Our summer will once again be filled with great events at our soccer fields, Rum River BMX, Redbird Baseball, Vision Wakeboard Park, Rodeo/Jubilee Days, Farmers' Market, Street Dances and many more. We have decided to bring back the Farmers' Market and Street Dances under City direction to help market our wonderful downtown area. We believe it is vitally important to support our local businesses by attracting potential customers to our business districts. By the City offering these events, we accomplish this principal Goal of the Council at a reasonable cost. Please visit downtown Isanti each Friday beginning June 14th from 2:30 to 6:30 p.m. weather permitting to support our new market and enjoy a free Street Dance on July 27th and August 24th.

A few changes you will be noticing in the next six months revolve around a reorganization of some City services and the anticipated cost of new State mandates. First, we are eliminating the costly, inefficient and poorly handled customer service outsourcing operation that has been handling our utility billing services. We are bringing this under City control, which will save us money, offer better control, and provide a better product to our businesses and residents. The Community Center grant the City applied for was denied. This along with the failed referendum last fall has left the Council with the tough decision. The Council could still vote to fund the needed repairs and continue to subsidize the facility but that would be directly opposed to the vast majority of voters' wishes last fall. The Center means so much to the numerous non-profit groups that have used it free of charge for years. The next item is the newly state imposed storm water regulations that we will be forced to comply with soon. This will add significant costs to the City, which is estimated at roughly \$250,000. We are looking at a storm water utility to pay for this which is what most other cities have implemented. The average estimated cost would be \$7 per month per home with businesses, multi-family units, empty plots and other buildings paying their equivalent share. These are very preliminary numbers and nothing has been approved by Council. A presentation on this issue will be provided at the 2nd Council meeting in June. The State is also increasing the cost of our water and sanitary sewer operations due to higher fees and greater restrictions.

Finally, I want to share the City of Isanti's 2012 Audit Report. The report shows how efficient and well run our City is when compared to peer communities. It points out that the Long Range Financial Plan I developed in 2007, and manage each year, has made us financially stable and improved our ratings in all categories through one of the worst economic crisis in our Country's history. I have listed a few of the highlights below:

- City Administrative cost 26% lower than Peer Cities
- Public Works 39% lower than Peer Cities
- Park and Recreation 38% lower than Peer Cities
- Public Safety 5% higher than Peer Cities
- Economic Development 380% higher than Peer Cities
- Net debt per Capita down 40% in last 4 years
- 2004 to 2007 Taxes per Capita rose 49%, since taking office in 2007 we have lowered it by 10%
- Net Taxes per Capita are now 26% lower than Peer Cities
- Net Cash to cover Debt is up 220%
- Cash on hand as a % of Budget is up 63% since I took office in 2007
- 2013 Budget is 14% less than the budget set in 2006 before I was elected Mayor
- Liquor Store operating income has risen 160% since I have become Mayor

Our Long Term Financial Plan is working and with each change we make we have made City operations in all areas more efficient and have provided a higher level of services. We have more police protection, higher rated fire protection, safer water supply after building the treatment plant, more efficient and lower cost administration, great parks and trails, a growing business sector and the list goes on and on ... we have so many things in the pipeline for our Great City that I am even more excited about serving Isanti as Mayor than I have ever been. Regardless of all the new State pressures and mandates, we will make Isanti as efficient and productive as possible. I look forward to all the challenges and opportunities we face in the years to come and hope to bring brighter days to all the Generations of our Community.

Garage Sale Regulations

Spring and summer lead to warm weather; and garage sale events. City staff has received many inquiries regarding regulations for garage sales. Garage sales are permitted within each of the residential zoning districts; however, there are rules that have been established with regards to the duration, signage, and number of events; which include the following:

• The number of sales permitted per individual property is not to exceed four (4) per year.

• The duration of a garage sale is not to exceed three (3) consecutive days.

• Any related signage shall be limited to the premises and to other residential property provided that the property owner's permission has been obtained to display such signage, shall conform to the sign ordinance, and shall be removed at the termination of the sale.

County Road 5 is now Heritage Blvd

In August 2012, the City had received notice from the Metropolitan Emergency Services Board and Isanti County Sheriff's Department regarding issues with duplicate addresses along the County Road 5 corridor within the City limits of Isanti. Based upon further information received by these entities and review of the limited options presented; in order to ensure the health and safety of City residents, businesses, and visitors, the City Council approved the renaming of County Road 5 within the corporate limits of Isanti. As of June 1, 2013, the change has officially taken effect. City of Isanti SAC and WAC Deferral Development Incentive Program for 2013 Development Update

In December 2012, the City Council of the City of Isanti adopted a new SAC and WAC deferral program. This program is designed to help increase both commercial/industrial and residential development within the City limits of Isanti. Generally speaking, the program allows these specific development costs to be financed "interest free" for a period of 120 days. Three new single family housing permits have been pulled in 2013 and all three projects have utilized the new deferral program. The term of this incentive program has not been guaranteed to exist after 2013 so be sure to take advantage of it now. Commercial development is on the rise in Isanti. In 2013, Therapy Associates and China House both pulled commercial building permits for projects to be constructed this Spring/Summer. Therapy Associates is building a new 4,800 square foot office just east of Community Pride Bank, East of Hwy 65. China house has been diligently working on a fantastic build-out to open a take-out Chinese restaurant in late May. Pat's Small Engine Repair continues to work on its expansion and two additional manufacturers have purchase agreements to buy existing buildings in the City of Isanti. One manufacturer, Cylinder Head Express, is scheduled to move into its new facility by August 2013 at 101 Isanti Parkway NE. This project was made possible by the business owner, City and bank working together on a financing package that included participation by the City of Isanti and its Revolving Loan Program. The improvement in the economy is certainly impacting the City of Isanti in a very positive way.

Building

Spring arrived late in Isanti, but summer will be here by the time you read this issue of the Isantian. Below are a number of items to pay special attention to during the warmer months of the year:

<u>Swimming Pools</u>: A pool with a capacity of 5000 gallons or more and a depth exceeding 24" requires a permit and a gated enclosure. Please call the City Building Department for further details.

<u>Sand Point Wells-</u> Sand point wells can be used for supplemental water supplies but must be completely independent from the City potable water supply. This type of well is required to be registered with the Minnesota Department of Health and the City of Isanti. Forms are available from the Building Department or at the front desk at City Hall.

<u>Back Flow Preventers</u>. Protection of your home and the City' water supply is very important. The Minnesota Plumbing Code requires domestic water supplies to be protected from lawn irrigation systems by a registered backflow device designed and approved specifically for that purpose. A permit and inspection are required.

<u>Recreational Fires</u>. Can be a very enjoyable part of a Minnesota summer evening. There is no permit requirement but the State Fire Marshall Office does have some requirements. The requirements state that the fires shall be placed inside a 3' maximum diameter fire ring, kept a minimum of 25' from any combustible structures, and the flames shall not extend higher than 3'. Here's a new twist for a traditional treat around the campfire; when making a Smores treat try exchanging a peanut butter cup for the piece of chocolate (unless you have a peanut allergy, of course).

<u>Rental Licensing</u>. The City of Isanti has a Rental Licensing Ordinance. If you have a home and are interested in using it as rental property, please contact my office. If you are a tenant or a potential tenant with intentions to rent property in Isanti and would like to know if it is currently licensed please contact my office to verify.

<u>New Home Construction</u>. There are six new homes currently under construction within the City limits. Three of those homes were issued permits in 2013. For the entire 2012 season, only four residential building permits were issued.

<u>Commercial Construction</u>. The China House Restaurant has recently completed construction and will be opening soon at 303 Credit Union Drive NE. The Therapy Associates Inc. building has completed the footings and foundation work for their new building to be located at 904 6th Avenue Court NE.

Restrictive Watering Ban in Force

Per City Code Chapter 325-2, during the period from May 1st through September 1st annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on odd-numbered days only. All property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days only. During this time period, **no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day.**

This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator. If the City Administrator determines that a water shortage exists, the City Administrator is authorized under City Code Chapter 325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod. To request an exemption please contact Rick Sames, Building Official. For a complete copy of the Code visit our website at www. cityofisanti.us.

Are you cleaning up after your pet?

It is your responsibility as a pet owner to clean up after your pet. When taking your pet for a walk, please show courtesy to other public and private owners by removing the excrement deposited by your pet. City Code 87-5.1 requires pet owners to immediately collect and remove dog feces deposited by their animal on public or private property. A container, equipment, or other device is required for transport of the fecal material to an appropriate disposal receptacle located on the property of the pet owner. Please help us in keeping our neighborhoods and public spaces clean and sanitary.

Turf damage from rodents - How do I know what rodent is causing the damage and how can I solve it?

Ground foraging rodents create a number of different problems for home owners. Some rodents create above ground grassy runways in the turf areas while others burrow just under the surface or create mounds. All of them damage lawns in one way or another. If you see these types of runways it is possible that you may have one or more rodents living and feeding in your yard. Voles, moles and gophers are three of the most common lawn and garden pests. Sometimes there is confusion figuring out what type of pest(s) you have because all three of these pests live the majority of their lives underground and are seldom seen.

Lawn Voles (also called Field Mice)



During late March and April we get many calls about voles and vole damage in grass areas. Unfortunately, the name 'vole' is close to the name 'mole' causing some confusion and miscommunication. Voles are a pest in turf and landscaped areas for two reasons: they tunnel and burrow above the soil in the turf areas, and they gnaw on the trunks and roots of various trees and ornamental plants in search of food.

There are two reasons why these pests are in your lawn. First, the environment provided from lush lawns are also a prime breeding and feeding area for lawn insect pest, grubs (or insect larvae) and earth worms. The rich, well-irrigate soil in which the turf grasses grow are a haven for crickets, worms, grubs and insects which feed on lawns. Voles eat these insects and worms. Second, many homeowners with vole infestations usually live close to a wooded area or wetland. As development decreases these natural areas, the voles look for new habitat in your maintained yards.

Lawn Moles



Since voles are not the only animal pests responsible for runways in lawn and garden areas, they are often confused with moles. Moles produce two types of runways in your yard. One runway runs just beneath the surface. These are feeding tunnels and appear as raised ridges running across your lawn. Moles have a similar diet to voles which consists of worms, grubs and insects. The second type of runway runs deeper and enables the moles to unite the feeding tunnels in a network. It is the soil excavated from the deep tunnels that homeowners find on their lawns, piled up in mounds that

resemble little volcances. These mounds are a dead giveaway that your problem is not voles, but moles. Voles leave no mounds at all behind.



Lawn Gophers (also called Pocket Gophers)

Pocket Gophers are vegetarians that feed on roots of plants and grasses. Mounds are formed as the gopher digs its tunnel and pushes the loose dirt to the surface. The mounds they create are usually fan shaped and clustered in an area which is characteristic evidence of their presence. Mounds of fresh soil are a sign of pocket gopher presence within a tunnel system. The hole, which is off to one side of the mound is usually plugged, keeping intruders out of burrows. One gopher can do a lot of damage; it may look like your yard is infested with these critters when in reality it's only one!

Recommended Treatment

There are a number of products that can be used to help reduce the damage caused by these pests in your yard. One of the most effective solutions to drive voles, moles and gophers away from your yard is to use a **granular deterrent** with 'castor oil' as the active ingredient. Not only do the granules drive the rodents away, but it's also beneficial for your lawn and garden. You can do your entire yard at once, or distribute the granules in sections to drive the moles or gophers out a specific exit. To herd these pests away, just start at the farthest point from your desired exit and apply a third of the granules. A few days later, cover the next third, then the final third a few days after that. Water will activate the scent that annoys these pests, so either water well after applying the granules or let the rain soak your yard.

Another effective method to help eliminate the desire for rodents in your yard is to use a **turf insecticide** with active ingredients such as Acephate or Talstar. This will reduce the food source and potentially the desire of the pests to enter your yard. These type of products can be purchased at your local hardware or farm supply store.

For either of these options please follow the precautionary instructions on the product bag for application rates and proper handling. To administer either of these products you can contact a local listing under Pest Control Contractors. **Oleander** is a botanical flower deterrent that can also be used to control moles and gophers. Many people will line



the edge of their mole or gopher prone areas with this plant, as the rodents seem to dislike them, although it's unclear why. In any case, Oleander is certainly a pretty flower, likely to compliment any lawn or garden.

There are also a number of rodent poisons and traps on the market. Keep in mind when using poisons not all of them are legal, and none of them are safe around kids or pets. It's recommended that you contact a local professional pest control company to review these options before using them.

In closing, most cases the turf is only temporarily esthetically damaged as the roots are still in place and will grow out as time allows, so be patient and your lawn will restore itself to the original beauty in no time at all. Some situations may require additional restoration work including topsoil placement, fertilization and seeding.

2013-Railroad Avenue & Walk Improvements

The City of Isanti is currently advertising to receive bids on the "2013-Railroad Avenue & Walk Improvements" project. This project involves the construction of multiple infrastructure improvements this coming construction season. The Minnesota Department of Transportation and the City Council have approved the use of Municipal State Aid (MSA) funds on all eligible items. This will greatly reduce the burden on the City and the taxpayers. The proposed project includes the following improvements:

– A concrete sidewalk is proposed along the south side of Heritage Blvd NE from Elim Lane NE to Credit Union Drive NE to complete the sidewalk system from Hwy 65 to Whiskey Road NW to add a continuous safe walkway to the school. A cross walk will also be added across Heritage Blvd NE to East Dual Boulevard NE.

– Railroad Avenue SE was improved north of Towns Edge Road SE in the 2010 construction season. It is now proposed to extend that improvement along Railroad Avenue SE south from Towns Edge Road SE to South Passage SE. This improvement would match the layout of the 2010 project where the street would be reconstructed with curb and gutter and a 10-foot bituminous walkway would be added along the west side of the roadway for pedestrians and bicyclists. Street lighting is also proposed along the project to improve safety.

- A 10-foot bituminous walkway is also proposed along the north side of South Passage SE from Railroad Avenue SE west to the existing bituminous trail where it currently ends near Cimarron Trail SW. This improvement would complete the loop of the existing trail and walk infrastructure, connecting the southern trail to the eastern trail system. Concrete curb and gutter would also be installed along the north side of South Passage SE from Railroad Avenue SE to the railroad crossing. Street lighting is proposed along this project to improve safety as well.

The bid opening is scheduled for the end of May. Once the bids are received, the City Council will determine if the project will be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. If the project is awarded, construction could start as early as mid June and is expected to take about three months to complete.

A message from Isanti Fire

Our Isanti Firefighters have numerous things going on, which indicates that summer is finally upon us. We had a fairly busy spring grass fire season, but by the looks of the much anticipated green grass, the threat is behind us. Grass and brush fires account for a total of 8 of our 19 fires and 253 runs total year to date. Residents in the City of Isanti can rest assured that none of these out of control fires were in the



city, although some of them were close enough to be seen. I don't think I am too far off in saying that 100% of the grass fire calls that we extinguish, were not the result of a malfunction (a train or a car engine dropping hot connecting rods into the dry grass - true story!) where the people responsible for the fire did not tell us that it happened "so fast", they couldn't believe it, or that they had no idea that it would have happened. It happens very quickly, and most fire starters don't have resources readily available other than the local fire department to deal with a wild land fire once they realize they have started one. Please continue to be fire safe, and not take any chances. The city has arrangements to rid your leaves and grass clippings free of charge, and I would highly recommend utilizing it.

The last group of firefighters to join our team have recently completed "Firefighter 2" training, and received firefighter licensing with the State of MN. These firefighters carry the same credentials that a full time firefighter who works in a bigger city like Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Duluth do. This accomplishment is above and beyond the minimum level of qualifications we expect of them, and is ultimately a benefit to all of us, as our firefighters are highly trained in the event we should ever need their assistance. These people and their families have made a tremendous amount of sacrifice to their personnel lives to accomplish this. For that, I thank them as well as the residents, Mayor and Council in the City for supporting them. The next hiring phase that we will be undergoing will be in the fall of this year with an expected start date of January 1, 2014. If you are interested in taking the challenge of becoming a paid-on call firefighter, stop by our office at 401 1st Avenue NW or visit our website and fill out an application. Firefighter applicants must be 18 years old, have a felony free criminal background, and be able to pass a mental aptitude and DOT comparable physical agility test. Applicants must also be willing to respond to the often grueling and unpredictable schedule that comes with being an on-call Firefighter.

The Fireman's Rodeo Association is geared up for their 37th Annual Professional Rodeo in the City of Isanti on July 12-13. A lot of work goes into this event by your local firemen and women, their spouses, children and significant others. Several exciting changes have been made to accommodate our growing attendance. Additional seating arrangements, vendors, and methods to streamline entrance lines as well as additional personnel have been added this year. One way you can get through the entry gates faster and save a few bucks, is to purchase your tickets in advance. Weed and Grass Nuisances

Summer is approaching and with that comes the season of lawn care. The City of Isanti would like to bring to your attention to City Code Chapter 216 Nuisances; and the fines associated with violation of these provisions.

All noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are prohibited within the City of Isanti. In accordance with the notification requirements of Chapter 216-6, after seven (7) calendar days notice by the City, the Public Works Director shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises. The owner of the premises on which a nuisance has been abated by the City shall be personally liable for the cost to the City of the abatement, including administrative costs. If such costs are not paid by the property owner, all unpaid charges will be assessed to the property.

The costs associated with this are billed on a time spent basis. A \$25.00 noncompliance fee is charged in addition to the cost. Wise Ways to Use Water

• Keep a pitcher of water in the refrigerator rather than running the tap until the water gets cold.

• Take shorter showers. A quick shower rather than a bath can save an average of 20 gallons of water. The Environmental Protection Agency recommends taking three- to five-minute showers.

• Garbage disposals use approximately 11.5 gallons of water per day. Try composting organic wastes instead.

• Use the dishwasher and washing machine only when you have full loads.

• Use mulch around trees to slow evaporation.

• Direct downspouts and other runoff toward shrubs, trees and gardens.

• Water lawns and plants early in the morning or during the evening when there is less evaporation.
