

2018 looks to be another good year for Isanti. We have great events planned for everyone to enjoy. Parks, Recreation and Culture conducts Curious Creatures every 2nd Tuesday of the month. It hosts Free Movie Nights at the Isanti Community Center, a Rain Garden Workshop April 19th, Farmers Market every Friday starting May 25th, a Pollinator Workshop June 9th, Passport to the Parks Scavenger Hunt June 21st to August 3rd, three free Street Dances (June 23rd ,July 14th, and August 11th), Celebrate Isanti August 11th, and Fall Family Day @Legacy Park October 6th to name a few. A small foldable pocket 2018 event calendar is included in this issue of the Isantian.

I want to congratulate Isanti School Resource Officer Adam Gau on winning the 2017 Minnesota Juvenile Officers Award and the 2018 Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association Award for Distinguished Service. Officer Gau has also won the 2016 MN Toward Zero Death Education All Star Award, the Isanti County 2015 Law Enforcement Distinguished Service Award and the 2015 MADD Outstanding School Resource Officer Award. Officer Gau is an incredible asset to our City. I also want to congratulate Reserve Officer Jeremy 'Jed' Roberts-Lethaby on winning the Isanti County Law Enforcement Association's – Volunteer Citizen of the Year Award for 2017. Our Reserve Officers are volunteers who dedicate themselves to helping our City. Great Job!

The City Council met January 22nd to outline goals for the coming year. We discussed a number of different topic areas and agreed to 13 Goals/Projects for 2018. I want to touch on a few of them here. We will be putting together a plan to update our City website that will make it more functional and accessible. We also need to update our City Council communication equipment to help reduce cost and improve connectivity. Our 20-year Capital improvement plan is the financial focus this year. We work to rotate through all of our long-range plans. A few years ago, we approved a long-range staffing plan that included transitioning our City Administrator. We have been fortunate to have the same Administrator since 2005 but the time has come to transition to a new Administrator in 2019. This will proceed according to plan and help ensure a seamless transition. The Council has been working on Emergency Planning and as part of this work has identified the need for more back up generators to power critical infrastructure and shelter locations. A multi-use skating rink is being planned for Bluebird Park and a potential sliding hill location is being researched. Heritage Boulevard traffic and the extensions of Richard and 5th Avenue NE are also being worked on. You can find the audio and minutes for the Goal Setting meeting on the City's website for more information on these and other goals.

As we enter 2018 it is a good time to remind ourselves of the positive changes in our Community. Isanti had the lowest per capita income in the county before I was elected Mayor. In the year 2000, Isanti was at \$16,662 per capita with Braham at \$16,693 and Cambridge at the highest with \$20,697. In 2016 we are in a much better place. Isanti leads with a per capita income of \$29,429 with Cambridge in 2nd at \$24,137 and Braham with \$21,696. That means the City of Isanti has had a 77% increase in Per Capita Income with Braham increasing 29.9% and Cambridge increasing 16.6%. The 2016 Median Household Income (MHI) tells a similar story. Isanti increased 54% to a 2016 total of \$67,026 (MHI). Cambridge over the same period improved 30% to \$45,871 followed by Braham with a 27% increase to \$44,101.

I am not sharing the information on the other cities in Isanti County to show them in a negative light, but instead to show that the City of Isanti has made purposeful decisions that sometimes are not popular at the time but have proven to be good for our City. If we are to provide the City services and amenities that are needed, we must have a strong financial base to work from. The Long Term Financial Plan, Long Term Development Plan and City Standards we created are helping to drive these positive economic changes.

#### ATTENTION DOG OWNERS - DOG AND KENNEL LICENSES

Please be reminded that annual dog and residential kennel licenses are due April 30, 2018. Dog and kennel licenses can be obtained through the Isanti Police Department located at 401 First Avenue NW. All dog owners must license their dogs annually. License fees are \$10 per year for fixed dogs and \$15 per year for non-fixed dogs. Lifetime licenses are available for \$50. A Life-

A late fee of \$5 will be
charged if licensed after
April 30, 2018. A certificate of rabies vaccination
must be provided at the

require that any property owner who has more





#### **Commercial - Industrial Growth**

The City of Isanti is well positioned for efficient growth in many market sectors. The commitment of the Isanti City Council directing and providing the necessary resources is a primary reason why Isanti continues to thrive. Since 2000, the City of Isanti has been a financial partner in over 27 commercial/industrial projects. We have leveraged \$3.7 million dollars in local and State funds to attract \$27 million in private investment. The Isanti Development team is a two-time winner of the Excellence in Economic Development Business Recruitment Award from the Economic Development Association of Minnesota. It won awards for the EverCat Fuels (2008) and SnoBear USA (2016) projects. Both of these projects utilized state and local incentives to leverage significant private investment. The 27 public/private partnerships have resulted in the creation of 348 new jobs in Isanti as well as \$13,908,000 in taxable market value which helps reduce the tax burden for City residents. The City has also worked with other high profile projects in the retail and health sectors to assure that they located in Isanti and that the quality of the buildings constructed continue to improve the gateway to our community. Since 2009 the City has seen the number of businesses increase from 123 to 178 and jobs increase from 1377 to 1900. Commitment to the recruitment of new businesses that provide needed






services in Isanti and increasing livable wage jobs in all sectors is one of the primary economic development goals for Isanti. The City also has a strong track record of helping existing businesses grow. The City has helped Isanti businesses invest in machinery, expand their facilities, and train employees. Continuing to work with existing businesses and recruiting new ones to Isanti must happen to continue to be successful.

#### **Residential Growth History**

The City of Isanti is committed to steady growth in the residential sector and is positioned well. Isanti is a young community with a median age of 31.5. From 2000 to present the city's population has grown from 2,324 to its current estimate of 5,838. The City has approximately 145 single family residential lots with city services installed that are ready for immediate development. Before we look forward it is important to review the past. From 2000 to 2007, the City saw 1093 units of housing built which is an average of 156 per year. Isanti was booming and was one of the fastest growing cities in the nation. However, from 2008 to 2012 the City of Isanti endured the Great Recession. From 2009 to 2012 there were only 17 new housing units built (zero in 2009) which is an average of only 4.25 per year. Home foreclosures were rampant and gas prices were over \$4.00 per gallon. Tough budget decisions had to be made by the City Council to "right size" staff and to develop a plan to pull out of the recession. A continued commitment to economic development was one of the many tough choices the City Council made which positioned Isanti to be open for business once the economy turned around; and Isanti did. In 2012, the City partnered



with local builders to jumpstart the housing market by creating an incentive called the SAC and WAC Deferral Program which helps builders cashflow their project while ensuring the City receives all the fees within 120 days. From 2013-2017 there have been 248 new housing units built which is an average of 50 per year. The recovery from the Great Recession is shown in the 2009-2017 Isanti Housing Sales Data which has seen the average sales price of a single family home go from \$125,021 to \$201,700. The ebb and flow of the growth and economic conditions can been

seen in the 2002-2018 taxable market value chart. It is true that we are not growing as fast as we did from 2000-2007 but the rate of growth has been steady and predictable which allows the City to plan accordingly. A strong housing market and growing population helps build the workforce, business development, and opportunity.

### Planning, Catalyst Projects and Marketing

The City of Isanti has been actively involved in all facets of economic development in the community. In addition to the public/private partnerships mentioned previously, the Development Team has also been focused on delivering key projects within the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). Projects and needs that have been outlined in past and current CEDS documents include: downtown redevelopment/revitalization, pharmacy, medical clinic, hotel, rail industrial park, upgrade the sewer and water treatment plant. To date, downtown redevelopment/revitalization continues, a pharmacy and


health clinic have been opened in Isanti, a feasibility study has been completed and preliminary approval has been granted by BNSF for the rail industrial park, and upgrades to the existing sewer plant have been completed. Staff is currently working hard to secure a 60 unit Best Western Plus hotel project on the site just east of Hurricane Car wash on Highway 65. Completing these key projects will help solidify Isanti as a destination and regional hub for business.

In 2015, the City partnered with Rum River BMX to construct the Isanti Indoor Arena, a 75,000 square foot state of the art indoor

BMX facility for year round competition. This venue brings 80,000 people to Isanti annually. It regularly hosts state, regional and national tournaments and has been rated as the #1 track in the nation. Projects such as Isanti Indoor Arena, the Isanti Soccer Complex, Isanti Ice Arena and the proposed hotel create synergy with each other and create an environment/market that serves as a catalyst for more investment in support industries like restaurants and retail. Leveraging new projects such as Coborn's Marketplace, Allina Health Clinic and SnoBear USA and utilizing relationships with long standing businesses to attract more investment into the community is par-

amount. This is possible when you nurture those relationships and work with companies so they become ambassadors for your city.

The Development Team has obtained Shovel Ready Certified Site status for the lots in the industrial park in order to stand above other sites in the state. This is a marketing advantage for our community. The Cityowned industrial park continues to do well with less than 10,000 square feet of vacant space. Staff is actively working with prospects that are looking to build and/or locate in the park this year. The City has a robust online



presence with available sites and marketing materials listed with MNCAR, LOIS, and the State of Minnesota to market these premier locations to site selectors. The Development Team is currently working on a plan to enhance its internet presence for desktop and mobile users that want to learn more about our community which will include updates to the City website. It is important to note that the robust city park and trail system serves as a huge asset for both residents and businesses. The quality of this amenity in a city the size of Isanti is extraordinary and cannot be undervalued. Isanti continues to be an active leader in facilitating economic development projects that move this community forward.

# FLUSHING OF WATER MAINS STARTS APRIL 30

If you live in or near an area that is being flushed, your water may have some discoloration for a short period of time. You should avoid doing laundry at this time or running your water, as this can actually bring discolored water directly into your home's pipes. Run your tap after the flushing and it should clear up. Check our website at www.cityofisanti. us for the schedule and watch for ongoing updates as the schedule is subject to change daily.

# ARE YOU CLEANING UP AFTER YOUR PET?

It is your responsibility as a pet owner to clean up after your pet. When taking your pet for a walk, please show courtesy to other public and private property owners by removing the excrement deposited by your pet. City Code 87-5.1 requires pet owners to immediately collect and remove dog feces deposited by their animal on public or private property. A container, equipment, or other device is required for transport of the fecal material to an appropriate disposal receptacle located on the property of the pet owner. Please help us in keeping our neighborhoods and public spaces clean and sanitary.

#### **Police Department**

I hope everyone is doing well and that 2018 is a better year for everyone.

I want to congratulate School Resource Officer Adam Gau as the recipient of the 2018 Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association Distinguished Service Award for his continued dedication and hard work with in the Isanti Schools. He continues to help the teachers with educational lesson points with his expertise along with mentoring and coaching the Isanti students. The wall of student thank you cards and notes in his office is a testament to the program's success. He will be recognized at the 2018 Chief Conference in April. Officer Gau also received the 2017 Minnesota Juvenile Officer of the Year Award from the Minnesota Juvenile Officers Association at their Annual Conference this January in Duluth. The Isanti Police Department values this opportunity and ability to have such an impact on our community's youth.

A reminder to all, 2018 Special Vehicle Operators Permit is available to use golf carts and Class 1 ATV's (ones you straddle) on the municipal streets of Isanti. The yearly permit is \$25.00. The application and permit can be obtained at the Isanti Police Department. For more information call or stop into the office.

In the spring, we see a surge in thefts from automobiles. Please do not leave your vehicles unlocked, this invites crimes of opportunity. Do not leave items, especially electronic items, visible in your car; even visible power cords left in the vehicle can be a cause for a break-in to your vehicle. Always locking your cars when parked is the best deterrent for a crime of opportunity and will save you from further headaches of potential identity thefts.

In a few months the snow will begin to melt, as this happens the city parks begin to see heavier use by many. If you see suspicious behavior or acts of vandalism, PLEASE call the police immediately...many more crimes can be solved by getting involved. Your complaint can be made anonymously.

With the melting snow comes severe weather...last spring we had our severe weather tornado sirens go off because of an alert by the National Weather Service. They are responsible for disseminating all watches and warnings to Isanti County Central Communications, except for warnings generated within the city or county. Outdoor warning siren activation in Isanti is based on the following criteria:

- 1. When a Tornado Warning is issued for Isanti County/City of Isanti by the National Weather Service.
- 2. When the National Weather Service indicates sustained wind speeds of 76 mph or more.
- 3. When public safety personnel (Law Enforcement/Fire) determine activation is necessary due to imminent danger to life and property.

Upon hearing the warning siren, it is your responsibility then to go to your media outlet of choice and determine what the nature of the emergency is and to follow the recommendations provided.

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation which designated May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. Currently, tens of thousands of law enforcement officers from around the world converge on Washington, D.C. to participate in a number of planned events which honor those that have paid the ultimate sacrifice.

Greetings from the fire station! As you can see in the chart, our call volumes have increased from 266 in 2012, to 414 runs in the City of Isanti in 2017. A 56% increase.

Some of the changes we have made this year to help offset some of that additional volume is the hiring of five new volunteer firefighters, four of whom will be responding to calls out of our fire station in the City of Isanti. Welcome to the team Jimmy Gordon, Erik Kvamme, Corey Schaefer, Lance Thompson and Uriah Giller.



Another bit of information, according to the

Minnesota State Fire Marshal, Bruce West, a recent annual report shows a common similarity in fires that start in our State. Fires in public assemblies, educational properties, residential properties, and in store and office property are all most commonly ignited in a kitchen or cooking area. Please remember fire safety at work, as well as at home!

SEASONAL TIPS FROM ISANTI'S SAFETY COMMITTEE



Spring weather can be unpredictable; sunny in the morning with thunderstorms and tornado watches in the afternoon. Make sure you and your family have an emergency plan in the event of a natural disaster or catastrophic event. Spring is a great time to review the plan with family members to make sure they know what to do. An emergency plan should include:

> A home and car emergency kit.



 A communication plan to outline how your family members will contact one another if they are not in the same place and where you should meet.



 A get-out/get-away plan with routes to safety out of your home that is practiced at least once a year.

Spring is also an ideal time to take unwanted or expired medicines to a prescription drop box, update your first-aid kit, and replace all batteries in fire and carbon monoxide alarms!

# Rain Garden Workshop

#### RESTRICTIVE WATERING BAN IN FORCE

City Code § 325-2 provides regulations for annual sprinkling restrictions. During the period from May 1 through September 1 annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on odd-numbered days, and property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days. During this time period, no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day.



This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator should a water shortage exist. The City Administrator is authorized under City Code §325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod. To request an exemption please call City Hall. For a complete copy of the Code visit our website at www.cityofisanti.us.

#### Common questions about acupuncture answered

#### What is acupuncture?

Acupuncture is the insertion of very thin, sterile needles into specific points on your body. Part of an ancient medical system called Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM), acupuncture stimulates the body's natural healing abilities and promotes well-being. It is the oldest, continuously practiced form of medicine world-wide.

What does acupuncture help treat?

The World Health Organization and the National Institutes of Health recognize acupuncture's effectiveness in treating more than 100 different illnesses and health complaints. Acupuncture is an excellent complementary therapy when done in coordination with Western medical care.

Some common health issues that acupuncture may help with include:

- cancer symptoms and side effects of treatment
- infertility
- menopause
- nausea

- pain
- restless leg syndrome
- short- or long-term illness
- sleep issues

- smoking cessation
- sports injuries
- · stress and anxiety.

What does acupuncture feel like? Will it hurt?

Acupuncture needles are very thin, so they rarely cause pain. Most people report feeling nothing, warmth, heaviness or a slight tingling sensation where needles are inserted. Many find acupuncture to be relaxing.

Is acupuncture safe?

Acupuncture is safe when done by professionals who are trained, certified and licensed. All licensed acupuncturists today use single use, sterile, disposable needles and follow universal health care precautions to ensure safety. There are very few negative side effects of acupuncture. Will my insurance cover acupuncture?

Many insurance companies cover acupuncture, especially for chronic pain conditions. But some don't, including Medicare.

One way to get the benefits of acupuncture at a reduced cost is trying Group Acupuncture. In group acupuncture, a number of people receive acupuncture at the same time. You are seated comfortably, and receive an individual assessment and customized treatment by the acupuncturist. The idea is to get all the benefits of acupuncture in a convenient, relaxing and supportive setting.

#### **WEED AND GRASS NUISANCES**

Summer lawn care season is approaching

City Code §216-2 (H) states that all noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are considered a public nuisance affecting health. Res. No. 2016-210 states that eight (8) inches of grass, weeds, or any combination is declared a nuisance. In accordance with the notification requirements of this chapter, and after seven (7) calendar days' notice by the City, the **Community Development** Director shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises.



The owner of the premises on which a nuisance has been abated by the City shall be personally liable for the cost to the City of the abatement, including administrative costs. Any unpaid charges will be assessed to the property. The costs associated with this are billed on a time spent basis. A \$25.00 non-compliance fee is charged in addition to the cost.
