Letter from the Mayor

Isanti has started to see significant improvements in residential and commercial development. In order to aid in this development, we have created a comprehensive pavement management plan and an asset management plan, which focuses on the long-term management of our water and wastewater treatment facilities. These plans will help ensure the long term health of our infrastructure over the next 10 years. We have wrapped up another election year, with Council Member Dan Collison being re-elected and gaining a new Councilmember, Paul Bergley in January. Mr. Bergley will be the 11th Councilmember I have worked with in my 9 years as Mayor. Upcoming December and January City Council Meetings will be very critical in determining the City's direction over the next few years.

Isanti had 37 new single family house permits issued in 2014, which is more than the previous 5 years combined. We have gained over two dozen new & expanding businesses in Isanti, bringing us to over 150 businesses, employing over 1,500 people. The list of new businesses will be offering a wide range of services, products, and employment opportunities. We have many more in the pipeline for our Community which will continue to expand and diversify our commercial/industrial tax base.

The 10 year pavement and asset management plans will ensure that our infrastructure is maintained as efficiently as possible. The cost to completely rebuild a road is \$253 per sq ft, mill & overlay is \$70 per sq ft, and simple seal coating is \$9 per sq ft. We have fine-tuned our pavement management plan to ensure roads that need the most work are priorities for the City. Roads such as Palomino will be the first to be improved. Performing annual maintenance will save the city significantly in the long term. Per the pavement management plan, the cost of improvements over the next 10 years will be approximately eight million dollars. We will be able to utilize two million dollars in State funding, leaving approximately six million for the City to pay. One major area of contention from the last street and utility improvement project was assessments. Depending on what exactly is being done in each project, the property owner can be assessed approximately 25-35% of the total cost. We will be reviewing the assessment policy to make sure it is the fairest way to proceed. I will layout the funding plan to the City Council at our Goal Setting Session in late January. Once the Council has reviewed the plan, we will hold public meetings for input on the both the pavement and asset management plans, assessment policy, and funding strategy. This is expected to take place by late spring. We will hold at least one daytime session and one evening session so all members of our community will have a chance to provide their input.

At our first Council meeting in December, Council approved a plan to reach out to each Township Board and try to come to an agreement on the two main concerns the City has in regards to the Fire District. These concerns are the funding formula and the need for unanimous votes to make any changes to the Joint Powers Agreement. We need to bring more fairness to the funding formula so the City of Isanti is paying only for the services it receives and not subsidizing our neighboring Townships. We have seen our costs go from \$83,000 in 2006 to over \$180,000 in the 2015 budget, which is, on average, over a 10% increase each year. We have had to cut other departments to meet this escalating cost which we can no longer sustain. As the Fire District charges us more, we will need to raise taxes in order to pay for the services provided. While other decisions of the Fire Board require a unanimous vote, the budget requires only a simple majority. Even though the City Of Isanti is currently paying for over a third of the cost, we only have 14% of the votes on the Board. As our share of cost escalates higher each year, our vote total stays the same. With anticipated increases in Fire District spending and the escalating increase in the City of Isanti's share of this cost, based on the current run based formula, Isanti's share could rise to over \$300,000 in the next few years; there has to be a unanimous vote of all 7 voting members to change the formula.

NEW Snow Removal Policy

Effective 1/27/2014, the City of Isanti will be removing snow from all public sidewalks and trails within the city limits. A full copy of the City Code can be found on the city's website at www. cityofisanti.us.

As a reminder – pushing snow onto property other than your own is prohibited. This includes onto city lots and into the right-of-way.



Winter Parking Restrictions

Parking of vehicles is not allowed on city streets between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. from November 1st through March 31st of every year. Parking is permitted on streets between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. provided that snow removal has been completed or there is no snow. Parking is not permitted in the City's downtown municipal parking lot (located south of Main Street W and west of the BNSF railroad tracks) between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Your cooperation will help make the snow removal process more efficient and effective.

Home Safety Tip

Since 2009, any home in Minnesota, regardless of when it was constructed, has been required to have a Carbon Monoxide (C.O.) detector within 10 feet of every "room used for sleeping." The exception would be if a home doesn't have any C.O. producing appliances. The most common C.O. producing appliances in a home are wood or gas stoves used for heating or cooking, gas water heaters, gas dryers, gas fireplaces, and gas space heaters in homes or garages. That "room used for sleeping" does not have to be a bedroom. The code language is intentional, and meant to include any room that may be used only occasionally for sleeping such as a TV room with a futon or a pull-out bed. C.O. is a gas that is released from incomplete combustion when oxygen is burned. In a perfect world that C.O. gas is properly exhausted to the exterior of the home or exterior of the garage where it becomes diluted in the outside air. There are things that can reduce or eliminate that proper exhaust from taking place such as negative pressure, (more commonly a "back draft"), the vent or chimney becoming compressed or disconnected, (this sometimes occurs when a roof is re-shingled), or even snow covering or clogging the vent. Because C.O. is an odorless and invisible gas, it is important that C.O. detectors are installed and maintained.

Total number of permits (residential and commercial) issued thus far in 2014 can be reviewed in the following matrix below. This matrix shows a marked improvement in the construction industry in Isanti. 37 new home permits have been issued as of November 24, 2014. That is more new home permits than were issued for the full calendar years 2009 through 2013 combined. Two new commercial buildings are also being constructed, and 19 permits have been issued for commercial remodel or additions. That number includes 11 tenant changes.

Isanti Welcomes New Businesses and Facilities in 2014

WillowBridge Center, a full service salon, spa, boutique and wellness center, opened in October of 2014. Relocation of this business from Cambridge to Isanti has led to the commitment of additional investment in Isanti. On November 18, 2014, the City of Isanti approved a loan from its Revolving Loan Fund to Minnesota Organic Merchandise Store (MOMS) to open up a new restaurant/café at 4 Enterprise next to the new and beautiful WillowBridge Center. MOMS currently operates City Center Market and City Center Café in Cambridge but the café in Isanti will be a new concept. The new concept will offer coffee, expresso, tea, smoothies and a variety of other drinks, breakfast sandwiches, bagels, muffins, hot soup, a selection of made to order sandwiches and salads in addition to grab and go foods, baked goods, fresh produce, ice cream cones, shakes and sundaes. The Isanti café is working to have the sale of wine and beer available by the glass. All employers at 4 Enterprise are estimated to bring in excess of 40 jobs to the City of Isanti.

Construction has commenced on an 8,352 square foot retail building at 391 Cherrywood Street NE for Family Dollar Store. The company has communicated a late March 2015 grand opening date which is a bit later than originally anticipated due to the early onset of winter construction conditions and delays on the delivery of construction materials. Traditionally, each store employs between 8-10 Team Members and the company looks to hire the best from the neighborhood. This business will provide additional shopping and employment opportunities for Isanti residents.

Construction on the Isanti Indoor Arena – Home of Rum River BMX, continues to proceed on schedule. This 75,000 square foot indoor all season arena will serve as the home for Rum River BMX Association. National, Regional, State and local events will fill this venue for years to come with an anticipated opening in January-February of 2015. This project has received national recognition and it will be another way to bring in visitors and investment to Isanti while providing a great venue for our residents to enjoy.

In addition to the projects mentioned above there has been a lot of activity in 2014. New business arrivals include: Riversbend Salon and Spa, Isanti Pet Clinic, Isanti Lettering, Cambridge Upholstery, North Woods Finishing, Nada Hair Electrolysis, Natures Way Chiropractic, Classical Homeopathy, Natural Health Design, Soothing Touch Massage, Sherry Longley Photography, Sam Heldman Photography, TSI Plastics, and the Art and Science Academy (Charter School). In addition to these new business arrivals there have also been some expansions for existing companies such as Isanti Bicycle and Repair and Miller Tax Service and more. There are more business leads that the City is working on to help Isanti continue to grow and provide more services and employment opportunities to its residents. It is sometimes easy to focus a lot of attention on the next new thing and sometimes what we already have in our city gets overlooked. It's important to note that the City of Isanti is home to over 150 businesses that employ 1534 people. Many of these businesses have been here for decades or more. Thanks to old and new businesses for choosing Isanti and making it a great community.

City Launches New Website and Updates Banners on Main Street

The City of Isanti has a new presence on the Web. In November, 2014 the City of Isanti launched its new website. The new website is on a new platform which should help visitors have a better experience from their desktop or mobile devices. The site has been reorganized in order to make access to the information you need quick and intuitive. The City recently upgraded community banners on historic Main Street and continues to work to revitalize our wonderful community. I hope everyone had a great Fall and were able to enjoy family and friends since Winter arrived early this year...again!

It has already started snowing and I think it is here to stay. Again we are reminding all citizens of the City's Winter Parking Ordinance. There is NO street parking after 1:00 a.m. starting November 1st, 2014, you can see the entire ordinance on the City's website at www.cityofisanti.us. If you have any questions or concerns about the ordinance please call.

Just a friendly reminder, last year we had some complaints of snowmobile misuse. Snowmobiles are not allowed to drive on another's property without permission. Please keep your snowmobile on the trail or right of way. All property in Isanti is owned by someone. Snowmobiles may not be driven in the City Parks or on school property unless it is part of a marked state or local trail system. There is an ordinance that governs their operation within the City and that is also available from the website.

The Isanti Police Reserves and Officers will be hosting two Snowmobile Safety Classes (CD Version only) starting January 10 and on February 21st, 2015. To obtain the Snowmobile Safety Training CD contact the police department at (763) 444-4761, or for general information, please call the MnDNR at (888) 646-6367, (651) 296-6157, or (800) 366-8917, or email your name and address to info.dnr@state.mn.us. Duplicate snowmobile certificates can be obtained by calling (888) 646-6367 or (651) 296-6157. Minnesota requires snowmobile certification by law for anyone born after December 31, 1976. Adult snowmobile safety certification is for snowmobile operators age 16 and over. The adult course is designed to show the student the most common causes for snowmobile accidents in Minnesota, and how to avoid becoming an accident statistic. Upon successful completion of the Snowmobile Safety Independent Study CD, the student prints a "Temporary Adult Snowmobile Certificate." They mail in the \$10 course fee along with a copy of the Temporary Certificate' to Camp Ripley.

The City Council passed an ordinance to allow golf-carts and Class I ATV's (ATV's that you straddle) to be operated within the City under permit for a fee of \$25.00 per year. Class II ATV's (side by side) are already permitted by law but need further licensing from the State. The application and permit can be obtained from the Police Department and is good for one year. For further information, please call or stop by for more

The Isanti Police Department concluded its 2014 schedule of ATV Safety training on October 9th. We offered four class sessions throughout the year certifying over 100 area youth. All Minnesota ATV operators born after July 1, 1987 are required to have a MnDNR ATV Safety Certificate to legally operate on public lands or waters. If you have any questions regarding ATV's, you can stop at the office to pick up a DNR booklet with all the rules and regulations.

The Isanti Police Department received another grant to conduct Safe & Sober enforcement 2014-2015, focusing on DWI, seat belt usage and other high risk traffic violators. Please ask your bartender to call Safe Cab if you need a ride home if you feel you have had too much to drink this holiday season.

Thanks to all who attended the City wide National Night Out event at the Isanti Community Center. The Isanti Police Reserves put on another great program with a good attendance. Thanks to all the businesses through the Isanti Chamber of Commerce who donated door prizes to be handed out to the attendees. I hope you liked the venison brats and root-beer floats. We have committed ourselves to another National Night Out next year on August 4th, 2015 and hope that you can join us.

Lastly, since the cold weather is approaching many of us tend to warm up our vehicles by letting them idle. Often we see vehicles running while still parked in the garage. Many garages are attached to residences and the carbon monoxide that comes out of the exhaust could still enter the home even if the garage door is open fully. Carbon monoxide poisoning occurs after enough inhalation of carbon monoxide (CO). Carbon monoxide is a toxic gas, but, being colorless, odorless, tasteless, and initially non-irritating, it is very difficult for people to detect. Carbon monoxide is a product of incomplete combustion of organic matter due to insufficient oxygen supply to enable complete oxidation to carbon dioxide (CO2). It is often produced in domestic or industrial settings by older motor vehicles and other gasoline-powered tools, heaters, and cooking equipment. Symptoms of mild acute poisoning include lightheadedness, confusion, headaches, vertigo, and flu-like effects; larger exposures can lead to significant toxicity of the central nervous system and heart, and even death. Carbon monoxide can also have severe effects on the fetus of a pregnant woman.

City Engineering News

2014 Construction Projects

The City of Isanti has three construction projects wrapping up this winter. The "Bluebird Park & Public Works Site Improvements", the "Isanti Indoor Arena" and the "Unity Lift Station Improvements" projects. The Isanti Indoor Arena will enable the BMX track to be used all year long and bring commerce to the City year round. This will be the only sanctioned indoor BMX track within 100 miles of Isanti. The building will be a City owned facility and the BMX league will lease it for the foreseeable future. This site is located on the north end of Bluebird Park along Isanti Parkway.

The projects include the following improvements:

- A paved parking lot has been constructed in Bluebird Park to provide additional parking to the BMX track and be available for public use to access the city trail system and all other facilities within Bluebird Park.
- A paved parking lot has also been constructed at the Public Works Building to improve the existing gravel parking area on the site
- A 75,000 square foot Building will enclose the existing BMX track and stands 30 feet tall.
- The building also includes public restrooms and a warming house located along the existing trail at the southwest corner of the building that will be available to all Bluebird Park users year round
- A new lift station has been constructed to replace the existing lift station located at the corner of Unity Boulevard NW and 1st Avenue NW.

Construction on the Isanti Indoor Arena is planned to continue into January, 2015 with the first indoor BMX races planned to begin in February 2015.


The Bluebird parking lot and Public Works parking lot have completed their planned work this season. In the spring of 2015 the contractor will return to finish the site grading and pave the final lift of bituminous pavement on both parking lots.

The above graph shows Isanti Fire District's call volume in the City of Isanti, January through October for 2012-2014. This year the firefighters responding to the City of Isanti maintained the same 4 minute response time average as last year in spite of the 17% increase in call volume over the last 3 years.

Looking back at this year, overall the firefighters have had a great year. Our roster of 27 firefighters are sharing duty shifts overnight and weekends to make sure someone is



prepared to respond to calls at a moments notice. The makeup of the fire department and the way it responds to calls for service continue to get adjusted to meet the demands of those calling 911.

Other changes we track at year end and adjust to are statewide trends. If heavier populated cities experience a rise in a type of emergency, we can generally expect an influence of that situation in our area as well. The fire service in MN is overall busier, as Isanti is, but at a rate of 3% busier (compared to our 17%). Kitchen/cooking areas are hugely the leading ignition point of residential fires. Isanti Fire experienced 2 fires this year due to cooking, 1 was saved by a quick attack by the occupant using a fire extinguisher. Do you have an extinguisher, and do you know how to use it? Another trend is portable heaters. Please be respectful of these portable devices, and ensure your little ones and pets are protected from them as well.

Our area has not had any fire related deaths this year, nor has any member of the fire department received any department related injuries. This is a trend we are very grateful for as there are departments in our region who unfortunately can't say the same. As we know, and as we tell kids all October long, fire doesn't care who or what is in its path. The best way to fight fire is to prevent it.

Thank you to all of you reaching out to us with support this year, from the picture art from the kids to the attendance at the Isanti Firefighters Annual Rodeo, we appreciate every bit of it.

City Code section 325-9 (E) authorizes the City to disconnect services due to electric and/or gas utility services being shut off between October 15 and April 15 and the City determines in good faith that the premises has been vacated by the former account holder and no transfer of the account has been made.



Fall Upkeep and Youth League Continue at Redbird Field







People think that when the summer ends, the baseball fields sit idle . . . not at the Redbird Field! This fall, there was fall-ball baseball being played by local youth teams on the weekends and there was a significant amount of upkeep and repairs that were going on! The fall-ball team was allowed to use the Redbird field if they gave the outfield fence a fresh coat of paint at the end of their season! One of the team's parents happened to have a spray paint gun that made this activity go very smoothly. But, the biggest upgrade that went on was with the field's bull pens and with the addition of new batting cages. The bull pens are where the pitchers warm up before and during games. They were doubled in size and provided with additional fencing that protects players and spectators in the vicinity. After over 20 years of not having batting cages (the Redbirds have had to roll out and carry out screens and cages onto the field by hand every time they wanted to take batting practice!) the Redbird Field now has two beautiful, state of the art batting cages! The "final touch" was a new fenced in play area for little kids who come to watch games with their parents.
