What an exciting time we've been having in the City of Isanti!

Our work throughout the last year on the 2024 budget paid off in a big way. We were able to cut the levy \$150,000 and lower the tax rate 15.31%. We were very careful during this process and kept an eye toward future budgets as well. I want to thank all of our great staff and City Council members for their hard work to make that happen, especially City Administrator Wood and Finance Director Betker.

Even though our overall levy was decreased we actually spent \$147,000 more on our Police Department budget for this year. We've completed the remodel on our new police department building ahead of schedule. We are also purchasing two new police vehicles. We're excited to introduce a new Police Explorer Program for young people who are interested in a law enforcement career and a new Citizen's Academy for residents of all ages. PD has been fully staffed for the last year and Chief Muyres has built an awesome team.

We have all kinds of new construction going on around town. Single family homes are popping up like crazy, the industrial park is full and there are two new apartment complexes going in. There were a lot of questions about the apartment buildings. We did not offer the builders any kind of subsidies, and the apartments are not low income or Section 8 housing. The two buildings going up across from Mobil will be 56 units total. There will be four buildings going up behind Falcon Bank for a total of 157 units and their complex will include a park and swimming pool.

Community Development

Storm drains found on neighborhood streets discharge directly into lakes, rivers, streams and wetlands which make stormwater runoff the leading source of water pollution. The most common sources of pollutants in urban stormwater include road salt, oil, gas, spilled materials, pesticides and fertilizers applied to lawns, pet waste, leaves and lawn clippings. These pollutants damage local natural resources and can impact aquatic habitats in the Rum River, streams, lakes and wetlands. If you see any of these pollutants entering into stormwater catch basins, please notify Isanti City Hall (763-444-5512).

Public Works

Summer Pavement Management Plan: seal coating Centennial Dr NW, Oakwood St NW,4th Ave NW, 5th Avenue NW, and a portion of South Brookview Ln SW.

Mill and overlay will take place on Rosewood St NW, North Brookview CT NW and North Brookview Ln SW. These streets will also have spot curb repair. Sealcoating is the process of adding hot oil to the road with aggregate rock over that. The rock and oil are then packed into all the cracks stopping the water from damaging the integrity of the road. The loose gravel will be swept up a few days later, followed with a seal. Once this project starts, it moves at a fast pace.

Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) has been identified within the city limits of Isanti. The Emerald Ash Borer is not picky and will infect all ash trees. It will generally take 5-6 years to kill a tree once infected. There are treatment options that can be done to prolong the life of the tree.
