We have a great summer ahead of us. I want to announce a new program I created that partners with the six schools located in the City of Isanti, known as Painting Plow Blades. City staff will clean-up our City plow blades and drop one at each of the schools where teachers incorporate painting them into their Arts Program. We will display the plow blades at our Celebrate Isanti Day on August 11. I am excited to see what the students will create! Make sure you check the Community Event section on page 11 to see all the great activities that are available this summer. Please do not forget that Redbirds Baseball games, soccer games, and BMX races are all free to the public to attend.

We are hosting the 11th Annual Mayor's Employer Celebration Day on June 19. On this day, we take time to celebrate all of our Employers and Employees in the City and their great contributions. We have increased total net employment in the City from 1,377 in 2009 to 1,928 in 2017; while increasing total net businesses from 123 to 182.

We have experienced significant growth in our City the past couple of years. This has raised questions regarding what will happen when growth slows down again. This is an excellent question, considering the boom of the early 2000s and the recession that followed. The City at that time made several unfortunate decisions that caused significant economic pain when the recession hit. The City had taken on a significant amount of debt and did not charge adequate developer fees to cover costs. This lead to total net debt ballooning to \$9.1 million. This was a crushing amount of debt for a City our size. Another financial planning decision made was to base their decision on 130 new homes being constructed each year for 10 years. This inflated number lead to irresponsible decision making including large increases in spending and staffing. Another legacy cost was the inadequate, and in some cases, no capital replacement budgets to repair/replace City infrastructure. When the recession hit with the collapse of the housing market Isanti suffered the consequences.

When I was first elected Mayor, cuts were made to address the financial issues the City was facing. There were staff cuts as well as cuts in spending and difficult Union negotiations occurred to share more healthcare benefits cost so we could conserve cash and start paying down debt. I created our Development Impact List, Long Term Financial Plan, Long Term Infrastructure plan and 5 Year Cash Flow Analysis Tool. We are now basing our residential fiscal impact plans on 25 home starts per year. In the last four years, we have had 233 total home starts. This is equivalent to 9.3 years of financial benefit. This helps protect the City when construction slows down and allows us to keep moving Isanti forward. We were able to use these tools, and along with tough decisions, are able to make the following improvements:

- Per Capita Income increased 77%
- Median Household Income increased 54%
- Median House Value is \$35,550 higher than neighboring communities
- Cut net debt from \$9.1 million to \$2.9 million, since being elected Mayor
- Improved City Credit Rating from Baa1 (one step above Junk/Speculative rating) to AA+ or High Quality
- 48% net increase in total number of businesses
- Local jobs increased by 40%, since being elected Mayor
- Received multiple Business Recruitment Awards from the Minnesota Economic Development Association
- Cut Sewer Base Fee 50%
- Cut Water Base fee 25%
- Cut SAC/WAC fees \$2,500
- Cut property tax rate 7% in 2018
- Proposed City Property Tax cut of 10% for 2019
- Isanti named 6th Safest City in Minnesota (out of 853 cities)
- Added Patrol Officer and Police Investigator positions and Police Bike Patrol
- Isanti School Resource Officer named #1 in the State
- · Improved Police equipment and technology
- Won Drinking Water Quality Award
- Won Blue Star Award for Protecting and Preserving Minnesota's Water Resources
- Fit City Designation
- Green Step City

These improvements show that Isanti has overcome the obstacles of the past, and is now on a successful path moving forward. We truly are a "Community for Generations" and there is no better place to work, live or recreate than the City of Isanti.

RESTRICTIVE WATERING BAN IN FORCE

City Code § 325-2 provides regulations for annual sprinkling restrictions. During the period from May 1 through September 1 annually, all property with addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled on odd-numbered days, and property with addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled on even-numbered days. During this time period, no sprinkling shall be allowed from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day.

This provision shall automatically apply unless superseded by action of the City Administrator should a water shortage exist. The City Administrator is authorized under City Code §325-1 to restrict the sprinkling of lawns by posting a notice at City Hall setting forth the restrictions.

A new property owner may request an exemption of the restrictions for the sprinkling of new sod. To request an exemption please contact City Hall. For a complete copy of the Code visit our website at www.cityofisanti.us.

Parks, Recreation, and Culture Department

The Parks, Recreation, and Culture (PRC) Department is staffed by Katie Everett, the Parks, Recreation, and Culture Manager. Everett has been on staff with the City of Isanti since September 2015, and is responsible for ensuring the City's standards are maintained at each of its park facilities, coordinating City events and programs, and working with residents and local organizations throughout the year. The PRC Department works closely with Isanti Public Works to perform the majority of park maintenance and repair projects in-house. Some specialized and larger-scope projects may be contracted out as needed, but most of the work to keep our facilities in top shape is done by City staff - make sure to wave at the lawn mowers this summer! Because of the growing needs of the department in the summer months, PRC will also include a summer intern, Bree Erickson, in 2018.

Park Facilities

The City manages over 160 acres of parkland and over 29 miles of trails and walkways. Isanti's residents have access to eleven (11) City-owned parks, as well as a Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) boat launch, and Sanbrook Golf Course all within City limits. Isanti has a variety of park facilities to serve the diverse needs of its growing population. Park options include: neighborhood playgrounds, tennis and basketball courts, a skate park, a soccer complex, an indoor BMX arena, a community garden, natural spaces with walking trails, and more.

Featured Parks



Bluebird Park – 201 Isanti Parkway NW

A 65-acre park which includes the Isanti Soccer Complex (managed by the Cambridge-Isanti Soccer Club), the Isanti Indoor Arena (Home of Rum River BMX), a playground, skate park, pavilion, basketball court, and green space. The south end of the 3-mile Cambridge-Isanti Bike/Walk Trail is also located inside Bluebird Park.

River Bluff Preserve – 1111 Rum River Drive SW

A 38-acre park on the Rum River, River Bluff Preserve is a place to escape to nature inside the City. Since its development in 2016, the park has become a favorite for residents in the area. River Bluff offers natural turf trails that connect north to Martin's Landing and a dock with benches for fishing right on the river. The park is also home to the Isanti Community Garden.





Mattson Park – 311 5th Ave NW

Conveniently located on Heritage Blvd and 5th Ave NW, Mattson Park is a great family destination. The park includes a playground, pavilion, horseshoe pits, tennis courts, and a basketball court. The tennis courts will be resurfaced early this summer!

Reservations



Each of the City's park pavilions, as well as athletic amenities (tennis courts and Unity ballfield), are available for reservation. Pavilions are free for City residents to reserve, and just \$10 for non-residents. Tennis Court and ballfield rates vary. Reservation applications and rates can be found on the City's website.

Also available for reservation is the Isanti Community Center (ICC). The ICC is a high demand destination for a wide variety of gatherings from bridal showers and birthday parties to memorial

services, weddings, and more. The City views the Community Center as an important amenity for its residents and the surrounding community, and therefore strives to offer rates that keep the

facility accessible to all, while remaining financially responsible. Discounted rates are available for non-profit groups. Check availability and download an application online at cityofisanti.us, or call City Hall at 763-444-5512.

Programs and Events

The City of Isanti is also proud to offer its residents a wide variety of opportunities to learn, be active, and gather as a community throughout the year. Over the last several years, the PRC Department has developed year-round family programs, revived Downtown Isanti Street Dances, opened a Community Garden, and relocated the Farmers' Market. The City works to continue offering relevant opportunities that benefit our residents and the wider community. Many programs are offered free to Isanti residents. Some program highlights are below, and all program information is available online at our website and facebook.com/IsantiEvents.

Isanti Community Garden

Located inside River Bluff Preserve, the Isanti Community Garden contains 60 - 10'x10' garden plots, raised beds, and educational areas reserved for partnerships with Isanti County Public Health and the Cambridge-Isanti Schools. Each season, plots are available to rent for a small fee (\$15 for ground plots), and each gardener has the opportunity to grow healthy foods alongside a great community. Garden tools, including hoses, are provided for gardeners.



Passport to Parks - Citywide Scavenger Hunt



In 2017, the City launched the Passport to Parks citywide scavenger hunt. The hunt will continue in 2018! Starting with a kick off event on June 21, Passports will be available for pick up at City Hall and download at cityofisanti.us. Passports bring participants to each of Isanti's parks and other important City landmarks. Completed

passports can be turned in at City Hall and redeemed for a prize; all passports with correct answers will be entered into a Grand Prize drawing which will take place August 11.

TORNADO WARNING

Ever wonder exactly what it takes for the sirens to sound?

- •The National Weather Service issues a Tornado Warning for a specific area.
- That tornado warning is sent via teletype to the emergency dispatch centers in the effected area.
- •Once received, the tornado warning sirens are activated by the emergency communications center to warn the public.
- •Once the sirens are activated, citizens should turn to their source of gathering severe weather information such as a weather radio, TV, internet sources, etc.
- Calls to the emergency dispatch centers should be avoided due to overwhelming the call center and hindering access for real emergencies.
- Sirens typically will not go off again until the warning period has expired. If they do, it is due to an imminent threat, an extension of the warning, or at the request of a law enforcement officer.



FIREWORKS FACTS - What Is Legal, and What Is Not??

Certain types of fireworks became legal in Minnesota in April of 2002. With the increase complaints about fireworks, the Police Department wants you to know these important facts:

What's Legal? Minnesota law permits the sale, possession and use of some non-explosive and non-aerial fireworks. Examples include sparklers, cones and tubes that emit sparks and novelty items like snakes and party poppers. These consumer fireworks may not be used on public property such as roads, alleys, schools and parks. Purchasers of these fireworks must be at least 18 years old.

What's Illegal? The law still prohibits explosive and aerial fireworks for public sale, possession and use. Minnesota State Statute 624.21 governs these items such as firecracker, bottle rockets, missiles, roman candles, mortars, and shells – any fireworks that are explosive and aerial.

Please comply with the fireworks law! Be a considerate neighbor! Not everyone enjoys them! Fireworks can be extremely frustrating for some neighbors, especially when homes are close to each other, when people are trying to sleep (shift workers) and when small children and pets are frightened. Fireworks can be very dangerous and a personal injury and structural fire risk.

Most Fireworks complaints are NOT 911 call worthy unless they are involving life safety. Increased calls to the 911 center for these types of non-life threatening complaints overburden the call centers and callers for true emergencies have longer wait times for their calls to be answered. Know your law enforcement agencies non-emergency number and use it for non-life threatening fireworks complaints.

Building and Engineering

Community Development & Building

After a long and snowy winter, the Community Development Department is ready for summer and what is normally the busiest time of the year for our staff! To help everyone enjoy this summer and to help continue to provide a clean, welcoming, and safe community, please take note of the following:

- <u>Decks</u> Almost all decks require a building permit and various inspections throughout the construction process.
- Sheds and Accessory Structures Sheds under 200 square feet require a zoning permit, and accessory structures over 200 square feet require a building permit. Proper placement on your property is key to ensure that drainage easements and proper setbacks are protected or met.
- <u>Fences</u> All fences require a zoning permit, and depending on placement on the property line, neighbor approval.

Finally, the warm weather and longer days make it a good time of year to review fire evacuation drills, tornado drills, etc. with your family. And while enjoying those summer night bonfires or BBQs, please remember to exercise caution, be aware of the rules for fires in your area, and be respectful of those who may be affected by the smoke, ashes, noise, etc. It is recommended that portable fire pits never be utilized within 30' of any combustible structures including your garage, deck, or shed.

Palomino Road Improvements

The Palomino Road Improvements project is planned to be comleted by June 22. Thank you for cooperation and patience with this project.

2018 Pavement Management Improvements

A 10-year pavement management program has been adopted in the City in order to extend the life of the City streets. This year, the following developments and roadways are scheduled to be seal coated:

- Villages on the Rum Developments: 1-5 Additions
- Hillock Court north of Heritage Boulevard
- 3rd Avenue N from Heritage Boulevard to Isanti Parkway
- Unity Boulevard from 3rd Avenue N to 1st Avenue N
- W Dual Blvd from Heritage Boulevard to E Dual Boulevard
- Enterprise Avenue south of Cajima Street.

Storm Sewer System Improvements

Stormwater ponds provide temporary water storage and flood protection. Their function also aids in improving water quality in stormwater runoff by capturing sediment and pollutants. These sediment and pollutants need to be removed periodically to maintain the storm sewer system.

The City was designated as a Municipal Separate Stormwater System (MS4) community in 2017 by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA). In order to comply with MS4 regulations, the City is required to perform regular inspections and routine maintenance to uphold the functions of the stormwater system.

Later this summer or fall, the City plans to begin a storm sewer system maintenance project in the southern region of the City. This is the beginning of a 7-year maintenance program that will complete a review of all storm ponds and aprons within the City.

WEED AND GRASS NUISANCES

City of Isanti would like to bring your attention to City Code Chapter 216 Nuisances and the fines associated with violation of these provisions. All noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property are prohibited within the City of Isanti. After seven (7) calendar days notice by the City, the Planner shall implement the mowing and removal of noxious weeds and vegetation on the private premises. The costs associated with this are billed on a timespent basis. A \$25.00 non-compliance fee is charged in addition to the cost. RAIN GARDEN INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Rain Gardens are great tools for managing stormwater and are a great landscaping addition! The City of Isanti has an incentive program to help property owners design and install rain gardens within City limits. Approved applicants will be reimbursed 50% of the installation costs, up to \$500. Program details and applications available online and at City

GARAGE SALE REGULATIONS

Spring and summer lead to warm weather and garage sale events. Garage sales are permitted within each of the residential zoning districts; however, there are rules that have been established with regards to the duration, signage, and number of events; which include the following:

•The number of sales permitted per individual property is not to exceed four (4) per year.



 A single garage sale is not to exceed three (3) consecutive days.



•Any related signage shall be limited to the premises and to other residential property provided that the property owner's permission has been obtained to display such signage, and signage shall conform to the sign ordinance and shall be removed at the termination of the sale.

Fire District

Greetings Isanti! Grilling season is here! With this wonderful season, the Fire Department sees an increasing trend of outdoor cooking fires. Statistically, July is the peak month for BBQ grill fires. To help offset the trend, and ensure your BBQ is not visited by big red trucks with flashing lights, please review our outdoor cooking tips!

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- Your grill should be placed away from your home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches. For safety purposes, let's "assume" you start a grease fire while grilling. Is it far enough away from combustibles to be considered safe?
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and from trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.
- If you have a fire on your grill, call us immediately! Early activation of the fire department is vital!

Charcoal Grills

- There are several ways to prepare the charcoal for use. For example, a charcoal chimney starter allows you to start your charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a charcoal fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the charcoal once it is lit.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources. Take a minute to share with your little ones the importance of your precautions!
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use a properly sized extension cord!
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Propane Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubbly test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the first department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do no move the grill. If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

BBQ season in Isanti is a reminder that it is also time for the Isanti Jubilee Days and the 42nd Annual Isanti Firefighters Rodeo! We hope you join us July 6th, 7th and at a special KiDs Day and Xtreme Bulls Competition on Sunday July 8th. WORLD CHAMPION professional bull riders right in your home town!

Summer Safety Tips

Beware of the "100 Deadliest Days"; The period between Memorial Day and Labor Day is the deadliest time for teen crashes on our roadways. Parents can play a role to help keep their new teen drivers safe. The first year of licensed driving is the most exciting and dangerous year of your teen's life. Car crashes are the number one killer of teens. In 2015 (most recent data) there were 3,327 teen motor vehicle deaths—more than homicide, more than suicide. If you have a teen driver you can help ensure their safety with these tips:

- Drive the way you want your teen to drive.
- Expect mistakes The only way to learn is to make mistakes, so accept this, be positive and try to help minimize risk when the mistakes happen. Praise correct driving.
- One of the biggest dangers for teen drivers: passengers. Make it clear that until they practice enough, teens can't have teen passengers. One of the highest risk driving situations for teens is to drive with other teens in the car.

Isanti Housing Market Continues to Surge

Single family housing construction continues to boom in Isanti. From 2015-2017, 196 housing permits were issued with 91 coming in 2017. 2018 has continued to show strong growth with 26 permits pulled with an additional 11 in process as of early May. Data from actual sales in regional markets from the Minneapolis Realtors Association shows that the City of Isanti is more than holding its own with the Cambridge Market which is great news for the whole region. The City of Isanti continues to leverage a housing study conducted by Maxfield Research in 2015 to work on filling the senior and residential housing needs for the community. City Staff has estimated our current population to be approaching 6,000 which is the highest it has ever been, and Isanti is positioned well to grow responsibly through the next decade.

Alling Health

Helping your overweight pet

Minnesota usually ranks in the top 10 among the 50 states when it comes to good health. Unfortunately, Minnesota recently came out on top of another health survey: most overweight pets. Banfield Pet Hospital, a national veterinary clinic service, published its State of Pet Health 2017 Report, focusing on pet obesity. About 41 percent of dogs and 46 percent of cats are too fat in the North Star State.

Animal obesity, like in people, is unhealthy. Overweight dogs and cats have more health problems than their lean counterparts, including more than 20 associated diseases and conditions, like cardiac disease, high blood pressure, diabetes, difficulty breathing, arthritis and urinary incontinence. Obese cats often have difficulty grooming and may develop skin problems.

Obesity also increases expenses. With more illness comes more veterinary visits and medications; Banfield estimates that your overweight pet can cost you \$1,200 to \$2,000 more per year than if your pet was in peak shape.

Why Minnesotans, who seem to take our own health seriously, tend to have overweight pets is a complex question. Admittedly, weather may be a factor. Who wants to take Rover for a walk when it's 20 below zero? Plus, in the dead of winter, it is often dark out before and after the work day, making it even less appealing to go outside. But cold weather is only part of the problem.

People tend to overfeed their furry buddies as a show of affection. While a small piece of chicken off your dinner plate may not seem like a lot, it doesn't take much before the pounds creep on. Obesity is defined as 20 percent over ideal weight. That is only 4.4 pounds for a 22-pound dog. The solution is simple. Cut back on food and increase your pet's activity, even by 10 minutes a day.

You may also reap the benefits from playing with your pet by becoming more active yourself. If you have children, family dog walks or cat play time serve as learning experiences for your children on how to care for a pet. Another benefit is improved mental health for your pet. Active, healthy animals are less likely to misbehave because they are not bored and looking for trouble.

So, Minnesotans, let's get fit with our pets and get to the top of the healthiest pets in America list.
