## Letter from the Mayor

Well it's mosquito season and the weather is fine! In my short time as mayor I've never had so many calls on a single topic as I did when the mosquitoes first started swarming our children this spring. Public Works has began spraying for the season and I can assure you they are using chemicals that are safe but highly effective against mosquitoes.



Council Update: We've been working hard at the City Council to serve your interests. We've started taking brush at the compost site. We've expanded property rights by allowing for more secondary structures. These structures can be much larger then they previously could be and we now allow secondary dwelling units like mother in law apartments or guest houses. We've protected our small town values by pulling out of the Green Step City Program due to their new commitment to social equity policies that have nothing to do with being green. We're also putting extra planning and work into reaching our goal of a significantly reduced tax rate.

Out & About: There's a ton of things to do around town this summer. We have the City of Isanti Street Dances coming up, Rum River Rods Car Show, Jubilee Days and the Isanti Firefighters Rodeo. #### Stormwater Ponds

Along the city streets, you can see the City of Isanti's stormwater system in the form of catch basins. These function as a way to discharge rainfall from the street, ensuring proper drainage and filtration which eventually goes to the Rum River. Stormwater Ponds, located all over the city, act in a similar way. These ponds exist as a way to naturally drain and filter water that falls on impervious surfaces, such as driveways, rooftops, and patios. Water that falls on city structures and on development sites can collect pollutants like fertilizer, oil, sediment, and litter from ordinary human activity. Thus, it's vitally important to the health of our watershed and our city's water to keep our stormwater ponds as clean and healthy as possible. Uncontrolled stormwater runoff can cause flooding, water quality issues, loss of wildlife habitat and causes increased erosion.



Here are some tips to keep these stormwater ponds clean and healthy:

- Keep litter, yard waste and pet waste out of drainage ditches and storm drains.
- Pesticides and fertilizers need to be used and disposed of properly. Fertilizers should never be broadcast over streets or sidewalks.
- Properly dispose of oil and antifreeze.
- Never hose chemicals off on impermeable surfaces.
- Reduce erosion from your property by planting plants and grasses over exposed areas.
- Allow natural plants to grow up around your pond to help filter runoff water.

Water Safety

Within the City there are rivers, ponds, ditches and private pools. According to the National Safety Council 74% of drowning incidents are children younger than 15. Parents need to be diligent in supervising their children as they enjoy outdoor activities.

- Never leave your child alone; if you have to leave, take your child with you.
- Find age-appropriate swim lessons for your child, but keep in mind that lessons do not make your child "drown-proof".
- Lifeguards are not babysitters; always keep your eyes on your child.
- Never consume alcohol when operating a boat, and always make sure everyone is wearing U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jackets.
- Don't underestimate the power of water; even rivers and lakes can have undertows.
- Always have a first aid kit and emergency contacts handy.
- Get training in CPR.
- If a child is missing, check the water first.

Every pool, every lake and every warm summer day holds the possibility of new, fun summer experiences. All you need to add is your undivided attention.

Please enjoy all of your outdoor activities. Remember to always be thinking about safety!!

## **Peddlers Permit**

With warmer weather and storm season ahead of us, reports of solicitors and peddlers going door-to-door often increases. In accordance with City code, all for-profit sales of products and services in Isanti require a license from the City. Only licensed peddlers and solicitors will have a license and photo ID badge issued by the City.

Solicitor/Peddler: A license is needed if you plan to go door-to-door selling products or services, or taking future orders within the City.

Transient Merchant: A license is needed if you are planning on selling products from a temporary location within the City, such as in the parking lot of a retail business.

Every resident has the right to prohibit peddlers and solicitors from their property. If you post a sign on your home or business that prohibits solicitors, they are not permitted to approach your property. If a peddler approaches you, you also have the right to request their City-issued ID badge. If they cannot supply their badge or state they are licensed by the State of Minnesota, you have the right to call 763-689-2141 as a non-emergency to report an unlicensed solicitor in the neighborhood.

## Isanti Fire District Update

Campfire season is here!

Many of us have heard a story about a campfire going out of control. The big fires in the forests up north, out west, in Canada- and not uncommonly in Isanti.

A statistic posted by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources states that 98% of wildland fires in 2019 were because of people. To dive a little deeper, our reports show that four out of ten wildfires are caused by debris fires burning out of control. Statistics like this guide our policy making to help protect us from 1) people and 2) burning debris. Minnesota State Statue 88.17 is adopted by City of Isanti code 119-2 which lists several conditions to allow open burning in the City limits. Out of control fires cause hardship to many people, guilty or not, which is always our goal to minimize.

A few frequently asked questions:

Can I have a campfire (in the City of Isanti)? Yes, without permit, a recreational/campfire is allowed in the City. Keep in mind the definition of a campfire is three feet square (or round) with flames no higher than three feet tall. A proper campfire is used for cooking, heating or ceremonial purposes and per the definition shall not create an air quality nuisance, health or safety hazard. A few other tips, natural vegetative material which is not painted or treated is permitted to be burned, garbage is strictly prohibited, and no recreational fires shall be allowed within 25 feet of a structure.

Can I burn a pile of brush? In certain circumstances, yes. The procedure to burn a pile of brush begins by contacting the fire station and acquiring a permit. Permits in the City of Isanti are only issued by the Isanti Fire District or Fire Agency, per city code 119-4.

My neighbor's campfire is sending smoke into my windows, and it is a nuisance to me- is this allowed? No. Recreation fires which create an air quality nuisance, health or safety hazard are not permitted. If this occurs and it is not an immediate emergency, we encourage the use of our non-emergency dispatch center to report the situation (763) 689-2141. Are there any precautions I should take before I have a campfire? Yes, great question. A means to extinguish a fire if it did get out of control is a great tool to have staged before you light the campfire, these can include a garden hose, a bucket of water, rake, shovel and/or a fire extinguisher. The removal of combustible materials from five feet around the base of the fire is also necessary.

Is a recreational fire allowed to be unattended? Absolutely not. A responsible adult must be present at a recreational fire at all times. When we are done with our campfire, it must be extinguished and cold to the touch at all depths.

Mosquitoes

(fpa)

Its that time of year and the mosquitoes have been in full force this spring. Just a small amount of standing water can breed thousands of mosquitoes in just a few days. Even something as small as a bottle cap filled with water can hatch thousands of mosquitoes in a single season. Any water that has pooled in buckets, gutters or ditches are breeding grounds for mosquitoes. Pet bowls and bird baths should be refreshed every few days. Public Works has been fogging as needed beginning at dusk. It generally takes about three hours to complete and they will treat the whole town each time they go out. Weather conditions need to be ideal in order to be able to apply. Wind conditions need to be less than 10 mph and when applying the fog solution, the operator needs to drive less than 10 mph as-well. The fogging solution will only kill the adult mosquitoes, it does not stop the mosquitoes from further hatching.



Some interesting facts about mosquitoes and some things to consider:

- Only the female mosquito bites.
- They are terrible flyers. A simple fan can help keep they away. They fly at roughly 1-1.5 mph.
- Put down cedar mulch. Cedar oil is a common mosquito repellant.
- Mosquitoes are attracted to us by our Carbon Dioxide.
- They live less than 2 months but have been around dating back to the Triassic Period.
- There are over 3,000 different species of mosquitoes around the world.
- Mosquitoes are among the world's deadliest creatures because of the diseases they are known to spread.
- Consider a bird feeder as many birds are natural predators to mosquitoes including purple martins, swallows, and migrating songbirds to name a few.

#### Lawn Irrigation Notice Per City Code 325-17

Property Addresses that end with an odd number may be sprinkled, watered or irrigated only on oddnumbered days, and property addresses that end with an even number may be sprinkled, watered or irrigated only on even-numbered days. No lawn sprinkling, watering nor irrigation is allowed from 12:00 noon to 6:00 pm each day.

The water tower currently is currently undergoing an improvement project. Due to this project the water tower is being bypassed and the City's water system is running on pressure based well pump speeds. Normally the city's water pressure is around 60 psi. During the bypass the pressure can fluctuate greatly depending on demand.

At this time it is critical to conserve water usage to prevent water pressure loss. Thank you for your cooperation!
