business development continues at a strong pace as construction will soon begin on several new projects. The Arts & Science Academy looks to expand and has begun discussions with the City on adding a middle school in Isanti. We added 42 acres of land to our City from Athens Township by request of the land owner.

City Council approved moving forward with street improvements to Palomino, our annual street maintenance work, and sidewalk & curb work along 1st Ave. We are following our 10-year Pavement Management Plan. The new Pre-treatment facility will be completed soon. Our Farmer's Market is moving to a location just north of the Municipal Liquor Store. This will give greater visibility and draw more people to our market. Our Summer Program Series from Parks, Recreation & Culture Department will feature an Earth Day Cleanup April 22, Planting for Pollinators June 3rd and River Investigators August 5th. The Nature Detectives Club will also still be held the first Saturday of each Month at the Isanti Community Center. For more information check out our City website – www.cityofisanti.us

June 24th kicks off our Summer Street Dance Series with Boogie Wonderland and July 15th is Devon Worley Band. August 12th will be a full day of activities we are calling Celebrate Isanti. With Cambridge pulling out of the Two Cities One Community event we decided to make sure we still celebrate our Community. We know that our entire area helps to make Isanti a great City. We welcome everyone to come Celebrate our City with a day full of fun and free activities. We will start the morning with a timed 5k with medals for the first three finishers in the following four categories – boys, girls, men's and women's. There is a family bike ride on our great bike/walk trail and a fitness/kids festival in Bluebird Park. These activities will then transfer to the 7th Annual Summer Spectacular Car Show presented by Rum River Rods. They will have kids events, 50/50 raffle, food vendors, Pie Eating Contest, craft & vendor show and some of the most amazing cars around. At 7pm the Free Street Dance featuring Jonah and the Whales starts. There will be food vendors and the Isanti Lions will be selling beer. We have created a Scavenger Hunt with prizes for the 1st 100 participants that complete it and entry for a Grand Prize drawing. The Scavenger Hunt will take you through all our parks and highlighted areas of Isanti over several weeks.

We conducted a survey of new home buyers to gather information on why they chose Isanti. We sent out 134 surveys and had a 26% response rate. We gathered great information that will help us to continue to market our great City. I want to thank Isanti Retail Meats, Rendezvous Coffee, WillowBridge, Brushes and Boards, and Coborn's Marketplace for providing support to make this survey possible.

The City Council voted unanimously to move forward with the process to annex township properties that are surrounded by the City. Cambridge annexed township properties surrounded by their city in 2016. These properties have benefited from our growth, economic investments, parks & trails, greater police protection, city roads and so on. These properties currently pay their township property taxes yet receive virtually no services from the Township. City Taxpayers need to stop subsidizing these areas and ensure that everyone is paying their fair share.

## Attention Dog Owners – Dog and Kennel Licenses

Please be reminded that annual dog and residential kennel licenses are due April 30, 2017. Dog and kennel licenses can be obtained through the Isanti Police Department located at 401 First Avenue NW. All dog owners must license their dogs annually. License fees are \$10 per year for fixed dogs and \$15 per year for non-fixed dogs. Lifetime licenses are available for \$50. A late fee of \$5 will be charged if licensed after April 30, 2017. A certificate of rabies vaccination must be provided at the time of license purchase.

Isanti City Code does require that any property owner who has more than two (2) dogs must obtain a residential kennel permit. A residential kennel license is \$50 per year. Please contact the Police Department to obtain information regarding a residential kennel permit at (763) 444-4761.

# **Community Development/Code Enforcement/Building**

Community development is a process through which staff, residents, businesses, and organizations collaborate to improve the social, physical, and economic well-being in the City of Isanti. The Department administers land use controls and implementation of the Comprehensive Plan in a manner consistent with City policies. Department staff facilitate new development and redevelopment while enforcing codes and regulations. The Community Development Director is likewise responsible for responding to information requests from residents, local business owners and developers.

The Community Development Department is staffed by the Community Development Director and the Code Enforcement/Zoning Technician, and oversees the Building Department. The Community Development Department is responsible for administering the following:

# **Planning and Zoning**

#### Administers Zoning and Subdivision Ordinances.

- Ordinances are adopted to ensure the health and safety of the community. They provide for well-developed communities where compatible uses are built together, fire hazards are reduced, our environment is protected and a standard of living is upheld.
- The zoning ordinance is used by staff daily and is quite often reviewed for changes due to the ever-changing and developing community needs.
- Subdivision ordinances relate to the development of land into individual parcels for development. This ordinance ensures that property is properly and legally described and recorded consistent with Minnesota State Statutes.

### **Administers City Comprehensive Land Use Plans.**

- The Comprehensive Land Use Plan is used to effectively and efficiently guide the long-range growth of the city. It is comprehensive in that it addresses demographics, economic development, transportation, land use, community facilities, public utilities, environmental characteristics/constraints, and recreational opportunities.
- It has been determined by the City Council at the 2017 Goal Setting meeting, to update the Isanti Comprehensive Plan in 2018. The Plan was last updated in 2008.

# Processes land use applications, including: Variances, Use Permits, Rezoning, Subdivision, Annexation Requests, etc.

• When an application or an inquiry about development comes into the Community Development Department, staff verifies with the zoning code what district the property is in and if the use is allowed. There are several types of uses within each district. Permitted Uses – uses which may be lawfully established in a particular district, provided it conforms with all requirements, regulations, and performance standards. Conditional Uses – a use which because of its unique characteristics cannot be properly classified as a permitted use in a particular district. After consideration of the impact and need for the particular use and its location, a permit for such use may be granted by the City Council. Interim Use – a temporary use until a particular date or event, or until zoning regulations no longer permit it. An interim use permit is granted to a particular individual, not to the subject property.

#### Other types of applications include:

- Variance a request to vary from the literal provisions of the Zoning Ordinance due to practical difficulty as a result of circumstances unique to the property.
- Rezoning a rezoning is a change to the land use category of a property.
- Annexation- the incorporation of land into the City, which results in a change to the corporate limits of the City.
- Signs The majority of signs, temporary and permanent, require permits. Permits are required to allow staff to review the location of the sign in order to prevent blocking the view for traffic, to ensure permission is granted by the property owner, and that it meets the amount of signage permitted based on zoning code.

# Staffs the Planning Commission, prepares agendas, staff memos, proposed ordinances and policies.

• The Community Development Director is responsible for preparing memos on projects for review by the City Council, Planning Commission, Development and Operations Advisory Committee and other boards and committees as necessary. The

memos are in depth descriptions of projects which include Finding of Fact and Conclusions (FFC). FFC is an outline of all zoning requirements that must be met and how the use fits with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan.

• The Planning Commission is composed of all five Councilmembers and two citizens appointed by the City Council.

## **Code Enforcement**

- The Community Development Director manages the Code Enforcement/Zoning Technician; who works to address nuisance and non-compliant property related matters, by advising property owners of code requirements and enforcement procedures to obtain compliance with City Code. The purpose is to ensure that public safety, health, and community standards related to land use are maintained for the general welfare of the community. We want all residents to experience a sense of pride and well-being within their neighborhood and community.
- Addresses questions and concerns our residents and local business owners have regarding city ordinance guidelines and possible violations of properties.
- Listens to each report to determine whether it is an issue that requires an inspection and follow-up, dispatching to the appropriate city department; or if it is a civil issue to be handled outside of the confines of city government.
- Offers advice on how to stay in compliance within the guidelines of the ordinances.
- Promotes public awareness and actively addresses city code violations.

# **Building Department**

The Community Development Director oversees the Building Department, which is operated by the Building Official.

We all rely on the safety of structures that surround us in our everyday living – from our homes and offices to our stores, schools, factories, places of entertainment, etc. MN State Building codes provide important minimum safeguards and standards to public health, safety, and general welfare. Also, the codes

help promote energy conservation, and the safety to life and property from fire and other hazards as well as to fire fighters and emergency responders during emergency operations. The building department is here to help ensure that the structures built within the community meet at least these minimum requirements and codes.

- The department is responsible for issuing construction permits and conducting inspections to ensure compliance with state building code and city ordinance regulating building, mechanical, plumbing, demolition of structures, moving of structures, and manufactured housing.
- The City of Isanti follows the 2015 Minnesota Building Code. City Property Maintenance Code, and the City Rental Housing Ordinances are also enforced.
- Rental Licenses Isanti requires a rental license for properties being rented out as a dwelling unit. Rental licenses help protect the public health, safety and welfare of the residents living in the rental units. Licenses are valid for two years.
- Zoning Permits The Building Department, in conjunction with the Community Development Department, also issues Zoning Permits. Zoning Permits are required for fences, driveway expansions, improvements, replacements, etc., accessory structures, patios and decks not attached to the principal structure, additional off-street parking areas, and planting screens. Zoning permits are required to ensure structures are placed inside the property lines, outside of critical easements, and with the neighbor's consent if necessary (fences placed on property lines).
- Electrical permits and inspections are performed by a contracted third-party. Information can be obtained from the Building Official.

# Restrictive Watering Ban in Force

City Code § 325-2 provides regulations for annual sprinkling restrictions. During the period from May 1 through September 1 annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on odd-numbered days, and property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days. During this time period, no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day.

This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator should a water shortage exist. The City Administrator is authorized under City Code §325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod.

# **Commercial Project Pipeline for 2017**

The new Allina Clinic opened March 1, 2017 providing much needed services for Isanti residents including: family practice, pregnancy care, specialty care and mental health appointments. Courage Kenny Sports & Physical Therapy will offer physical therapy. Integrative medicine consults with a doctor or nurse clinician, acupuncture and holistic nutrition consults will be available from the Penny George™ Institute for Health and Healing. City approvals have been granted for a new O'Reilly's Auto Parts, to be located just south of Coborn's Marketplace, and an expansion of Prairie Senior Cottages Isanti Memory Care, which should start this spring when the commercial construction begins. Whiskey Road Pub and Grub, which will be located at 404 Whiskey Road NW is planning to open in June 2017, giving Isanti residents another new restaurant option. Other projects are in various stages of development and the City Development Team continues to work hard to bring new businesses to Isanti and to work with existing businesses to improve the local business climate.

# **Isanti Housing Market Continues to Surge**

Single family housing construction continues to boom in Isanti. From 2014-2016, 142 housing permits were issued with 63 coming in 2016. 2017 has continued to show strong growth with 14 permits in process as of late February. Data from actual sales in regional markets from the Minneapolis Realtors Association shows that the City of Isanti is more than holding its own with the Cambridge Market which is great news for the whole region. The City of Isanti continues to leverage a housing study conducted by Maxfield Research in 2015 to work on filling the senior and residential housing needs for the community. City Staff has estimated our current population to be 5,700 which is the highest it has ever been, and Isanti is positioned well to grow responsibly through the next decade.

## **Fire Safety:**


There have been 2 home fires already this year- thankfully no one was hurt in either. I can never stress this enough, but please take the time to ensure your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms are working, and that you have at least the min required amount mounted where they need to be. Check the building department's page on the City's website for information, or contact the Building or Fire Dept. with any questions as to the requirements. Also as importantly, make sure all emergency escape routes are planned and clear. NEVER have only 1 way out that can get blocked off by fire or smoke. Especially from a sleeping room. Remember that any legal bedroom has to have an egress window.

With that out of the way- winter is almost behind us and warm(er) weather is ahead! Along with the warmer weather comes a surge of construction, building, remodeling, and all manner of summer projects. 2017 looks to be another busy growing year for Isanti! New home construction has already started out stronger than last year's impressive start, and the forecast is looking like it will only continue that trend again throughout the year.

If you are at all unsure of whether or not your project requires a permit, please take just a moment to visit the City's website and find the building department section under GOVERNMENT CITY DEPARTMENTS; or call the building department. The building department section of the City of Isanti's website is an ever-growing source of general building information and codes, as well as city requirements, permits, and licenses. You can even fill out and submit some building and zoning permits online now! Please visit us. www.cityofisanti.us.

**Spring maintenance tip:** Clean the filters of furnaces, heat recovery units or energy recovery units (HRV or ERV), continuous exhaust fans, and bath fans. If these filters aren't properly maintained it could lead to premature motor burn out and additional energy consumption (and cost). Proper maintenance can also help to greatly improve the interior air quality of your home. HRV and ERV units generally have four filters to deal with- three inside the units and one on the exterior of your home. The instructions for how the filters are to be cleaned/replaced and how often can generally be found inside the cover of the units, or online. Bath fan housings can be removed, washed and replaced, or vacuumed without removing.

# Weed & Grass Nuisances

Summer is approaching and with that comes, lawn care. The City of Isanti would like to bring to your attention City Code

– Chapter (§) 216 and the fees associated with this.

§216-2 (H) states that all noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are considered a public nuisance affecting health. In accordance with the notification requirements of §216-6 of this chapter, and after seven (7) calendar days notice by the City, the Community Development Director shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises.

The owner of the premises on which a nuisance has been abated by the City shall be personally liable for the cost to the City of the abatement, including administrative costs. Any unpaid charges will be assessed to the property. The costs associated with this are billed on a time spent basis. A \$25.00 non-compliance fee is charged in addition to the cost.

# Seasonal Tips from Isanti's Safety Committee:

Get Vaccinated. Vaccinations can prevent many diseases and save lives. All adults should get tetanus vaccination every 10 years. Tetanus lives in the soil and enters the body through breaks in the skin. Because gardeners use sharp tools, dig in the dirt, and handle plants with sharp points, they are particularly prone to tetanus infections. Before you start digging this season, make sure your tetanus/diphtheria (Td) vaccination is up to date.

Put away all your cleaning supplies when you are done.

When you finally finish your spring cleaning tasks for the day it is important to put your supplies away. Cleaning supplies are an attractive nuisance for our children and our pets, something inviting that they should not be getting into. Put the cleaning products away in a childproof cabinet for your children's safety and well-being as soon as you are done with them.


In the spring, we see a surge in thefts from automobiles. Please do not leave your vehicles unlocked, this invites crimes of opportunity. Do not leave items, especially electronic items, visible in your car; even visible power cords left in the vehicle can be a cause for a break-in to your vehicle. Always locking your cars when parked is the best deterrent for a crime of opportunity and will save you from further headaches of potential identity thefts.

In a few months the snow will begin to melt, as this happens the city parks begin to see heavier use by many. If you see suspicious behavior or acts of vandalism, PLEASE call the police immediately...many more crimes can be solved by getting involved. Your complaint can be made anonymously.

# Fire Department:

The above graph shows fire and medical call volumes in Isanti over the last 6 years. These calls amount to (on average) 78% of our total calls for service. In other words, 78% of the time someone in the City of Isanti calls the Fire Department for help, the problem is a medical emergency or a fire emergency



incident. The Fire Department's response at medical emergency incidents are assisted by local law enforcement agencies, including the Isanti Police Department, and ultimately Allina Health. Isanti Fire District's other calls for service in the City include hazardous and unknown gas leaks, false alarms and non-emergency calls for help.

Another service the Fire Department provides is fire prevention. It is a general rule of thumb that the best way to protect each other from unwanted fire, is to prevent it. You can help! The shorter we can all make that green line above, the better. To help defend against the fires that do occur, the City of Isanti was recently rated by the Insurance Services Offices in the top 7% of protection class ratings of all communities in Minnesota!
