

It has been a full year of activities with many highlights and changes. We have 88 new homes built or in the pipeline on the date of writing this article. These homes are being built on existing infrastructure which helps defer the cost of our services. We have over a dozen new businesses in Isanti this year leading to a net positive change of employment of 81 new jobs. This brings our total jobs number to 1,881 up from the approximately 1,000 we had before I took office as Mayor. We are expanding and diversifying our tax base. River Bluff Preserve's Rum River shoreline will be the site of Cedar Tree Revetments. This riverbank stabilization method will help protect our eroding shoreline. We have partnered with Isanti Soil and Water Conservation District to make this project a reality. Our Community Garden continues to be a great success in our 2nd year. Not only have individual families grown great produce but we collectively donated hundreds of pounds of food to our local Senior Dining Program. Our Farmers Market has continued to expand and grow providing local producers a place to sell and our Community a great place to buy produce and local crafts. The Arts & Science Middle School has been built, bringing yet another educational opportunity to Isanti. Isanti is home to Traditional Calendar Public Schools, Year-Round Program Public Schools, Arts & Science Charter Schools and St. Scholastica HSC Academy, all giving great options for our Community.

Our new park, Academy Park, was built by our partners TenSquare, LLC and the Arts & Science Academy. They paid for this great park and will be turning it over to the City to service areas North of Heritage and East of 65. We have an agreement establishing use of the park for the Arts & Science Academy during school days with all other days and all evenings open to the public. The asphalt trail constructed as part of this project will eventually connect to a trail system that will develop in this quadrant of the City providing miles of walking and biking access. It was a long negotiation with a tremendous result.

Isanti is a great Community that attracts residential growth along with Commercial/Industrial businesses. We are following our Long Term Financial Plan, Development Plan and Marketing Strategy to ensure we can provide more services and options to our Citizens while diversifying our tax base. In 2017 our total City valuation is \$310,685,500 which is the sum of all property values in Isanti. We are increasing to \$350,753,300 in 2018 which is a 13% increase in total value. This allows us to collect more tax revenue, \$171,170 more in 2018 than 2017, but leads to a 5% overall tax rate cut. This means each individual property tax rate will be cut yet our total City revenues will increase because there are more residential, industrial and commercial properties contributing. Our goal is to continue growing and diversifying our tax base, so we can provide needed services and continue to cut tax rates while still paying for the increasing cost of doing business as a city. A prime example of increasing cost is the 26% health insurance rate hike we absorbed this year. A 26% increase in insurance equals \$78,549, which is a significant amount, but becomes manageable due to our tight fiscal control and increasing tax base. Our 2018 Budget has a \$170,356 surplus to bring our General Fund Balance over 50%. We had spent down reserves during the Great Recession in order to continue full City Services and soften the financial impact to Taxpayers. We have in our 2018 Budget a plan to reduce Tax Rates 5%, Increase Fund Balance by \$170,356, increase services, cut debt by 4% and ensure our Long Term Financial and Community success.

### ADDITIONAL SIGN REMINDERS



- •The City would like to remind local businesses that handwritten signs, whether temporary or permanent, are prohibited. All signs must be professionally made.
- Signs shall not be placed upon any public utility pole.
- Signs are not permitted within the public right-of-way.
- •Temporary off-premises signs are permitted within the "B-1", "B-2", "B-3", "CBT", "RC", and "I" zoning districts, providing written permission is granted by the property owner and a temporary sign permit has been approved by the City. Temporary signs are allowed four times per year.

### **Utility Billing**

The Isanti City Council; at its September 19th, 2017 meeting, formally approved changing the due date for all Municipal Utility Bills from the 13th (or next business day) to the 20th (or next business day) of each month, effective with bills due in the month of November. Furthermore, effective November 30th, 2017, utility bills will be mailed on the last business day

of each month. Residents can expect to see their monthly bills arriving within the first few days of each month.

These residents that are expelled in Auto Bruthrough City Hall, and have their naverants.

Those residents that are enrolled in Auto-Pay through City Hall, and have their payments electronically deducted from their bank account, will not need to do anything. Those payments will continue to be deducted on the new due date each month. PSN Auto-Pay users may update their payment date online through their PSN account.

# **Utility Billing**

Finance staff periodically answer questions about monthly Municipal Utility Bills. The following provides a brief description of the abbreviations used and rates by utility service.

Residential Water Bill Components:

**WATER** - Water Usage & Charges (2017: \$2.99/1,000 gallons)

These charges are based on actual usage and change every month.

W BASE - Water Base (2017: \$12.68 per month)

These charges recur monthly and do not change. Base charges provide consistency in revenue on a monthly basis.

Water Usage & Water Base charges fund the operations of the water plant as well as the pipes that move the water from the plant to your residence. These charges pay for the ongoing expense of treating water. These charges also provide the funding needed to make debt payments on large infrastructure projects that bring water to your residence.

### **SEWER** - Sewer Charges - (2017: \$7.26/1,000 gallons)

Sewer rates are calculated as an average based on water usage during Jan/Feb/Mar of each year and are effective on the April statement. New customers are set to an average of 3,500 gallons until April averaging. If monthly water usage is less than the sewer average, sewer is billed per gallon. If monthly water usage is more than the sewer average, sewer is billed at the average.

**S BASE** - Sewer Base (2017: \$11.43 per month)

These charges recur monthly and do not change. Base charges provide consistency in revenue on a monthly basis.

Sewer Usage & Sewer Base charges fund the operations of the wastewater facility and associated infrastructure. These charges cover the expense of treating wastewater and the pipes that deliver that wastewater from your residence to the City treatment facility.

### MN FEE - State Test Fee (\$0.53 per month)

This money, collected by all water supply systems in the state and based on State Statute 144.3831, is submitted to the State Department of Health and used to monitor the quality of drinking water in public water supply systems across the state.

**STORM** - Storm Water (\$6.43 per month)

These fees cover the costs associated with managing storm water. Storm water is all water that the city must manage that did not originate at the City's water plant.

#### **WATER SHUTOFFS**

Due to the upcoming change in seasons, and on-coming cold weather, if your home is going to be vacant for any reason; please call City Hall to have the water shut off to prevent freezing pipes and other water damage.



City Code section 325-9
(E) authorizes the City to disconnect services due to electric and/or gas utility services being shut off between October 15 and April 15 and the City determines in good faith that the premises has been vacated by the former account holder and no transfer of the account has been made.

### SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

The City of Isanti will be removing snow from all public sidewalks & trails within the city limits. A full copy of the City Code can be found on the city's website at www.cityofisanti.us.

As a reminder – pushing snow onto property other than your own is prohibited. This includes onto city lots and into the right-of-way.

### **Economic Development**

**Development Summary for 2017** 

The commercial, industrial and residential sectors are hitting on all cylinders in Isanti. O'Reilly Auto Parts opened a new 7,453 square foot store just south of Coborn's Marketplace on Highway 65 on October 14. The Arts and Science Academy completed construction of its 19,500 square foot middle school and it is expected to open in November 2017. The Development Team continues to work with additional business leads and has a number of projects at various stages in the pipeline. Stay tuned and look for new business additions to the City of Isanti.





Here is a summary of new businesses that have committed to locating to or have already moved into the City of Isanti in 2017: O'Reilly Auto Parts, Art and Science Academy Middle School, Climb Theater, Brushes and Boards, Blackhawk Tile and Stone, Wasteland Performance, Circle B Ranch/The Nest, KAS Bodywork, Edward Jones, Willow Bridge Yoga, Rockstad and Company Relics and Wares, Serenity Circle Counseling, and Allina Health. The City Development Team continues to work with prospects that will fill community needs and City Council goals. Not to be outdone is the residential sector. As of November 1, 2017 there were 88 single family housing permits submitted surpassing the total of 63 for 2016. A lot is happening in Isanti, it's an exciting time to be an Isantian.

### City Promotional Bag Program (Free Advertising for Isanti Businesses)

Isanti businesses took advantage of the City Promotional Bag Program in 2017. The program included the purchase and distribution of 1000 quality city logo bags filled with information, products, and marketing materials from City of Isanti businesses. The bags were distributed at the following events: Land O Lakes Nationals (Isanti Indoor Arena – Home of Rum River BMX) in May, State North Qualifier Soccer Event at Isanti Soccer Complex in July, and the State BMX Finals held at Isanti Indoor Arena, Home of Rum River BMX in August.

Initial feedback from participating businesses has been favorable but City Staff will continue to request feedback to see what can be done to improve the program. 
# **Public Safety**

### **Police Department**

Hello Everyone!

Snow has made its appearance early this year and I want to remind all citizens and visitors of the City's Winter Parking Ordinance. There is NO street parking after 1:00 a.m. starting November 1st, 2017, you can see the entire ordinance on the City's website at www.cityofisanti.us. If you have any questions or concerns about the ordinance please call.

Just a friendly reminder, last year we had some complaints of snowmobile misuse. Snowmobiles are not allowed to drive on another's property without permission. Please keep your snowmobile on the trail or right of way. All property in Isanti is owned by someone. Snowmobiles may not be driven in the City Parks or on school property unless it is part of a marked state or local trail system. There is an ordinance that governs




The City allows golf-carts and Class I ATV's (ATV's that you straddle) to be operated within the City, on municipal streets, under permit for a fee of \$25.00 per year. These permits expire at the end of the calendar year, do not forget to renew your permit for your recreational vehicle. Class II ATV's (side by side) are already permitted by law but need further licensing from the State. The application and permit can be obtained from the Police Department and is good for one calendar year. For further information, please call or stop by for more details.

The Isanti Police Department received another grant to conduct Safe & Sober enforcement in 2017/2018 focusing on DWI, seat belt usage and other high risk traffic violators. Please ask your Isanti bartender/waitress to call Safe Cab if you need a ride home if you feel you have had too much to drink this holiday season.

### **Winter Parking Restrictions**



Parking of vehicles is not allowed on city streets between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. from November 1st through March 31st of every

year. Parking is permitted on streets between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. provided that snow removal has been completed or there is no snow. Parking is not permitted in the City's downtown municipal parking lot (located south of Main Street W and west of the BNSF railroad tracks) between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Your cooperation will help make the snow removal process more efficient and effective.

No Parking/Do Not Block

Please do not park on, in front of or over sidewalks and trails. It makes it difficult and dangerous for sidewalk users to cross at their intended crossing, and it also makes it difficult for the City to maintain sidewalk and trail intersections. The City has the right to ticket and/or tow vehicles at the owner's expense if they are hindering snow removal.

### SEASONAL TIPS FROM ISANTI'S SAFETY COMMITTEE:

**Stay Warm** 

Living in Minnesota, you may become laid back about the below freezing temperatures that become the norm during the winter months. So, it's always good to be reminded of basic cold-weather safety tips: Dress in layers, keep exposed skin covered. and walk with care on ice and snow. Children, seniors, and pets are generally more at risk during cold weather, so keep the kiddos in an extra layer, check on your elderly family and neighbors more often, and bring those pets inside or provide adequate, warm shelter and unfrozen drinking water for them.



Give Yourself Time when

**Traveling** 

Weather impacts travel safety, and according to the US Department of Transportation, 86% of all weather-related crashes happen on pavement that is icy and/or wet. To help prevent a road accident, make sure you give yourself plenty of travel time so you aren't rushing. Go slowly, leave plenty of room between you and the vehicle ahead of you, and anticipate turns and stops. It's always better to get to where you're going late than not at all!

### **Building Department**

The impressive momentum from last year's growth and building increased this year.

2017 Construction Permits issued as of 10/31/2017: 622, including 83 new homes so far!

While the volume this year has been challenging, as always my main focus is the safety of the Isanti Citizens. In that spirit, I urge all of you to please take a few moments to ensure your family's safety this winter while being cooped up indoors. Be sure you have a minimum of one functional Carbon Monoxide Alarm on each level of your home with sleeping rooms. They must be placed within 10' of the sleeping rooms. And be aware that smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms do not last forever! Battery operated smoke and CO detectors are required to be changed after 10 years. In addition, re-visit your emergency escape routes and plans with your family.

Please prepare and test all your safety and mechanical systems now, and book any necessary maintenance for your heating and ventilation equipment! In addition, remember to keep clean your furnace filters, HRV/ERV filters, humidifier filters, and perform maintenance on all other necessary winter equipment.

As always; feel free to call the building department at any time with questions regarding building permits, inspections, etc. The department is in place to help the citizens of Isanti build, alter, repair, and add on to structures and property in a safe and consistent manner where it concerns safety, health, public welfare, longevity, and community enhancement.

### **Confused about cooking oils?**

### A quick quide from Rachel Baar, RDN (Allina Health Isanti Clinic)

According to some claims, coconut oil can cure bad breath, leave your hair shiny, your skin soft, help you lose weight and even heal a wound. Some fans even suggest tossing out your olive oil and use coconut oil exclusively. But, is coconut oil really that good?

It depends. While coconut oil has many good things going for it, so do lesser-known oils like avocado, peanut and sesame.

**Coconut oil** is best known for its antimicrobial properties. It contains about the same amount of calories and fat as other cooking oils, but coconut oil is higher in saturated fat. Coconut oil contains medium chain saturated fats that are likely healthier than the longer chain saturated fats found in many animal fats. It is a solid that turns to liquid at about 75 degrees. It has a high smoke point and works well for baking or cooking at high heat. The oil has little coconut flavor for those who don't like the taste of flake coconut.

**Avocado oil** is full of antioxidants and healthy fats such as oleic acid, a monounsaturated omega-9 fatty acid. It also has high amounts of lutein, an antioxidant that promotes healthy eyesight. Avocado oil can be used as a dressing for salad or used for grilling, baking and sautéing. Studies show that avocado oil may help lower blood pressure and blood cholesterol levels.

**Peanut oil** is high in vitamin E and antioxidants, like resveratrol and phytosterols. It can also help boost your HDL cholesterol—or good cholesterol. According to OrganicFacts.net, studies have shown that consuming more resveratrol in your diet may decrease your risk of cancer, boost your immune system and prevent cognitive disorders like dementia. Plus, the high levels of vitamin E in peanut oil make it a good choice for healthy skin.

**Sesame oil** is best known for high vitamin E and antioxidants. While this oil may improve hair and skin health, stimulate bone growth, reduce blood sugar and blood pressure, maintain good heart health, manage anxiety and depression and lower inflammation, according to OrganicFacts.net, it also has higher levels of polyunsaturated fats than some other choices. So, use sesame oil in moderation for the flavor it can bring to your special recipe.

**Grapeseed oil** is one oil to avoid. It contains none of the healthful benefits of grapes and is high in polyunsaturated fats, containing up to 70 percent of the bad omega-6 fatty acids. Too many of these omega-6 fatty acids may lead to inflammation and weight gain.

Finally, oils can come in a number of varieties: refined, unrefined, roasted and cold-pressed. Each variety has small differences in taste, nutrients and health benefits. I recommend trying a few to find the ones that you prefer. Remember that oils are high in calories regardless of their health benefits and should be used in moderation as part of a well-balanced eating plan.


Season's Greetings!

# WINTER STORMWATER BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES

Snow and ice on roads, parking lots, driveways, and sidewalks can create hazardous conditions for people and property. Snow and ice removal is best done non-chemically with plows and shovels but, the results are not always adequate to ensure safety. Chemical ice melters (typically chloride salts) and/or sanding is often part of a broad strategy to make winter's passage a safe one.



Snow & Ice Removal:
Use mechanical means
before applying salt/
sand, whenever possible.

### Salt Application:

Follow manufacturer's instructions and use only enough to break the ice/pavement bond. Do not apply on vegetation or near waterways. Use less harmful deicers such as Calcium Magnesium Acetate or Sodium/Potassium Acetate.

### Sand Application:

Use only enough to provide traction on slippery areas. Sweep up excess sand after snowmelt.
