Isanti will be busy this summer with numerous events and activities. May 29th kicks off with the opening of our Family Farmer's Market 2:30pm to 6:30pm at Eagle Park and will be held every Friday through the end of September. Rum River Rods car show is every Wednesday June 3rd to August 26th with their 5th Annual Summer Spectacular prior to the City's last Street Dance of the Season on August 15th, 11:00am to 5:00pm. The Isanti Redbirds baseball team has a full schedule of games June through August with all home games free to the public. The 8th Annual Mayor's Employer Celebration Day is June 16th and highlights the 154 City businesses employing approximately 1,544 employees. We recognize milestone anniversaries, highlight business expansions such as Granger Machine and Lexington Textile and welcome new businesses represented by WillowBridge Center, Green Table, Family Dollar and Bow Daddy Archery Pro Shop and Range. June 27th will be a busy day with our soccer fields hosting the Kohl's Cup and our first Street Dance of the year with Jonah & The Whales playing Downtown 7:00pm to 11:00pm. We have Boogie Wonderland July 18th and Brat Pack Radio Supershow on August 15th. All Street Dances are free to the public with beer & food concessions on site. Rodeo/Jubilee Days kickoffs with the Isanti Parade on July 9th followed by a full weekend of events. Isanti Indoor Arena Home of Rum River BMX is once again hosting the State Finals Race. This event, along with many others, hosts thousands of visitors that spend money at our local businesses and help drive growth and new opportunities.

This edition of the Isantian has a new feature detailing the 10-Year Pavement and Asset Management Plans approved by the City Council. The City Council hosted an afternoon and evening public information meeting that had no attendance by our residents. I hope this means that our residents and businesses have supreme confidence in our infrastructure plans as we move forward to implement these necessary/mandated improvements. The corresponding revenue strategies to fund these improvements were also presented and later approved at the following Council meeting.

The results from our 2014 Audit continued the trend that we have seen over the past 8 years and once again provided great news. Isanti's per capita taxes are 30% less and our spending is 15% less than our peer group of cities. Administration cost, which is the cost associated with managing our City operations, is 39% less than our peer group of cities as well. I am especially proud of this number as it reflects cost we truly control. Many city operations are state mandated and lead to higher taxes or fees that we all do not like. The administrative cost of managing these activities is an area where I have stressed constant improvements and flexibility. As an organization, the City of Isanti will constantly strive for operational improvements and will continue to look for efficiencies. We have made significant investments (within our budget) to provide for long term capital improvements such as infrastructure to maintain a high standard.

Isanti will be making a few changes regarding Public Safety. We have hired a Police Investigator to help solve crimes and get our patrol officers back on the street in order to operate as efficiently and effectively as possible. This change will benefit all residents and businesses in Isanti. The City will continue to receive fire protection from the Isanti Fire District, although our tax levy will directly reflect the increases or decreases in their charges for services. Since 2006 the City has hidden the 10% average yearly increase in cost by cutting other department budgets to make up the difference. The City can no longer afford to do that. It is our City's responsibility to be to be as transparent as possible to reflect our true operating cost.

# Are you cleaning up after your pet?

It is your responsibility as a pet owner to clean up after your pet. When taking your pet for a walk, please show courtesy to other public and private owners by removing the excrement deposited by your pet. City Code 87-5.1 requires pet owners to immediately collect and remove dog feces deposited by their animal on public or private property. A container, equipment, or other device is required for transport of the fecal material to an appropriate disposal receptacle located on the property of the pet owner. Please help us in keeping our neighborhoods and public spaces clean and sanitary.

### Restrictive Watering Ban in Force

\*\*\*\*\*

City Code § 325-2 provides regulations for annual sprinkling restrictions. During the period from May 1 through September 1 annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on oddnumbered days only. All property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days only. During this time period, no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day. This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator should a water shortage exist. The City Administrator is authorized under City Code §325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod. To request an exemption please contact Rick Sames, Building Official. For a complete copy of the Code visit our website at www. cityofisanti.us

### **10-Year Pavement and Asset Management Plans**

At the April 21, 2015, meeting of the Isanti City Council, the 10-Year Pavement Management and Utility Asset Management plans, along with the Revenue Plan for funding these improvements, were approved.

#### **Pavement Management Plan**

In the spring of 2014, Isanti Public Works Staff went through the process of assessing the condition of all streets within the City of Isanti. Utilizing this information, City Engineer Bolten & Menk, Inc. prepared a report to assist the City with understanding the current condition of the streets, as well as a recommendation for pavement management over the next 10 years. Pavement Management is an essential part of extending the life of the existing pavement and reducing long-term pavement rehabilitation costs. The City of Isanti has over 31 miles of paved streets, all of which are currently in need of some type of maintenance. The last time maintenance activities were performed in the City of Isanti was 2009.

Through the pavement assessment process, each street within the City was given a rating that corresponds to a recommended maintenance activity (i.e. Seal Coat, Mill & Overlay, and Full Depth Reconstruction). The rating system allows for prioritization of repairs and ensures the maintenance practices performed are the most cost effec-

tive. Over 85% of the streets within the City of Isanti have a condition rating equal to or greater than 5. This rating indicates that the majority of the City streets have pavement life remaining that can be preserved or extended.

Annual maintenance activities are costly; however, crack sealing and seal coating activities extend the useful life of the streets and decreases the need for more costly full depth reconstruction activities. The cost per lineal foot of a typical 36-ft wide street is \$9 for seal coating activities compared to \$253 for full depth reconstruction.

The 10-Year Pavement Management Plan cost is projected at \$9,252,163. MSA (Municipal State Aid) funds will be utilized to pay for \$2,367,663 of the total cost; however, this leaves \$6,884,499 to be paid by the City

over the next 10 years. In order to fund the Pavement Management Plan, the City has reveiwed several potentional funding sources. The Revenue Plan approved by the Isanti City Council at its April 21, 2015, meeting includes Local Government Aid dedicated to streets, a Franchise Fee imposed on Utility Providers for use of the Public Right of Way, Special Assessments, and a General Fund Tax Levy. The first year of the plan, 2015, includes plans to Mill & Overlay 1st Avenue north of Heritage Blvd to Bluebird Park, as well as Seal Coating activities in the Rum River Landing Phase 1 & 2 Subdivisions. The next phase of Reconstruction includes

Nina Street SW and Palomino Road SE. The Pavement Management Plan in its entirety, including maps detailing the 10-year Maintenance and Reconstruction Areas, can be found on the City of Isanti's website.

#### Asset Management Plan

The City of Isanti has developed a comprehensive Asset Management Plan to ensure the long term sustainability of the City's water and wastewater infrastructure. The plan provided for the following:

- o Defining a level of service
- o Preparing an inventory of assets, including replacement dates and costs
- o Determining critical assets
- o Developing long-term capital improvement plans for replacing and adding critical assets
- o Reviewing alternatives for asset replacement and expansion
- o Developing long-range financing plans

## 10-Year Pavement and Asset Management Plans (continued)

The Asset Management Plan positions anticipated long-term needs for replacement of current equipment, upcoming needs, and system redundancy. Providing a long-term plan for the management of the City's infrastructure assets ensures the City of Isanti can provide financing for the long-term needs of the facilities while providing the lowest costs possible. The Asset Management Plan is intended to be a working document that will be continually updated to meet upcoming industry standards and adjusted real world equipment needs. It will also ensure that the City of Isanti will be prepared for upcoming State and Federal regulatory requirements that drive much of the needs required by those systems. The ultimate goal of the Asset Management Plan will be to provide for the lowest cost potable water and wastewater service, while providing for the long-term needs of the systems that provide that service. Through the utilization of these long-term maintenance mechanisms, the City can plan financially for the future and provide the best service possible for the residents and business owners in the City of Isanti.

The City of Isanti Water Treatment Facility was built in 2008. The existing structures and equipment appear to be in good condition and the existing wells have adequate capacity to meet the current needs of the City. The Water Treatment Facility Capital Improvement Plan for

the next 10 years provides for an additional Chlorine Generation System, in addition to rebuilding the Filter Underdrains.

The City of Isanti Wastewater Treatment Facility was built in 1996 and a new screening system was added in 2006; however, a majority of the facility has not seen renovation or rehabilitation; there-

fore, some of the infrastructure requires immediate attention. The 2015 Wastewater Improvements include replacement of the Main Lift Station, Construction of a New Pretreatment Facility, Aeration Blower Replacement, Aeration Diffuser Replacement, and Filter Rehabilitation at a cost of \$2.9M. Assuming annual preventative maintenance is followed, at a cost of \$20K per year, the 2015 improvements are expected to take the City of Isanti into the next decade. The Asset Management Plan, in its entirety, can be viewed on the City of Isanti's website.

## 2015 Budget Process

City Staff began working on the 2016 budget in early May as individual departments began determining their expected expenditures for next year.

spring and summer lead to warm weather; and garage sale events. City staff has received many inquiries regarding regulations for garage sales. Garage sales are permitted within each of the residential zoning districts; however, there are rules that have been established with regards to the duration, signage, and number of events; which include the following:

 The number of sales permitted per individual property is not to exceed four (4) per year.

• The duration of a garage sale is not to exceed three (3) consecutive days.

• Any related signage shall be limited to the premises and to other residential property provided that the property owner's permission has been obtained to display such signage, shall conform to the sign ordinance, and shall be removed at the termination of the sale.

#### New Commercial and Industrial Construction in Isanti

The landscape in the City of Isanti has recently changed and more changes are on the horizon. The newly constructed 75,000 square foot Isanti Indoor Arena – Home of Rum River BMX opened this spring. Rum River BMX Association has hosted the State Finals (2009, 2010, 2012, and 2014) and Nationals (2009, 2010 and 2013) here in Isanti. This project is estimated to bring 80,000 participants and spectators to town an-

nually. WillowBridge Center, along with the Green Table Café, has fully opened as well, offering the residents of Isanti and surrounding area more salon and

spa alternatives along with healthy foods, smoothies and a great cup of coffee. Family Dollar has communicated an opening date of July 2 to the City. Bow Daddy Archery Pro Shop and Range has submitted plans to come to Isanti in July 2015. This new business will be located at 801 Hwy 65, Isanti MN 55040 just south of the John Deere dealership. This full service archery pro shop will service any bow brand, sell compound bows, traditional equipment, and crossbows and offer a large indoor shooting range along with a TechnoHunt simulator. Techno-Hunt, Spot, and Youth leagues will be starting soon! Please check out www.bowdaddyarchery.com for further details. It's exciting to see the retail and recreational sectors of Isanti growing.

Plans have been submitted for two new industrial expansions in 2015. Granger Machine, a precision machine shop which has called Isanti home since 1998, has plans for an expansion of 2,000 square feet this summer. Lexington Textiles, a laundry supply company providing a variety of custom bags, slings, carts, and laundry accessories, built their original facility in 2003 and has submitted plans to construct a 6,000 square foot addition to provide space for their growing business. There are additional commercial and industrial prospects that the City is working with that would be great additions to the community. Stay tuned.

#### Housing Market in Isanti Positive

As of May 18, 2015, 15 new single family housing permits have been pulled. In 2014, 38 housing permits were pulled and this year has started off faster than last. The momentum that was built in 2013-2014 has continued and Isanti is in a great position to continue to grow with approximately 300 platted lots remaining. More housing projects, including multi-unit products are on the horizon for Isanti in 2015. Stabile growth in this market will add to the appeal of Isanti to businesses looking to expand operations or enter new markets.

### Eighth Annual Mayor's Employer Celebration Day – June 16, 2015

The Mayor's Employer Celebration Day will be held June 16, 2015 from 11:30-1:00 at Isanti City Hall. This event is held to recognize Isanti businesses and their role in making our community a great place to live and work. 2015 milestone anniversaries (Years in Isanti) for area businesses include: Strike Funeral Home (50), Elaine's Flowers (50), Isanti Maytag Laundry (20), Sanbrook Golf Club (20), Boeke's Woodshop (10), Community Pride Bank (10), Dance Dynamics (10), Diamond Welding (10), Lil Sprout Child Care Center (10), Demorie Alterations (5), HME Products (5), Stellar Enterprises (5), Water Works Manufacturing (5). Greetings All...I hope you have enjoyed our early Spring and warm weather.

The Isanti Police Department will again offer ATV Youth Safety Classes this year. We certified 63 youth at our April 18th class and will be offering two more class sessions beginning Saturday, August 15 and October 10, 2015. All classes and riding sessions will be held at the Isanti Community Center. There is a training CD that each student will need for the class and that can be obtained by going to the Police Department or by contacting the MnDNR at 1-888-646-6367, 651-296-6157, or 800-366-8917. You can request a CD through email by writing to info.dnr.@state.mn.us. Registrants must be age 11 or older to take the class. Youth age 11, cannot receive their certificate until their 12th birthday. There is a \$10.00 fee for the class.

Any person operating an ATV in Minnesota born after July 1, 1987 must possess an ATV safety certificate in order to operate an ATV on public lands, trails or waterways (obviously when frozen). If you have any questions regarding ATV operating regulations you can stop at the Police Department to pick up a DNR rules and regulations booklet.

The City Council of Isanti has passed an ordinance that allows class 1 ATV's and golf carts to be driven on municipal streets under certain restrictions. A city ATV permit and application can be obtained at the police department. The permit sticker costs \$25.00 per year.

The summer Safe and Sober Grant season is upon us and the department received another federal grant for enhanced enforcement for the use of seatbelts andchild seats / restraints.

Do not forget about the three upcoming streets dances held downtown on June 27th, July 18th and August 15th. These are great community events. Just a reminder, no outside alcohol allowed in the street dance area.

National Night Out will be held August 4th, 2015 at the Isanti Community Center, just north of City Hall on 1st Ave NW. Quality grilled hot dogs will be provided along with condiments. There will be root-beer floats provided and served compliments of the Chief of Police. This is a pot-luck event so please bring a dish, desert or treats to share with the community. There will be fun family game events, a kids coloring contest, an air bounce house and many more fun events. ### **Building Department**

In the spring of 2015, the State of MN. adopted a new version of the State Residential, Mechanical, and Energy Code and they are currently in the process of also adopting a new version of State Commercial Code. These new codes may or may not affect the way in which you construct your next project and so if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to give my office a call to discuss it.

**Sand point wells** – continue to be a popular "non-potable" water alternative. Please be advised that these wells are required to be licensed through the Minnesota Department of Health. And must be sealed by a license well driller when they are vacated. The City of Isanti also requests that you inform them when you are installing one or vacating one.

**Swimming pools**-with a depth capacity over 24 inches and a volume capacity over 5000 gallons require a permit.

**Fire Pits**- can be an enjoyable part of a summer evening. The State Fire Marshall requirements are as follows, a fire ring with a maximum of 3 feet in circumference, maximum flame height of 3 feet, and a separation of 25 feet to a combustible structure. For combustibles, along with garages and primary residences think cedar fence, trees, play houses, etc.

### Building Department Staff Update

The City hired part-time Building Inspector, Nick Henly, in February. Nick will be training with Building Official Rick Sames. Nick will begin taking on some of inspections, permits and plan reviews. Our Code Enforcement / Zoning Technician, Sean Stevens, has obtained his Permit Technician Certification to help in reviewing and approving fixed fee permits as well.

### Weed and Grass Nuisances

City of Isanti would like to bring your attention to City Code Chapter 216 Nuisances; and the fines associated with violation of these provisions. All noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are prohibited within the City of Isanti. After seven (7) calendar days notice by the City, the Public Works Director shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises. ## Seasonal Tips from Isanti's Safety Committee

#### **BICYCLE SAFETY**

Many injuries happen in driveways, on sidewalks, and on bike paths, not just on streets and wearing proper safety equipment can minimize the risk of serious injuries. Protective gear must be worn whenever you or your children are on bicycles, scooters, skates, rollerblades, skateboards and more! Be sure the right type of helmet is being used. When purchasing a helmet, look for a label or sticker that says the helmet meets the CPSC safety standard. And if the gear doesn't fit, don't buy it—sizing matters!

#### **FIREWORKS SAFETY**

Fireworks can cause severe burns, disfiguration, and possible death. Fireworks that are often thought to be safe, such as sparklers, can reach temperatures above 1000 degrees Fahrenheit. The greatest recommendation for fireworks safety is to watch a public fireworks display coordinated by professionals.

#### WATER SAFETY

Two to three children die every day as a result of drowning. Teach kids to swim. Formal swimming lessons can protect young children from drowning. Parents, learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).
