

I hope everyone is enjoying our wonderful Isanti weather. Our Community Garden, located at River Bluff Preserve, is ready for its second year of operation. It was fun to talk to so many people and get great advice as I was working my two plots last year. I hope we have even more this year. We have issued 31 new single family house permits to date. We are nearly halfway to the 2016 total of 63. We celebrated the Grand Opening of Allina Health's Next Generation Clinic in Isanti with over 400 people in attendance taking tours and learning about the facility. O'Reilly has begun construction just south of the Next Generation Coborn's Grocery Store. We recently approved the Arts & Science Academy's new Middle School which will continue our City's diverse educational options. We have a traditional public school, a year-round public school option, a charter school and a Catholic school in our great City.

I want to remind everyone of all the fun activities we have in Isanti. The Redbirds provide great baseball at Sportsman's field. Rum River BMX races weekly at Isanti Indoor Arena – the Nation's number 1 track. Our Farmers' Market has moved to its new location along Heritage BLVD providing great fresh food all summer long. Our Street Dances draw thousands to Downtown Isanti throughout the summer along with Rum River Rods Classic Car shows. We are home to regional soccer at our Isanti Soccer Complex – second largest in the state. August 12th is our Celebrate Isanti Day with a Family Bike Ride, 5k Run/Walk, Kid's Festival, Rum River Rod's Summer Spectacular Car Show, Craft Fair and all capped off with Jonah and the Whales Street Dance. Our Park & Trail System is a crown jewel to our Community. All of these great options are free to the public.

There is some great information in this Isantian Issue regarding how to keep informed about what the City Council is doing and how to address your questions, comments or concerns to the Council. Also our Rain Garden Incentive Program and many other highlights are shared. We are Celebrating the 10th Annual Mayor's Employer Celebration Luncheon June 6th. I first began this tradition to honor our Employers and their Employees who bring so much economic vitality to Isanti. It continues to grow and flourish each year as our City grows. It is a great event that brings together businesses that have been in Isanti a hundred years with those just starting. I want to thank all those who attend each year and share their stories with me and each other. I will give a brief update on how we are doing as a City and what new projects we have been developing.

The first phase of our 10 Year Pavement Management Plan starts this year with the Palomino Road Project. Our entire road & trail system has been rated to determine which areas need improvements most. We are also doing improvements along 1st just north of Main St to the curb and sidewalk area. We also have our normal crack sealing/seal coating as well. The new pretreatment facility at our waste water plant will also be completed this summer. Keeping up on infrastructure projects each year helps to reduce the overall cost.

RESTRICTIVE WATERING BAN IN FORCE

City Code § 325-2 provides regulations for annual sprinkling restrictions. During the period of May 1 through September 1 annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on odd-numbered days, and property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days. During this time period, no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day.

This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator should a water shortage exist. The City Administrator is authorized under City Code §325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new construction property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod. To request an exemption please contact Nick Henly, Building Official. For a complete copy of the Code visit our website at www.cityofisanti.us.

Administration Department

The Administration Department is staffed by the City Administrator, Human Resources/City Clerk, and an Administrative Data Clerk. The Department is responsible for a wide range of duties, which include:

- •Providing day to day administration over all City Departments. Assisting department heads with projects, policy development and as needed assist in their absence with department administration.
- •Administration of Human Resources which includes: recruitments, employee relations, employee health benefits & wellness, pay equity, and safety programs.
- Development and drafting of procedures, policies, and programs to improve the health, safety, and welfare of the City, as well as responses to organizational needs and governmental mandates.
- •Coordination with department heads and staff to administer community development programs, assistance with planning and development matters as well as financial matters and budget preparation.
- •Processing of any licensing programs including: alcohol, gambling, pawn shop, peddler/solicitor, etc.
- Coordinates consultant services and assists with projects, as necessary.
- Executes governmental functions as City Clerk, as required by State Statute (Plan A).
- Keeps all records and filings of municipal documents and records.
- Administration of elections.
- Responsible for City overall insurance programs, claims, and administration.
- Website administration.

The duties and responsibilities assigned to those in the Administration Department require a broad knowledge and skill set. Don Lorsung, City Administrator, has earned a Bachelor's Degree in History from Minnesota State University – Moorhead and a Master's Degree in Urban and Regional Studies from Minnesota State University – Mankato. Mr. Lorsung is a long-term member of ICMA and the American Planning Association. He is a Credentialed Manager through the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). Mr. Lorsung has over 32 years of experience in local government management in Minnesota and lowa; he has been with the City of Isanti for over 11 years.

Lindsey Giese, Human Resources/City Clerk, has earned a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Wisconsin – Stout in Retail Management with double minors in Human Resources and Business. Mrs. Giese worked as a Human Resource Generalist in a previous public sector position. She is currently working towards obtaining her Professional in Human Resources (PHR) Certification as well as becoming a Certified Municipal Clerk (CMC). Mrs. Giese has been working with the City in the capacity of Human Resource/City Clerk for over one year.

At the time of printing, the part time Administrative Data Clerk position is vacant. However, the part time Administrative Data Clerk reports to the Human Resources/City Clerk and facilitates the processing and organization of city documents and assists in minor human resource functions of the City.

Common Questions for the Administration Department

I'm hosting a raffle; do I need a permit?

Yes. According to City Code, Chapter 178: Gambling, lawful gambling is permitted within the City provided that it is conducted in accordance with State Statutes. Any organization seeking to obtain a permit should file an application with the City Clerk. Applications should be submitted at least 30 days prior to the date the gambling/raffle is expected to be conducted. Applications for a Local or Exempt Gambling Permit can be found on the City website.

I have my own business, and I am interested in door to door sales. Do I need approval? In an effort to keep the residents of Isanti safe, all peddlers, solicitors and transient merchants are required to obtain a license prior to attempting any sales. The individual intending to solicit or peddle a product must complete an application which is to be submitted to the City Clerk. In addition, the individual must provide authorization for a background check, two head-and-shoulders

photographs (to be used for an identification badge) and a copy of documentation that connects the individual to the company/organization (i.e.: a business card), and any applicable fee. Applications can be found on the City website.

I've never attended a City Council meeting, when I arrive what should I do?



The schedule for a Council meeting is shown on the "agenda". An agenda is simply a list of items of business to be considered at a meeting. Copies of the agenda are available at the entrance to the Council Chambers at the time of the meetings. Persons wishing to have an item considered by the Council must contact the office of the City Clerk before 12:00 p.m. on the Wednesday prior to the meeting date. It is necessary that

requests be made in writing. The written requests are forwarded to the members of the Council by the City Staff, thus allowing for more detailed study and review by the Council prior to the meeting.

When I am at a meeting, and want to address the City Council what should I do?

Persons wishing to address the Council on a subject which appears on the agenda must wait until the item is discussed by the Council. The procedure for consideration of an agenda item is (1) staff presentation; (2) presentations by petitioner or advisory bodies (if required); (3) Council motion and second to place the matter on the floor; (4) Council questions of staff and/or advisory body reports and discussion; (5) presentations from the audience; and (6) Council decision. No discussion of an item is allowed by the Mayor, Council, or members of the audience until the matter has been placed on the floor.

- 1. An individual wishing to address the Council should stand, wait to be acknowledged by the Mayor to speak, and state his or her name and address before speaking.
- 2. All remarks should be directed to the Mayor rather than to any individual Councilmember or to administrative staff. The Mayor may wish to refer any questions to the proper Councilmember, City Administrator or other appropriate staff.
- 3. To avoid confusion, only one person may have the floor (speak) at any one time. The Mayor is responsible for determining who has this privilege.
- 4. In order to facilitate matters and permit all of those who wish to express themselves to do so, presentations are limited to three minutes except at official public hearings. Groups are encouraged to speak through a single spokes-person rather than individually.

Want to stay up to date on what the City Council is discussing at meetings, but unable to attend?

The City Clerk posts recorded audio of City Council meetings onto the City website following regularly scheduled meetings; www.cityofisanti.us/govt/listentocouncilmeetings. You can also subscribe to newsblasts to be informed when City Council Agendas are posted, or when the City Council has approved the Minutes from previous meetings. Skateboarding, Scooter & Bike Safety Tips

- •All skateboarders and scooter-riders should wear protective gear; helmets are particularly important.
- Riders should never skate alone. Children under the age of 8 should be closely supervised.
- When purchasing a helmet, look for a label or sticker that says the helmet meets the CPSC safety standard.
- •A helmet should be worn so that it is level on the head and covers the forehead, not tipped forward or backward. The strap should be securely fastened with about 2 fingers able to fit between the chin and strap. The helmet should be snug on the head, but not overly tight.

ARE YOU CLEANING UP AFTER YOUR PET?

It is your responsibility as a pet owner to clean-up after your pet. When taking your pet for a walk, please show courtesy to other public and private property owners by removing the excrement deposited by your pet. City Code 87-5.1 requires pet owners to immediately collect and remove dog feces deposited by their animal on public or private property. A container, equipment, or other device is required for transport of the fecal material to an appropriate disposal receptacle located on the property of the pet owner. Please help us in keeping our neighborhoods and public spaces clean and sanitary.

Building and Zoning codes provide very important safeguards and standards to protect us from disaster due to fire, structural failure, deterioration, weather, and natural disasters- to name just a few. A permit application, plan review process, and required inspections help officials to ensure that construction and projects comply with the minimum requirements of MN State Building Codes and city zoning ordinances. Managing Stormwater on your Property this Spring

Stormwater runoff can come from rain water, snow melt, or other precipitation that runs off the land and eventually enters our public waterways. With spring weather comes an increase in stormwater runoff and an opportunity to improve your lawn and garden's health for the summer months ahead. Here are some tips to consider:

•Install a rain garden: Rain Gardens capture and filter stormwater runoff using native flowers, grasses, and shrubs. They make an attractive landscaping feature and provide benefits to the environment. The City of Isanti is currently accepting applications for its Rain Garden Incentive Program. Applications are available online at http://www.cityofisanti.us/resident/rain-garden-incentive-program or can be picked up at City Hall. Program participants will be given tools for planning and implementing rain gardens on their property, and approved applicants will be reimbursed 50% of the cost, up to \$500, for plants, soil, and other supplies to get the garden started. Application Deadline Extended to June 30, 2017!

•Plant a native tree or shrub: Native plans have deep root systems that help to absorb stormwater. As an added bonus, native plants require less water to stay healthy during the hot summer months while being cold hardy as well.

•Install a rain barrel: Rain barrels store rainwater until you want it later. This reduces runoff from your property and conserves drinking water. Also, rainwater is healthier for your plants than tap water. It is highly oxygenated, free of the salts, inorganic ions, and fluoride compounds contained in tap water that can accumulate in the soil over time. And, rain barrels are not subject to the City's lawn watering restrictions if one is implemented.

•Let your lawn get a little longer: Grass has about the same depth of roots as shows above the ground. By using a higher setting on your lawn mower you are encouraging your lawn to have deeper roots. These roots take up rainwater and store it in your lawn. This decreases the amount of stormwater runoff. Your lawn will also be healthier and stand the wet dry cycles of Minnesota weather with less lawn watering and chemicals.

•Take your lawn clippings and leaves to the City Compost Site: Yard waste that gets into our lakes and streams can lead to fish kills and algae blooms. If you need to dispose of lawn clippings and leaves, consider taking them to the City compost site located at the Public Works Garage at 100 Isanti Parkway West. The Compost Site is open Sunday noon-5pm and on Tuesday and Thursday from 1-7pm.









RAIN GARDEN INCENTIVE PROGRAM

The City of Isanti views rain gardens as a great tool for responsibly managing stormwater. Application materials will guide residents through the planning and implementation process. Application available on cityofisanti.us and at City Hall.

The deadline to apply for the reimbursement program has been extended to June 30!



TORNADO WARNING

Ever wonder exactly what it takes for the sirens to sound?

- •The National Weather Service issues a Tornado Warning for a specific area.
- •That tornado warning is sent via teletype to the emergency dispatch centers in the effected area.
- Once received, the tornado warning sirens are activated by the emergency communications center to warn the public.
- •Once the sirens are activated, citizens should turn to their source of gathering severe weather information such as a weather radio, TV, internet sources, etc.
- Calls to the emergency dispatch centers should be avoided due to overwhelming the call center and hindering access for real emergencies.
- •Sirens typically will not go off again until the warning period has expired. If they do, it is due to an imminent threat, an extension of the warning, or at the request of a law enforcement officer.

WEED AND GRASS NUISANCES

City of Isanti would like to bring your attention to City Code Chapter 216 Nuisances and the fines associated with violation of these provisions. All noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are prohibited within the City of Isanti. After seven (7) calendar days notice by the City, the Code Enforcement / Zoning Technician shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises. The costs associated with this are billed on a time spent basis. A \$25.00 non-compliance fee is charged in addition to the cost. We are excited to announce 4 new members responding out of our Station 1 in the City of Isanti; Cassie Higgins, Kevin Carlson, George Eifert, Cliff Hanson and from our Station 2 substation Tim Mills. Welcome aboard all!



We have had a busy year thus far with a 13% increase in department runs from this time last year. Our current run volume in the City is at 139 runs with a 3-minute response time average compared to 123 last year with a 4-minute response time average. Recently, additional focus has been placed on our presence at medical emergencies, which accounts for 75% of our current call volume in the City limits. These efforts focus on efficiencies on our equipment side, and more in depth medical training for the Firefighters.

July 7-8-9 will be the 41st Annual Isanti Firefighters Professional Rodeo in Isanti. Feel free to stop by the fire truck and say hi to our guys and gals hosting the trucks at several different Jubilee

Summer 2017 Street Improvement Projects

1st Avenue Sidewalk & Curb Replacement

This project includes removal and replacement of all concrete sidewalk and curb along the east side of 1st Avenue from Main Street to the City Hall Entrance. It also includes the replacement of some concrete sidewalk at the entrance to City Hall.

The City of Isanti has awarded this project to Innovative Concrete Solutions. This project is anticipated to begin in late July and take approximately 3 weeks to complete.

While work is being performed at the City Hall entrance, access to City Hall will be provided on the south side of the building. Access will be maintained to the front entrance of Isanti Retail Meats throughout the project.

2017 Pavement Management Project

This project will include crack filling the pavement in the following developments and roadways: Villages on the Rum 1st-5th Additions, Hillock Court, 3rd Avenue N, Unity Boulevard, W Dual Boulevard and Enterprise Avenue. The project will also include crack filling and sealcoating the following developments and roadways: Hillock West Phase 1 and 2, Whiskey Road, Isanti Parkway, E Dual Boulevard, Cajima Street and South Passage

The City of Isanti has awarded this project to ASTECH Corporation. This project is anticipated to take approximately 2-3 weeks to complete.

The Contractor will begin by patching the existing street where it is in a failed condition. Once this is complete, the contractor will clean out open cracks and fill them with a hot mix bituminous mastic product to prevent water from entering the road subgrade.

Those areas designated for a sealcoat will then get an oil tack coat spray and granite chips spread over the roadway surface. Within the following days the contractor will return to sweep up loose chips.

The streets will be posted "no parking" in advance of each segment of work. Please do not park on these street when posted.

Access will be maintained to all residences and businesses along the project.

2017 Palomino Road Improvements

This project includes replacement of the pavement from Railroad Avenue to Highway 65. The project also includes construction of a new 5-foot concrete sidewalk along the north side of the road. The curb and gutter will be replaced where needed and the watermain will be replaced along the project.

This project is anticipated to begin in late summer and take approximately 6-8 weeks to complete.

The roadway will be closed to thru traffic during this project, but access will be provided to residents throughout the project.

GARAGE SALE REGULATIONS

Spring and summer lead to warm weather and garage sale events. Garage sales are permitted within each of the residential zoning districts; however, there are rules that have been established with regards to the duration, signage, and number of events; which include the following:

- •The number of sales permitted per individual property is not to exceed four (4) per year.
- •A single garage sale is not to exceed three (3) consecutive days.
- •Any related signage shall be limited to the premises and to other residential property provided that the property owner's permission has been obtained to display such signage, and signage shall conform to the sign ordinance and shall be removed at the termination of the sale.
