#### H. Council Committee Reports

Mayor Wimmer explained that he had called a Special Planning Commission Meeting for the second Tuesday in September to review the Legacy Pines Development to add one hundred and seventy plus platted residential lots.

Bergley added that he had went to the fire district meeting and that the budgets were coming out and there is responsibility that goes with it and we will see it soon. Mayor Wimmer also added that with all the sections that are being pulled out by Bradford Township, a couple other townships may be looking into doing so as well and that will add upward pressure to the Fire District Budget and impact on the City budget. However, Mayor Wimmer shared that we should be okay for the first cycle through next year. Also, it sounded like it was about half of Bradford Township that was being pulled out. Lundeen added that it was exactly fifty percent and that they are going to lose ISO ratings and medical on that property. Mayor Wimmer added that is what somewhere between the \$30,000 and \$40,000 difference in what they would be paying but we will have to wait and see what the numbers actually end up being. There was further discussion on fire runs and property valuation and their effect on the fire budget.

### **City Administrator Don Lorsung**

1. Ordinance No. 695 City Code Amendments: Water and Sewer Service Line Placement

Mayor Wimmer explained that it is to reduce costs for repairs by not placing water and sewer service lines under driveways. Bergley questioned what the ordinance change we regarding responsibility for water meters and horns. Mayor Wimmer further discussed the ordinance changes. Lundeen added that this is very common for most cities to put in place.

Mayor Wimmer shared that this is the property along the railroad and it has went through a phase one environmental review and potentially it might have a phase two review if it were to be sold. It is intended that it will become a parking lot so it will help the commercial development there. Economic Development Director Sean Sullivan shared that it is \$119.12 for the property taxes on the parcels.
